City Council News:

# Public Hearing

Public Hearing for ordinance for sewer use, sewer user charge, water user charge and utility connection was held on April 20th, 1987. Questions were asked and changes made. Quarterly rates and minimum charges were discussed. Rates can be adjusted as necessary. Hearing was closed by motion. Motion was made and carried with all ayes to approve amended ordinance establishing charges for waste water services. Ordinance for sewer use was amended and accepted by motion with all ayes. Authorization to publish ordinances was done by motion. Resolution setting sewer use charges at twenty dollar minimum charge and \$ 1.47 for each one thousand gallons over five thousand gallons used per quarter based on twenty dollar usage was accepted by motion. Ordinance establishing water charge was approved by motion. Ordinance for sewer and water connection was tabled until the next meeting.

Sewer and water service on Walnut Street was discussed. Ebeling presented a letter outlining options available for financing services and questions were asked about what size system would be installed. Citizen was willing to finance the project, however, Councilman Briggs was not in favor of the idea. Further consideration was necessary. Motion was made and carried with all ayes allowing Lenzne to arrange with Hydro Engineering to stub service lines for vacant lots on Walnut Street.



Ebeling asked the council on April 20th about the contract for the boat ramp being expanded. Suggestions were made to have Mueller do the work which would increase the cost. Motion was made and defeated with two ayes and three nays for acceptance of expansion. Motion was made and carried with adjustments of grade with four ayes and one nay.

Lot Size Requirements



Council discussed lot size requirements for unsewered lots April 20th. Lot sizes in the past was talked about. Met council's suggestion was to have five to seven acre lots. Mayor commented that development should be more consistent, with roads and utilities put in first. Isolated areas would need further consideration. Councilman Hanson commented that forcing to build on two and half acre lots was not affordable and the ordinance restriction would not attract new residents.

Lano Lane



The council discussed on April 20th the possibility of taking over maintenance of Lano Lane and continuing the road to meet with Skyview Lane. City Administrator was directed to ask Lano to attend the meeting to discuss the issue further.

On May fourth, several members of the Lano family were present at the meeting to discuss Lano Lane and possible subdividing. Residents were asked to resolve among themselves problems concerning private maintenance. Procedures for subdividing were explained. It was suggested that the Zoning Ordinance public hearing be attended before, proceeding with plans to subdivide.

Zoning Ordinance

Motion was made to begin proceedings on change ing of the Zoning Ordinance at the April 20th meeting. Gouncil's consensus was that the Public Hearing for changing of the ordinance should be held after being heard by the Planning Commission.

Scott-Carver Amateur Radio Club



Citizen requested permission for Scott-Carver Amateur Radio Club to place an antenna on the new water tower and store a repeater in the base of the tower. The Deputy commented that the organization was highly regarded and the Sheriff's Department supported their efforts. Motion was made to allow placement of an antenna on the tower.

Gillfilan Avenue

City Administrator told the council on May fourth that Gillfilan Avenue was recorded as a city street. Vacation of the street may not be a viable option. Further review is necessary.

#### Streets

Ebeling and the council reviewed a proposed agreement between Carver County and the city for payment removal and construction of a portion of County road # 147. Issue was tabled, in order to review the proposal.

### Miscellaneous



Motion was made and carried with all ayes to allow Tom Ess to arrange to stub out for water and sewer to his vacant lot.

**Deputy** was told that there was a problem with children playing in the streets. Deputies are to speak with the parents.

Motion was made and carried with all ayes to apply calcium chloride on Mt Hope Road per petitions of residents. Notion was made to the same on Fourth Street.

Citizen requested clean-up from construction and replacement of rock on driveway.

The council discussed Gilfillan Avenue. Further discussion will be held. The council is to review the road.

The council discussed the insurance company's suggestion regarding coverage by the businesses utilizing the Village Hall. Suggestion was to carry the same amount of General Liability coverage as the city carries.

Citizen presented questions concerning the Fire Department and Fire Relief Association. The City Administrator was directed to obtain answers.

On May fourth, the council discussed questions that had been presented with Fire Relief Association representative and the Fire Chief.

Council discussed the possibility of the Carver County Fair Board's interest in changing the location of the fair. Council discussed whether or not the city was interested in attracting the fair. Motion was made and carried with all ayes to attempt to attract the fair to the City of Carver.

**Citizen** complained about excessive traffic across the dike and the messes being left behind. Frey was directed to run cable across the access.

**On** May 4th, the council approved liquor licenses by motions. Council consensus was not to increase fees.

School representative requested approval of the Proclomation recogning the week of May 18th through May 22nd as the beginning of the Lean On Me campaign. Motion was made and carried with all ayes approving same.

**Citizen** requested approval of sale of land and the driveway relocation. Motion was made and carried with all ayes approving the request, contingent on county approval.

**Permission** was requested to purchase necessary material to install a gate, in order to install pump for flood contorl. Motion was made authorizing purchase.

**Request** was made to sweep SkyView Lane, in order to fill in the cracks. Motion was made and carried to contract the work out.

Knudson [HRA Executive Director] inquired about planting of trees at the water tower site. City's percentage of cost was to be found out.

Fire Department requested approval of amendment to Carver Fire Relief by-laws, increasing retirement. Motion was made, but considered out of order since there was a question of amendment having already been passed. Further research was necessary.

Business owner had requested building permit in flood plain area, but the building inspector advised disapproval of such permit.

**Council** was brought up-to-date on reviewal of purchase of city truck. Issue to be discussed at the next meeting.



Information Notice

#### Residential Sewer/Water Connection Loans

The Carver County HRA has money available for homeowners to finance the costs of residential sewer and water connections. To qualify, you must own the home and occupy it as your principal place of residence. The connection loan is a deferred payment loan, meaning there are no monthly repayments of principal or interest. If you own and occupy the house for ten years the loan is forgiven. If you do not own and occupy the house for the ten year period only the principal amount of the loan has to be repaid. No interest is charged.

To participate in the program you must complete an application form. You must also get bids from at least two licensed plumbers for the connection work. To get more information about the program or to get an application, call the HRA at 448-7715 or stop by the HRA office at 308 N. Broadway.
