Park and Ride Facility

The city council reviewed the City Planners Power Point presentation pertaining to the Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality grant. The council was told that the 2009 grant was awarded with funding to be spent in the fiscal year of 2013. There were three components to the grant. The components involved land acquisitions, stall lot and transit shelter and three years demonstration commuter transit service. Each portion of this grant was required to be started by March 2014. The Transit Committee meeting was held to inform the council of the information already discussed and the grant had not been discussed with the council since the Community Development Authority had been told that they had not received their grant.

Question was asked if there was any idea on the numbers of individuals from specifically the Carver area who would be riding the Midwest Transit. There are not any current numbers, however, the Metropolitan Council has estimated a abstracted count of two hundred at a Carver Park and Ride site. Statement was made that the facility would open the area for future development. It was anticipated that area riders who travel to the Chaska and Chanhassen sites would possibly transfer to the Carver site instead.

The Transit Station planning for the future the council was told. The council was told that it was a plus to have a transit in your community. Comment was also made regarding land costs were low at this time. It was also stated that this was a growth opportunity. Comment was made that the Chaska Park and Ride site lot was always full and there is talk of expansion. Theoretically the thought process concludes that if the transit station is built, it will bring people into a community. The city attorney pointed out that most of the riders would be traveling from the west and the south of Carver and upon returning to their vehicles they would shop in the area.

The council discussed the Transit Taxing District (Regional Transit Funds) and the joining. The city discouraged joining the taxing district at the present time. The city can join anytime in the future, but once joined, you cannot relinquish membership. The preferred site was also reviewed. The city planner reviewed items required to be accomplished in order for the Park and Ride Transit Station could be operational by March 2014. The city administrator wants to move forward on the project and confirmed the consensus that the Community Development Agency site was the preferred location.

Carver Black Sox Spring Turkey and Ham Bingo

The Carver Black Sox is hosting their Spring Turkey and Ham Bingo coming up on Friday, March 30th from 7 PM to 11 PM. Food and beverages available and lots of fun will be had by all. Cheesy Vegetable Soup will be available for those during the Lenten season. Come out for a night of fun. Bring the kids. It is fun for all ages!!! Bingo and Meat Raffles will be held, so you could also go home with a turkey or a ham for your Easter dinner!!! Can't go wrong.

Bond Refunding

The council discussed with the financial consultant's representtative the authorization of General Obligation Refunding Bonds sale. It was explained that the proposed bonds will advance refund the 2015 through 2025 maturities of the City's General Obligation Water Revenue Bonds, the 'Prior Bonds'. In an advanced refunding, the bonds are sold in advance of the February 1st, 2014 call date of the prior Bonds being advance refunded. The proceeds of the bonds are invested in government securities and held in escrow. The money in the escrow is utilized to pay interest on the bonds until the call date and to prepay the Prior bonds at the first opportunity on February 1st, 2014. The city continues to make payments on the Prior bonds until the call date. After the call date, the city begins making payments on the bonds. Savings would not be experienced until after that date. Motion was made and carried with all ayes adopting the resolution providing for the sale of the General **Obligation Improvement Bonds.**

Metropolitan Council Environmental Services

The council was updated on the staff's work with the Metropolitan Council Environmental Services to complete transition to the system. A mutual determination regarding various properties currently under construction was met. Sewer service lines installed to structures will be grandfathered. The resolution of the status of properties under construction now leads to the reviewal of ordinances and appropriate changes addressing the system as associated with the MCES system will be drafted for consideration and adoption.

Municipal Off-Sale Liquor

The administrator explained that he had received two quotes for proposed market study proposals. One local bar owner expressed disapproval of the city's proposal. Removing the ability to sell "off sale" would affect the income of the business. One councilmember expressed their thoughts regarding unwillingness to get involved with 'off sale' for the city nor prepared to pay for a market study. Another council member also agreed. Question was asked if the study could be adjusted to answer certain questions.

The administrator discussed the two plans for the Market Study A public hearing suggestion was submitted and the opinion that not at least looking at the item would be a disservice to the community. It was the mayor's opinion that a study would offer explanation of the involvement by the city. Question was made about other businesses coming to the community if there not the ability to secure an 'off sale' license. Audience comment was made that it was not their opinion that this was a good idea nor a venture the city should involve themselves with. Public input again was submitted for input. Motion was made and failed for a market study. Comment was made that more information might be wanted but not at the price tag associated with the knowledge. Another comment was that the private sector could be left to run this type of venture. The consensus of the council was that this particular issue was finished.

Main Street Bridge

The council again reviewed the information related to the Main Street Bridge with the city engineer. This bridge had been identified as structurally deficient for several years and eligible for replacement through State Bridge Bond funding. The county has been included in discussions relating to the MCES Interceptor Project. The bridge is historic. Permits required from the Army Corp of Engineers (COE). The corp is the federal agency responsible for considerations of adverse effects to historic properties. The county and the city have worked with the city's Historical Preservation Commission and the State Historic Preservation Organization (SHPO) relating to the removal and the replacement of this bridge.

Discussions had also occurred regarding the lighting on or near the bridge. The council had decided to wait until after construc-

The council was updated that the permit approvals have been received to proceed with the project form the Corps of Army Engineers, as well as the state approval of the plans. Utility relocations will be coordinated after removal of the bridge. The Main Street Bridge is a county bridge, but the city will have associated costs relating to the replacement and other utility and infrastructure projects. State Bridge Bond funding will be received. A joint powers agreement between the city and the county was processed. The city is the acting contracting agency. Question was asked about unexpected or hidden costs. Response was given that there are always risk of change orders for unexpected occurrences in removal and construction. The plan is to have the bridge open in August. Motion was made and carried with all ayes approving the plans and specifications for the Main Street Bridge and scheduled bid opening date.

Gustavus *G*dolphus Choir

The Gustavus Adolphus Choir is scheduled to sing at the East Union Lutheran Church on March 30th, Friday night. The choir will perform in the sanctuary as part of their roots tour and part of the college's 150th anniversary as the East Union Church is the original site of the college. Come and support the Gustavus Choir.

Dahlgren Township / San Francisco Township

The administrator discussed the city's Fire Department's contracts with the townships of Dahlgren and San Francisco. New contract discussions have been discussed between all the government units. A drafted final agreement was presented for preliminary review by the council.

There are six primary revision within the proposed agreements. These revisions include changing from a three year to a five year provision with an automatic year to year renewal until one party provides written notification of termination; incorporates 'population' into the cost distribution formula; clarifies that equipment and the fire hall are exclusively owned by the City of Carver; the debt service obligation on the structure identified as the Fire Hall/Public Works building shifts to an equal split; the administration fee increases in the charge to the townships; and requires a sixty day notice to the townships of intentions to make capital expenditures in the department. This allows the townships the ability to terminate the contract upon notice, thereby giving the city the opportunity to determine the legitimacy of the purchase.

Council Representative commented on the work completed by the administrator and all entities on this contract were extensive with a positive outcome in their opinion. Question was asked if all the variables in the five year contract were updated annually. The response was that they did. The attorney approved of the agreement. Question was asked about the townships choosing any Fire Department. The attorney stated that the choice is theirs, but change would be difficult.

'Paperless' Council

The council was reminded by the administrator regarding previous discussions to motivate towards paperless meeting format as a cost saving measure for the city. The council was told that by utilizing 'professional PDF' and an iPad the goal can be attained. An iPad would be a 'reader' device for the council and a take-home device. The council could remotely review city business. The pad would be city property as well as the contents on the device. The church building is wireless. A new IT company would be able to assist with the transition. The council was asked for authorization to order the equipment. The devices were accounted for in the 2012 budget. Comment was also made that the city's e-mail should also be included on the iPad. Motion was made and carried with all ayes authorizing the staff to make the necessary purchases to go wireless.




