Ordinances

The council reviewed the ordinance and resolution involving the city's exemption from municipal fees. The administrator explained that the city has moved towards the exemption practice by elimination fees for general fund uses including parks, building etc. Charging municipal fees for city association projects in most cases requires collection of additional fees or property taxes from residents. Examples of projects that would be exempt would be storm water charges, water connections, municipal utilities connections, building permits and water usage. Motion was made and carried with all ayes approving the ordinance involving exemption for the city from municipal fees.

Fourth Street West

The financial consultant representative discussed the project financing for the Fourth Street West Improvement Project. There were different funding option for the council to consider. The total issue sources and uses were the same for both options presented. The goal was for an Improvement Bond requiring twenty percent of the bond be specially assessed.

The Sixth Street projects involving the power lines and the trails were not able to be assessed therefore these items are excluded form the bond. The balance could be paid with a combination of property taxes and other sources including utility funds. The council discussed in length the financing planning process.

Then the council discussed the project update. The city engineer gave a historical account of the bridge project to date. The design has been proceeding including input from property owners involving easements necessary. The main concern stated was that regarding drainage constraints and low areas. The goal would be to improve the area from a levy standpoint. Discussions with MNDot for remedies on these situations has also been discussed.

South side of the area and landscaping on the north side of the bridge was asked about. This would be similar to the Main Street bridge with the exception of the rock pattern extension up to the railing on the bridge. Proposal on the north was to deter walking down close to the fence. Some of the original salvaged stone will be utilized. A railing is not required but a fence at the end is required due to the eight foot drop. The culvert was inquired about as for how much to be added. The culvert extension will be approximately twenty five to twenty eight feet and easements will be required.

The administrator clarified that the council requested a different design on the north side of the bridge. Discussion was held concerning railing on both sides and similarities to the Main Street Bridge involving costs. The engineer will draft cost estimates for further review prior to decisions. The proposal will include adding salvaged bridge from the old bridge.

Waste Water Treatment Plant Decommissioning

Study

The engineering firm provided an overview of the decommissioning study for the Waste Water Treatment Facility that has been removed from service as of September of 2012. This study was required by the MN Pollution Control Agency. The highlights of the study included the responsibilities of the Metropolitan Council Environmental Services and actions required by the city. The governmental units cost shares were reviewed. The costs could also be negotiable upon interpretation. The biosolids, partial demolition of tanks, removing any hazardous items, covers, lids, water containing structures, pipes, buildings, filling etc all have to be dealt with.

The next steps are to confirm the Metropolitan Council Environmental Services decommissioning actions, finalize the scope of the city's actions and prepare bid documents for the city's portion of the cost and request regular updates from the metropolitan council. The timing of the project still needs to be finalized. The decision for the property's future also has to be determined. The plans for the buildings are unclear at this point. The site is to be kept clean and maintained.

Pedestrian Crosswalk

The Parks and Recreation Supervisor presented an overview of the resolution supporting a pedestrian crossing on Jonathan Carver Parkway and State Highway # 212 overpass. The engineering firm created a plan for the pedestrian crossing and a signal system. The existing bridge infrastructure currently is not designed to safely accommodate pedestrians or bicycle traffic. MNDot has received a request from the city to install the crossing and the signal system. Motion was made and carried with all ayes approving the resolution approving the #212 Pedestrian Crossing.

DNR Trails Connection Grant

The Parks and Recreation Supervisor reviewed the trail connection identified at County Road # 11/Jonathan Carver Parkway beginning at 4th Street to the west entrance of the Carver Bluffs Parkway as the necessary trail connection. The Local Trail Connections Program requires a 75/25 match from the city with a maximum grant request cap. The city would be submitting a grant request with specified monetary costs responsible for. The resolution being reviewed involving the trail connection would accompany the grant application. The county commissioner attended the meeting as a show of support for the project. The county also has a stake in the project as part of this trail is a regional trail. Motion was made and carried with all ayes approving the resolution for the DNR trails connection grant.

Carver County Trail Master Plan

The Parks and Recreation Supervisor introduced the resolution regarding the extension of the MN River Bluffs Trail including the Master Plan Amendment. The Carver County Parks Director also attended the council meeting and gave an overview of the background for the Regional Parks System, as well as how they had become eligible for regional funding. Then he reviewed with the council the previous planning work done consistent with the county's Comprehensive Plan, the Metropolitan Council's updated plan and the MN River Bluffs Extension – Regional Trail Master Plan. The location of the trail being discussed was on the north side of the river. The study area and the overview include Carver, Hennepin, and Scott counties. The map shows a proposed trail that is all part of the Master Plan including a bridge crossing at the river at some point in the future.

The City of Carver requested to partner on a local trail project. In order to be eligible for regional funding, the Master Plan requires an amendment. This amendment includes eleven elements ranging from a demand forecast, operations and maintenance, and creating public awareness. The public review began with meeting with Dahlgren Township, then proceeded to the Carver County Park Commission, the City of Carver Park Board, the City of Carver and then onto the Carver County Board. Future meetings are scheduled with the Metropolitan Council. The amendment involves 1.8 miles in length and generally follows roadway corridors extending from the Carver levee, the USA Fish and Wildlife property and alternative alignment. Segment one continues from the levee following County Road # 40 and trail proposed alternates/options. Segment two follows county road # 40 and then proposed alternate trails. Motion was made and carried with all ayes adopting the resolution approving the Carver County Trail Master Plan.

Council Goals/Draft Hetion Plan

The city administrator reviewed the draft of the 2013/2014 City Council Goals – Action Plan. Community Identity, Vitality, Engagement, Organizational Culture and Public Facilities are all items on the draft. The responsible individuals for enforcement and goals were discussed, as well as target dates. The final plan will be presented at the upcoming council meeting for adoption.

Village Hall Projects

The timeline for the carpeting and painting project for the Village Hall was reviewed with the council. The city offices temporarily will be located in the lower level of the hall. During the small renovation project every effort will be made to continue normal service levels. The ceiling project had to be postponed due to the weather requiring their services outdoors. This project will now be required to be coordinated at a later time.

Fourth Street Reconstruction Project

The city engineer reviewed previous background information relating to the Fourth Street Reconstruction Project. The council had previously reviewed the new wall layout on the south side of the bridge on Fourth Street along with landscaping options on the north side. MnDot is requiring street lighting because of the vertical curve of the road at the bridge. The engineer would draft a clearer visual representation of the bridge transition areas, elevations etc. The council was also presented with three options of possible lighting solutions required.

Depot Park Gate

The council was given background information on this project for Depot Park. The city reviewed installation of a gate in 2012, obtaining quotes, but the project was put on hold. The original quote package was awarded this year. The work would begin with the county regarding permits for construction and trail control.

The existing gate control was discussed. Initially this gate control was included in the Mt Hope Road Project with the storm sewer at Casey's being connected to a separate line providing more capacity. The main purpose was to protect County Road # 40. It was an interim solution to be utilized in the future for back up. Initially the option was discussed and the decision was made due to the budget. Motion was made and carried with all ayes approving the work on the Depot Park Gate Structure.

Public Services Department

The Public Works Director indicated that the truck for the department is experiencing many mechanical issues. Quotes were obtained for a new one ton plow truck. The old truck would remain in service until arrival of a new vehicle. Then selling the older vehicle was the plan. Motion was made and carried with all ayes approving the purchase of vehicle for the Public Works Department.

Carver Lions

Then you have only the first Wednesday of the month and they won't chase you away or even ask you to leave. And you have to wait until June now. September two meetings a month will begin again.
