# City Council News:

#### Case Tractor

The council discussed on October 7th, a Case tractor with bucket, loader and backhoe for sale. Councilman Low and Frey were to look into the issue further.

Councilman Low had looked at the tractor, feeling it was pretty good, the council was told on October 21st.

Flags




At the October 7th meeting, the council discussed the flags at the memorial site and whether or not lights should be installed to reflect these flags. The mayor announced that the new zoning ordinance will be stating that exterior lights should not exceed property lines when lit.

Frey is checking into floodlights, the council was told on October 21st.

Sod is in place on the memorial site. Frey requested funds for plants and shrubbery.

On October 21st, Frey told the council that shrubbery had been planted at the memorial site.



Dick Lenzen presented plans to the council on October 7th for a building permit in SunnySide Addition. The council reviewed the plans and a motion was made, carrying with all ayes to approve the permit.

# CDBG Update

Knudson, HRA Executive Director introduced Mr. Dan Wilson to the council on October 7th. Wilson is the Acquisition and Relocation Officer for that particular program. The council discussed the acquisition and relocation program at length. Meetings with homeowners are in the itinerary to have questions and answers with homeowners and to be considered as a general purpose meeting. Decision and policy would be the council's responsibility. The HRA would handle discussions and negotiations.

Knudson also informed the council on October 7th that the housing and commercial rehabilitation aspect of the program would be ready to begin. Taking of applications for single home rehabilitation could begin. Boundaries for commercial downtown were briefly discussed.


Final clearances had been received for the grant. The HRA is ready to begin acquisition process and water tower work.

On October 21st, Knudson presented a quarterly progress report and payment request. Motion was made and carried with all ayes to approve the payment request. Payment requirements are that the City Administrator be available to sign necessary documents to meet those payments. Notion was made and carried with all ayes to authorize submission of HFA quarterly reports.

Knudson also told the council that a meeting had taken place with property owners whose properties were scheduled to be acquired by the city. Question was posed about vacant lots and salvaging from the homes. The HRA will contact appraisers, review apprais ls and then submit information to the council for their decision. The Intent to Acquire notification was scheduled for posting.

L'a wcon

On October 7th, the council discussed advertising for bids for boat launch project. Councilman Meyers felt that in order for the project to be able to proceed, some volunteering would be necessary. Stewart would prepare specifications and submit them to Lawcon.





# Liquor Violations

A number of individuals were requested to appear before the council on October 7th to discuss violations with the council. Assurances were given that a similar situation would not be repeated. There was a lengthy discussion with these individuals. Stern warnings were voiced by the council about drinking intoxicating liquor on the streets. Deputy are to warn any individuals seen drinking on streets and repeaters are to be ticketed.



On October 7th, the council discussed the Sixth Street improvement with Mr. Larry Samsted. The council agreed with the plans and Samsted is to proceed with Sixth Street improvements.

Frey had also informed the council that repairs on the culvert had been completed on Sixth Street.

## Fire Department

Fire Chief Riesgraf and Mr. Tom Larson explained at the October 21st meeting the two percent insurance money that the Fire Department receives each year. Larson also explained Fire Relief money. A certain amount of funds from the Fire Protection is held by the city for the truck bond payment and the remaining amount is used for Fire Department equipment.

Larson had also reviewed the insurance policy, suggesting updating coverages to meet current replacement costs.

# Maier Stewart and Associates

Stewart presented a proposal schedule to the council on October 7th for completion of a well for a municipal water system.

Stewart also presented an agreement for professional engineering services for the water supply, storage and distribution system. City of Carver and associated personnel will review the agreement. Motion was made and carried with all ayes to authorize SCBG, Small Community Block Grant) eligible costs for water improvement proposal.

On October 21st, Stewart presented an environmental analysis worksheet on the sever system. Motion was made and carried with all ayes to approve environmental statement on septic ponds.

Location of sewer mains in SkyView Lane were discussed. Stewart requested that the council ask residents where they want sewer lines to run. The water main will have to be placed on the north side of the street.

The deep well and pump for the municipal water system will be in the Lion's Park. The location of the water storage tank was discussed. Several sites were suggested and Stewart is to research for the best site location. Screening was suggested around the storage tank. Decrease of water flow and increase of water storage for a more efficient system was discussed by Stewart at the October 21st meeting. Plans for the pumphouse at the Lion's Park were reviewed.


Stewart distributed a chart estimating subsurface geology and well construction, asking the council's dirdction to submit the form to the Health Department. The consensus of the council was for Stewart to proceed. Motion was made and carried with all ayes to authorize Stewart to go out for bids on the deep well with bids to be opened at two PM on November 18th.

The Lion's Club inquired on October 21st about constructing a restroom facility utilizing one wall of the pumphouse. Stewart announced that even with sewer construction, restrooms must be placed at least fifty feet from the well.

Planning Commission

On October 7th, the council discussed the Planning Commision vacancy. Possible candidates were discussed.

The mayor had spoken with two possible Planning Commission candidates who were considering the appointment, the council was told at the October 21st meeting.



Fourth Street was discussed on October 21st. A swale put on the Riesgraf property was talked about. Councilman Swanson felt that the street should be left until more information is known concerning the overall plans of the entire street. Decision to wait was made. Septic Tank Overflow

On October 21st, the council discussed septic tank overflow of an individual system on Broadway. It was felt that heavy rains were a contributing cause and the situation would be watched carefully.



At the October 21st meeting, the council discussed procedure and policy which would be followed during the tree cutting project scheduled for the 26th of October. Trees that the volunteers would not be cutting property owners were to be notified to have the trees removed, as well as the stumps. If they were not removed within specified time frame, professionals would contract service at owners expense. A December 1st, 1985 deadline was decided for removal of these trees. The mayor reminded the council of reforestation commitment.

#### Water Resource Board

On October 21st, City Administrator Mornson told the council that the Water Resource Board had acepted the City's resolution to request acceptance into the Lower Minnesota River Watershed. The mayor, Councilman Swanson and Doug Bade will be meeting with the Board on November 25th at a public meeting to determine if the city will be included in the watershed.





# Miscellaneous

On October 7th, City Administrator Mornson informed the council that request for a four way stop at Broadway and Main had been denied due to not enough traffic.

Administrator also stated that the Public Utilities Commission had approved a percentage of NSP's interim rate increase request.

The council was informed that Mt Hope League had deeded cemetery frontage to the City of Carver. They indicated their opposition to removal of trees which had been planted. If the trees had to be moved, it would then be costs borne by the city.

Public Hearing was opened on October 7th for '86' budget, levy and proposed use of Revenue Sharing Funds. Motion was made and carried with all aves to approve the '86' budget levy resolution.

On October 7th, bid was opened regarding scaled bid for property adjacent to the Brown property in the city. Question was asked regarding establishment of acceptance of a minimum amount. Question was also posed concerning amounts received for other lots sold within the city. Motion was made and carried with all ayes to open the bid and if unreasonable to reject. Motion was made and carried with all ayes to reject the bid received.

The mayor has spoken with bidder on property adjacent to Brown property, the council was told on October 21st. Mr. Avant was still interested in the lot. If property were to be sold, Councilman Meyers wanted a stipulation that the lot is to be leveled. Councilman Wendland expressed concern about the water flow and the easement involved attempting to control this water flow. The mayor stated that the city possessed regulation rights on any excavation taking place.

Frey told the council on October 21st that the city truck needs repairs. Before repairs were to be made, warranties were to be checked.

City Administrator Mornson told the council on October 21st that as long as Dick Lenzen would deed Outlots A and B to the city that there is not any problem with moving the road in SunnySide Addition.

On October 21st, City Administrator told the council that the market value would be increased for '86' unless the city opposed increase. Mornson is to talk to county officials.

On October 21st, bills were received from the Lion's Club for work completed on the water tower.


Mr. Swanson also told the council that the Lion's Club was interested in selling pull tabs and charitable gambling.






