



City Council News



City Administrator

Mayor Meyers told the council on September 14th that the administrator who had been hired at the August 17th meeting, had declined the position. Scot Botcher was then offered the position and he accepted. There was discussion of dissolution of the joint powers agreement at the beginning of 1988 at the request of the City of Young America, which would like to hire Botcher on a full-time basis. Mayor Meyers was going to talk to the Young America council to attempt to persuade them to continue the joint powers. Councilman Briggs was reluctant to hire someone for only a short period of time. He stated that the City of Carver should look for someone else and possibly hire on a part-time basis. Motion was made and carried with four ayes and one nay to hire Botcher for the remainder of 1987.

The City of Young America had a scheduled meeting for September fifteenth. The mayor requested that a Carver representative attend this meeting and voice Carver's wish to continue with the joint powers agreement.

Public Hearing

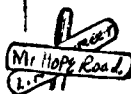
Meadow Bluff Addition's public hearing was opened on September 14th. Assessment questions were asked. Motion was made closing the public hearing. Motion was made and carried with all ayes accepting the resolution adopting assessment list for the addition.



M.P.C.A.

Citizen received a letter from the MPCA [Minnesota Pollution Control Agency] regarding a proposed change order pertaining to the installation and testing of septic tanks. Issue was discussed at the September 14th meeting. Councilman stated that contents referred to testing of tanks by contractors. Citizen, comments that testing was the contractors responsibility, not the city's. Councilman Briggs commented that wording of the contract was not clear and the issue had been re-opened with the city supporting the contractors, if work were grant eligible.

Mt. Hope Road



Frey told the council on September 14th that he had obtained permission to work on private property to slope ditches along the Mt Hope Road. Comment was made that the road was a 'death trap' and corrections were necessary. Frey stated that corrections would be completed before winter. He was trying to get culverts.

Carver Fire



Relief Association

Citizen questioned a portion of the 1986 audit at the September 14th meeting concerning the Fire Department Relief amount which had been increased from \$ 150 to \$ 400. He wanted to know how the funds could be appropriated when the increase was not recorded in the minutes. Mayor Meyers explained that this meeting had been reconstructed and the relief benefits had not been increased. A certain amount has been levied for retirement and the Fire Department had agreed to contribute the balance to maintain the \$ 400 retirement amount.



Water Improvements



Fire Chief Riesgraf asked the council on September 14th about flushing of water line. The Fire Department has experienced clogged nozzles on hoses due to stones. Stewart [Maier Stewart] stated that flushing would be completed after paving of the streets is final. The Fire Department, Hydro and Munitech should all work together in flushing of hydrants.

Shallow water lines were questioned. Maier Stewart stated that there were two locations and a letter would be forthcoming on the situation.

The turning off of the hydrants was discussed. It was decided that Hydro Engineering should be invited to the first meeting to demonstrate correct procedures.

Fire Chief suggested tagging vehicles parked too close to hydrants. Since residents are not used to hydrants, only warning citations should be issued at first. Stewart suggested letters be sent, requesting to keep hydrants clear during the winter.

Notification of requirements to hook up to municipal utilities was asked about. Consensus was that when the system was fully operational, a letter would be sent to property owners who have not hooked up within the time frame set by the ordinance.

Sewer Improvements



Citizen has one septic tank and it was his opinion that Hydr should fill it in, but there were not going to fill it in. Stewart would handle the issue. Frey commented that Wayne Dauwalter has been filling in tanks as hook ups are done and billing Hydro for the service.

Stewart presented a letter addressed to the MPCA for council authorization. This was regarding the request to utilize Pond Cell # 2. Motion was made and carried with all eyes approving resolution declaring Pond Cell # 2 was constructed according to specifications.

Pay request for Hydro was presented for approval. Councilman Briggs questioned seeding jobs, since complaints have been received. Stewart explained that seeding work has not been accepted, as yet, and the matter is being held open until the job is found to be done correctly.

Councilman Wendland inquired about change order which had been tabled in order to see a deduct change order. Stewart advised that it was unwise at this point to deduct because it would be taken off of the grant. Stewart also informed them that most of the budgeted money for the project was used up and also most of the contingency funds.

Council was told that tree planting and fence installation should take place shortly. Access to field was inquired about and would have to be looked into and a means of access provided.

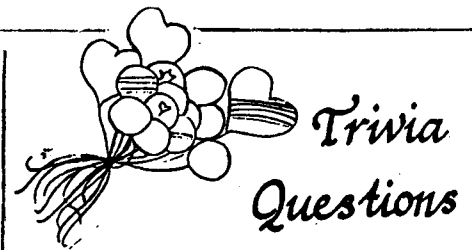
Miscellaneous

Proposal from William Mueller and Sons regarding drainage improvements was discussed on September 14th. Consensus was to have Frey and the City Administrator look into the matter and see if items could be eliminated and Federal Revenue Sharing Funds used elsewhere.

Budget meeting was scheduled for September. Councilman Wendland stated that the Five Year Capital Plan should be updated before then.

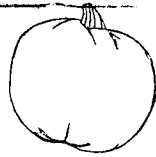

Miscellaneous



Council discussed a letter to be forwarded at the September 14th meeting pertaining to notification to the insurance company to inform them of the municipal water system and request change in fire rating.

Knudson told the council it was hoped that completion of screen planting at the water tower would be done by October.

Councilman Briggs questioned Knudson about checking on trees as requested. Response was given that these were the incorrect size and type. Also he was hesitant to plant during summer months.

Grant loan applications were discussed briefly.

Sidewalks in several areas of the city were discussed. City Administrator was directed to check ordinance and forward letters.

City Administrator was directed to check Lawcon grant and find out what was required to close the project.

Frey requested erection of additional street lights. He was directed to submit recommendations.

Park and Recreation Board had received two estimates for grading of the ball fields. Council concluded that a proper set of specifications and bid forms were to be prepared, requesting the City Administrator to research the issue.

City Administrator reviewed several items with the council. These included the League of Minnesota "Cities Week"; Coalition of Rural Outlying Neighboring Areas' and Metropolitan Council's 20th Anniversary Party.

Councilman Hanson inquired about a letter sent to the Fire Department regarding using fire station equipment to wash and repair private vehicles. Approval should have been given before a letter was sent. Mayor took action.

Motion was made and carried with all eyes authorizing City Administrator Botcher to sign city checks.

Chaska High School requested the use of the Village Hall, again. Permission was granted by motion.

Motion was made and carried with all eyes approving renewal of the Workers' Compensation insurance coverage with the League of Minnesota Cities per submitted quote.

Complaints have been received regarding sanitation trucks parked in residential neighborhoods and dogs running loose. City Administrator was directed to write letters quoting ordinances regarding the situation.

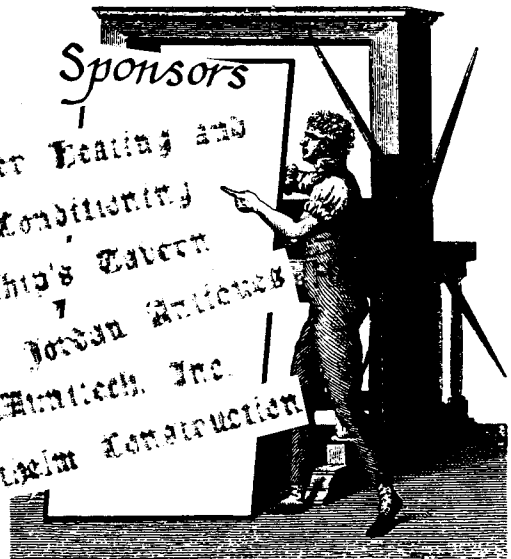

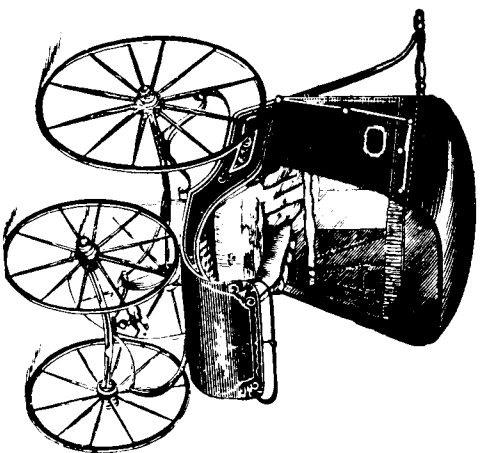

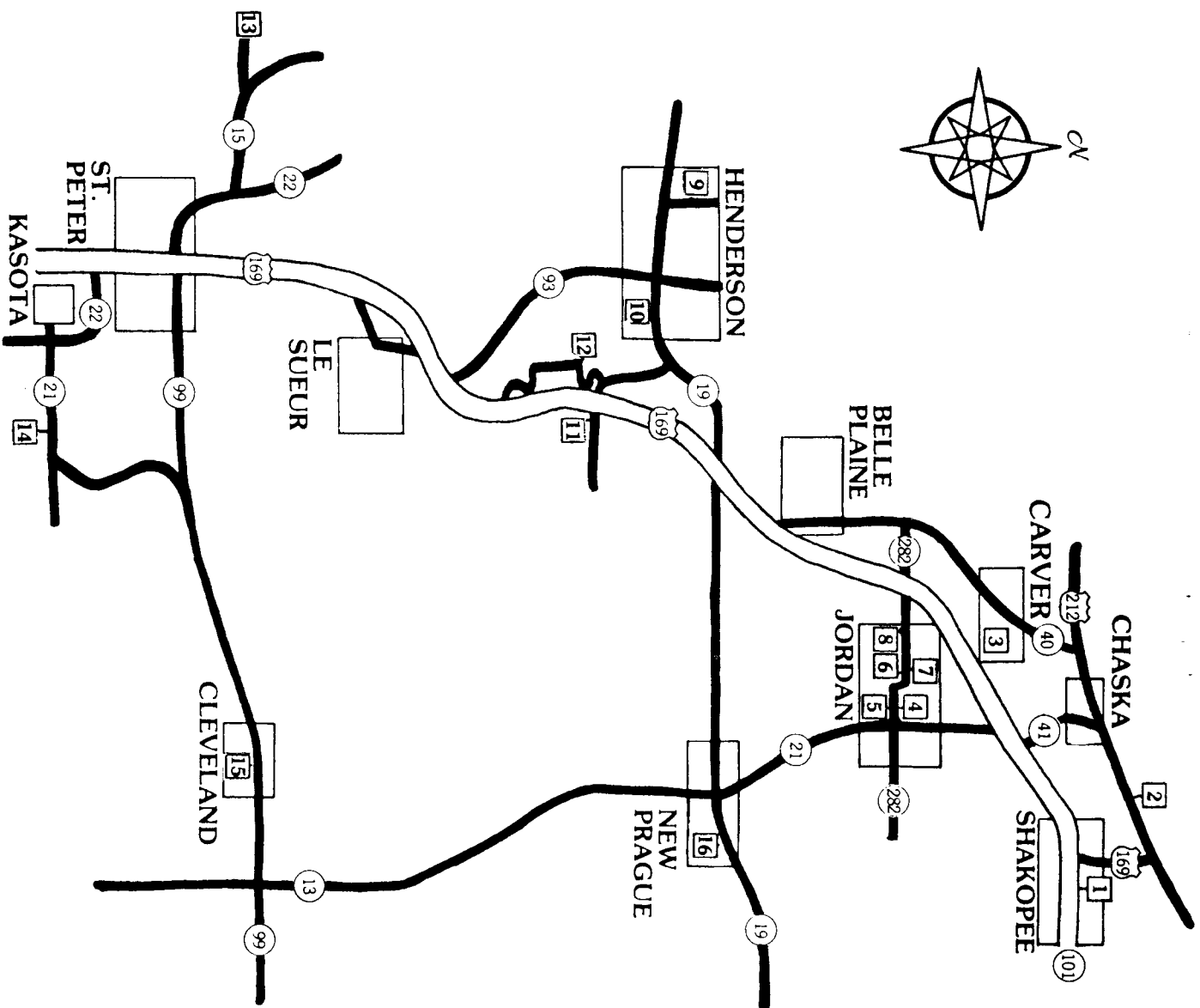
