City Council News:



Gullfilar Avenue

On November second, a resident inquired about ownership of Gullfilar Avenue, expressing concern of maintenance and considered this a driveway. Individual did not wish to pay taxes for maintenance and would prefer to have it vacated. This alleged driveway was explained to be a street by the mayor and couldn't be vacated, since some property owners would be landlocked. Question was posed about obtaining easements from owners of landlocked property as a result of vacation. A problem of garbage pick up was briefly discussed. Another citizen commented that vacation was not possible because present residents on street would have torrence rights to the street.

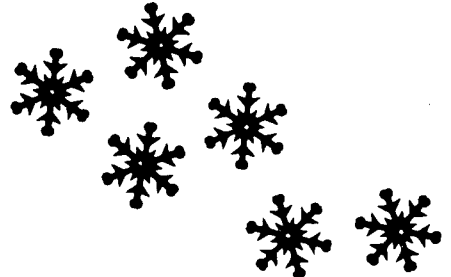


Winter

Preparations

Frey asked about locator flags for hydrants to be placed before it snows. Council agreed that these should be purchased.

Frey was asked if snow plowing equipment was ready for winter. Plow has not been put on the truck but hydraulics are in working order. Hauling of sand and putting on the plow would be done soon.





Munitech, Inc.

Citizen asked the council at the November second meeting about the amount being paid to Munitech. Mayor Myers confirmed the amount of \$ 48,000 per year being paid.

Citizen questioned the water tower having run dry during contract time. Munitech representative responded that it was because the control panel was not hooked up, causing difficulty in determining water level in the tower.

Resident asked who to contact when step station alarms are set off. Letters are being drafted and sent to residents with step stations located on their property.

Citizen inquired about the progress in the city's fire rating. Request has been made for the same rating as Chaska. The ISO Insurance Company has been out checking the city's new system.

Munitech representative had met with the engineers. Report was given that sludge pump would be repaired the week following the meeting and parts were ordered for an aerator.

This firm had gone through the entire water and sewer system, determining that several valves have to be raised. Hydrants were tested. It was also thought that a piece of watermain was not installed or plans had been changed to omit this piece. Munitech was directed to contact Maier Stewart regarding the question and request plans. They are still waiting for electrical plans.

Munitech asked the council about interest in adding polyphosphate to the water system. This ingredient would reduce or prohibit rust formation in lines. Verbal estimates were given to the council. Bids were to be gotten from different firms.

NSP replaced a pole involved in an accident. However, permission was requested to purchase conduit and wire to properly hook up step station that was also damaged. Motion was made with four ayes to authorize purchase.

Wayne Dauwalter discussed placement of a surge valve at the Fire Station. Approximate cost by Maier Stewart was \$ 2,083. Motion was made and carried with four ayes authorizing Maier Stewart to draft change order to add the valve with revisions as stated by the Fire Department.

Comment was made that padlocks were still not placed on step stations and they have not been received.

Council was told that the fence was in place at the water tower location.

Inquiry was made regarding step stations; there were meters on some while others are directly connected to the homeowner. Metered stations serving more than one customer were billed to the city; for other stations electricity was paid by the homeowner. Mayor pointed out that this was a design flaw.

City Administrator was directed to draft an ordinance regarding tampering with lift and/or step stations.

Munitech personnel and Frey were directed to post contact numbers on step stations in the case of an emergency or failure.

Concern was expressed regarding the cost of Munitech to operate the municipal utilities. Frey was asked about progress in obtaining licenses. Response was gradual progression in that direction.



Retaining Wall

Owner of Hilldale requested permission on November 2nd to replace with stone a wooden retaining wall that was damaged during construction of the utilities projects. A letter of agreement had been drafted and the owner agreed to sign. Motion was made and carried with four ayes agreeing to conditions of the letter and authorizing the mayor's signature.

Mt Hope Road [calig/have/street sign]

Frey reported on November 2nd that Mt Hope Road was completed, except for seeding. He stated that it was too late in the year for seeding.

Discussion regarding installation of light poles on the Mt Hope Road was talked about briefly. The city would be responsible for erection of the first pole at a cost of six hundred to seven hundred dollars. Additional poles would also have to be paid for, if there weren't available poles for lines. There would also be a charge at standard rates on all street lights.

City Administrator Position



Several resumes have been received for the part time City Administrator position, the council was told on November 2nd. City Administrator Botcher recommended that the mayor and a council representative review applications with him and screen them for interviews. Motion was made and carried with four ayes to review applicants for interviewing, having candidates for the December meeting. Further discussion was held regarding council representative participating in the process. Appointment of representative would be done at the November sixteenth meeting.

On November 16th the committee interviewed candidates for the City Administrator position.

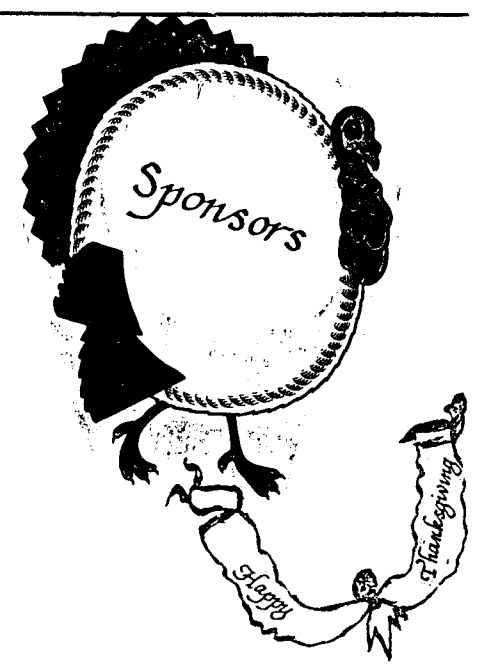

At the November 2nd meeting, City Administrator Botcher reported on the possibility of renting space for equipment at the water tower site. A letter had been sent regarding a fence being erected. Cable TV issue is still being pursued.

There were not any volunteers from the council to replace Councilman Thuening, so he would continue in that capacity. Motion was made and carried with four ayes to forward a letter to the Planning Commission regarding council representation.

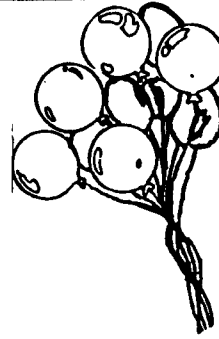
Ordinance

Carolyn Drude [Ehlers and Associates] was to be invited to the next meeting to discuss this ordinance. Motion was made and carried with four ayes to table the ordinance.

Miscellaneous

Resident expressed complaint on November second regarding standing water, as a result of the county raising County Road # 40 in the Right-of-way area. Council did not have any authorization in the right-of-way. The City Administrator was directed to contact the county on the resident's behalf.

Former mayor Jordan donated the United States flag to the city to be flown over the memorial site.

Sixth Street preparations are being made, Frey told the council. Trees and brush are being cut, so that landscaping can be done on the creek banks to repair storm damage. Light poles, as approved by the council, should be installed in November.

Electricity has been hooked up to the new shelter at the Lion's Park.

Administrator was directed to check if a Public Hearing was required for placing parking restriction on one side of a city street.

The Administrator had checked with the Sheriff's Department on their policy for dogs. The Department will not transport animals. But Botcher, City Administrator, requested the department enforce city's ordinance when owners' of the dogs are known.

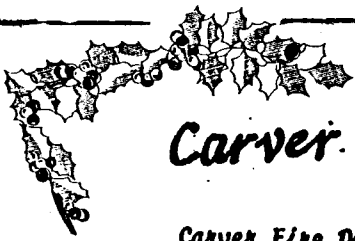

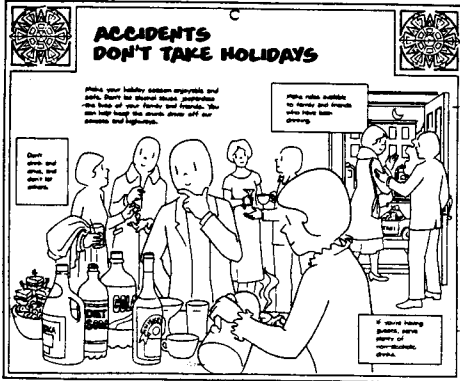
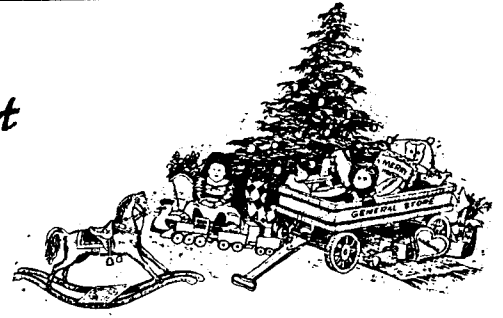
