
Are you aware of the children playing in the Post Office after hours? Please take note and ask them to please not play in the building. Signs are being taken down, trash thrown on the floor and the like.

Motion was made to adopt resolution designating Chad Peterson Day in the City of Carver. Discussion was held regarding changing date. However, day was already chosen and stated in the resolution, in order to present to Chad at the Lion's meeting. A letter was also forwarded thanking Chad for his efforts on the Lion's Park playground.

Fire truck financing was discussed. Interest rates will be watched closely. The purchasing plan to be a ten year plan. Financing issue was tabled.

Council was told that no one had responded to the ad for serving on the Planning Commission. Rosamond Dols agreed to serve another term. Brad Gulden expressed interest. Motion was made appointing Ms. Dols to the Planning Commission. Remaining position appointment was tabled.

Park and Recreation Board appointments were tabled with no one expressing interest.

Carver Heritage Preservation Commission has been recently revived. Ordinance requires seven members. Four volunteers were named. Motion was made appointing Barbara Hanson, Robin Kashuba, George Piper, Pam Larson and Councilman Antoni to the Heritage Preservation Commission. The remaining two appointments were tabled.




The 1990 Fire Rates for the portions of the townships served by the Carver Fire Department are \$ 45 per unit. Fire Chief and Administrator want to do more research and make recommendations in February. New rates would have to be set by March. Motion was passed tabling fire rates.

Comment was made regarding compliment received for the Carver Fire Department's response to a Chaska fire.

## Flood Plain Ordinance

Public Hearing was opened on the floodplain ordinance. Background on the model ordinance was submitted from the State of Minnesota. Building Inspector and attorney recommended adoption. Motion was made accepting ordinance and authorizing publication of summary version of





#### Kennel Sicense

Public Hearing on the kennel ordinance amendment was opened. Administrator explained the changes made to the amendment. No comments were made from citizens in attendance. Motion was made adopting the revised language to the kennel ordinance amendment. Motion was made approving publication of the revised amendment.

# City Administrator Job Description -

Motion was made accepting City Administrator job description. Motion was made approving revised Administrator employment agreement. Discussion was held regarding changes in agreement.

#### Sixth Street



Engineer presented designs of Sixth Street Improvements including ponding sites and drainage. Council supported design concept for realignment of Sixth Street. Staff was directed to contact Mueller's advising them of improvement plans. Also to inquire about their interest in participating in project costs.

Engineer needs to know if the Sixth Street bridge is on the National Historic Register. If the bridge is on the resgister, it can not be altered and road would have to be constructed around it, along with a new bridge. If a grant were received for improvements, cost difference to alter route would not be considered.

# Springs

Residents on County Road # 40 were present at the meeting requesting assistance for spring water runoff. Recently, a spring located on a platted, but unimproved portion of Main Street has started flowing forming a sheet of ice endangering buildings on the property and causing problems on County Road # 40.

Engineer suggested a ditch. In summer the work cannot be done because ground is too soft. Watershed District should be contacted. Staff was directed to take care of this, find solution and if necessary permission to dig was given.

# Municipal Utilities

Dauwalter monitored dissolved oxygen in water at pond site and has been able to maintain adequate levels with only one aerator. Electric usage has been reduced. Odor problems are still being worked on. Installation of a blower to test the theory as an experiment was discussed. Motion was made to try the test.

City Engineer told the council that the cause of the sewer odor problem was not a design flaw of the system, but rather caused by standards set by the MPCA. Letter has been drafted requesting a Correction Action Grant to modify the existing system.

Frey reported problems encountered while reading water meters. Approximately ten percent of boxes don't work each quarter. Many boxes are froze shut. It was said that a letter should be sent to the supplier.

A survey of the Hartung property is necessary. Twin City Abstract has been hired to develop an abstract. Cost would be approximately \$ 300 to \$ 500. Administrator will contact Mr. Hartung regarding cost sharing.

City has received grant payment from the MPCA. This is the final payment on the sewer grant.






