#### Village Hall



On June 4th Building Inspector Griep discussed City Hall Addition. 'Exit signs and panic hardware on the doors should be installed. Existing building had not been affected by the construction of the addition and the Fire Marshall's demands are of State. The installation of a sprinkler system and other changes would however be an improvement. Motion was made and carried to install exit in the basement per presented sketch. Request was made that the State Fire Marshal be contacted regarding the construction prior to beginning the project. Clarification was requested regarding exit construction and which quote would be used.

#### Streets



Council reviewed quotation received from Wm. Mueller and Sons to pave Fourth Street. The quote was \$ 10,500. It was said that homeowners should be assessed for the improvements. Disagreement was voiced, arguing that no homeowner yet has been assessed for a street that has been in existence as long as Fourth Street, although new streets have been assessed.

Comment was made that attention needs to be paid to gravel roads. Mt. Hope Road needs to be graded. Attempts had been made but grader developed mcchanical problems.

It anticipated that Fourth Street ditch will be completed by fall.

Discussion was held regarding the grading done on the road to Riverside

#### 1989 Audit



Council was told that the 1989 audit was not completed as previously anticipated. When completed it can be submitted to the State with administrator approval or approval at the July meeting, or a special meeting be scheduled. Motion was made and carried to schedule a special meeting for reviewal of the 1989 audit.





#### Community Park

Citizen spoke to the administrator about the Community Park eroding into his field. Administrator recommended drafting a sketch plan to determine elevation for reshaping park land. Land should be reshaped, leveled and seed planted. Site plan could be done for approximately \$ 600, the city engineer told the council. Motion was made directing Frey to level, seed, and possibly put down erosion netting.

Bicycle rack at the Lion's Park was briefly discussed. It is the opinion of the council that the rack should be placed where it is more accessible.

Discussion was held regarding the 'Stop' sign at Lion's park. Some are obeying the sign while others are not. Suggestion was made to place flags on the sign and paint a crosswalk.

#### Ordinance Violations

Property on Fourth Street in regard to safety was discussed. The property was considered a hazard. Attorney submitted a draft of procedure recommendation in order to get the property cleaned up.

Motion was made and carried to have the Building Inspector inspect the property and send letters to the owners directing them how to clean the property up. Discussion was held regarding waiting to execute the court order. However the attorney felt justified in serving the order if inspector's letter did not obtain or get results.

Public Works Director had inspected the site of horse pens. Request was made to have dirt hauted in. Suggestion was made to wait for the ground to dry before hauling in dirt.

Comment was made concerning horses being tied at the side of the road. This is road is considered a hazard. Request would be made to keep animals in a confined pen.

Staff was directed to research the matter of animal control being correlated with recodification project.





#### Insurance

Ms Barbara Swanson was present at the meeting to discuss insurance. An appraisal had been requested for the Village Hall. Also quotation for 1990/1991 insurance coverage has been requested from the League of Minnesota Cities. Conclusion was made to increase coverage on some city structures. A list of items and costs will be presented to the council at the July meeting.

#### Sixth Street

#### Improvements

Engineer discussed the Sixth Street improvements. Drainage was highlighted and comment was made that about 350 acres drain to this street. Work will be broken into five sections and several ponds will be created. Explanation of work to be done was given.

Engineer recommended that bids be requested for the entire project and then decision be made which parts to be done. Plans and specifications have to be submitted to several State Agencies. Contact has been made with the state Historical Society and a copy of the plans forwarded.

Bids would not be opened until August lst if plans and specs were not approved at the June 4th meeting. Therefore it would be too late in the season to begin construction.

Motion was made and carried conditionally approving specifications and going out for bids. Motion was made and carried to forward plans and specifications to appropriate state agencies.



Request was made for approval to hold a neighborhood block party in Lenzen Addition on Kirch Hill Drive. Permission was asked to close this street. A petition was presented. City of Chaska had been contacted inquiring for guidelines.

Attorney questioned city liability in closing of street. One comment was made that the party should be held at Riverside Park. Several citizens are opposed to the plans. Question was posed regarding necessity of closing the street since it is a dead-end street.



Removal of Parks and Recreation Board appointments was discussed. Administrator explained quorum problems of members not attending meetings. Board members may be removed by two-thirds vote of the council with or without cause. Motion was made and carried to remove Art Moldenhauer and Jane Griep from the Park and Recreation Board. Motion was made and carried appointing Jeff Feltmann and Bob Riesgraf to the Parks and Recreation Board.

#### Purchase Request



Mr Siegel requested that the city purchase lot by Riverside Park. The price was considered good. Motion was made to offer money for the land. Attorney proposed a standard purchase agreement be prepared.

#### Municipal Utilities

Municipal utilities operator reported that the land purchased by the city from Hartungs is not suitable for a sludge site since the water table is too close to the surface. Another site or solution is being sought.

Council was asked about purchasing a lawmower. Funds were to come out of Public Works Capital fund and the sewer fund since it would be used for parks and pond site areas.

#### Streets/Alley Vacations

Planning Commission has scheduled a public hearing for the proposed street and alley vacations with instructions for special publicity. Public Hearing is scheduled for June 27th.

Motion was made and carried to schedule Public Hearing on proposed vacations at the July 2nd meeting.

#### Neighborhood Covenants

Councilman expressed interest in the city enforcing Neighborhood Covenants. Neighborhood Associations enforce covenants in Chaska area. Attorney explained that private covenants are not city's business, rather enforced by developers. In Lenzen Addition there is no homeowners association, and property owners would have to sue to ensure convenants are being followed.



#### Painting

Request was made to advertise for bids to paint interior of the Fire Station.







Councilman inquired on June 4th about acquiring quotation putting asphalt on Fourth Street and obtaining a screen for the door on the council chambers.

Motion was made and carried to consider proposal for All Terrain Vehicle Ordinance at the recodification worksession.

City has not heard from any of the softball teams regarding payment for fees of the use of the park.

Motion was made and carried authorizing preparation of resolution approving the financing of the new Fire Truck through Clarey's Safety Equipment/Pierce.

 ${\bf Motion}$  was made and carried approving the computer warranty quotation from Quest Data Systems.

Administrator explained Flood Plain elevation signs being donated by the DNR. Signs would be placed on structures displaying where the 100 year flood levels are. This issue should be reviewed by the Heritage Preservation Commission.

Request was made that the Sheriff's Department be asked to conduct a Safety Program at the Lion's Park.

Truck Parking Ordinance revision was inquired about, as well as any ordinance dealing with noises created by farm equipment in developed areas.

Developer relayed that the outlook for development of Country View Heights was not good since the overall consensus was that the housing market is presently soft. A release, however, has not been signed.

Meeting was closed to the public to discuss litigation matter.






The group is concentrating all their efforts into the upcoming Victorian Garden Party.


#### Special Note


