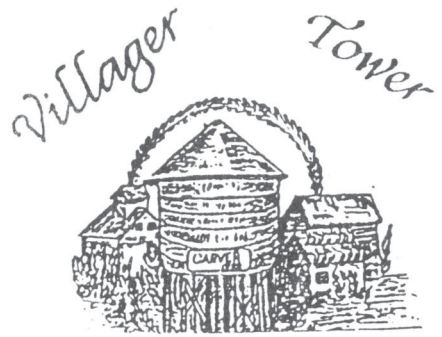

Notice Steamboat Days



Notice—On Saturday, September 7th and Sunday, the 8th, there will not be any parking allowed on Broadway during the day from morning until 6:00 PM, in order for crafters to display their wares. There will be traffic allowed through, but no parking will be allowed.

Lawcon Grant Application



Administrator reported that the Lawcon Grant Application narrative and cost figures are completed and ready for submission. He is, however, waiting for Carver County's Engineering firm to forward information regarding alignment for the proposed Townline Road. Motion was made and carried by roll call vote adopting resolution authorizing staff to submit Lawcon Grant.

Civil Defense Warning System

Administrator updated the council concerning upgrading and additional sirens needed. He proposed a four to six year plan for upgrade of the system, as well as monies for next years budget to purchase radio. Lions Park was suggested as a site for a siren. Recommendation was presented that a plan be drafted. Suggestion was made to wire sirens to one radio.

Fourth Street Bridge



Frey reported that work on the Fourth Street bridge is completed. Also, council was told that the small bridge behind the Village Hall across Spring Creek has been removed.

Central Business District Rehabilitation Loan



A business has presented a request for loan funds. Administrator suggested making these funds available to all businesses locally. One council member supported idea as an opportunity to expand and encourage businesses to locate in Carver. Administrator was directed to draft proposal.

Sixth Street



Frey reported that some items in project on Sixth Street are incomplete. At the present time, the project is less than the bill.

The Soil and Conservation Service has been in Carver reviewing areas requiring work. Next year, there may be possible available funds for additional work on Fourth Street.

Engineer has reviewed pay request from F.F. Jedlicki, Inc. Cost for completed project is \$ 92,436.94 less 5 % retainage. Motion was made and carried to approve pay request, \$ 87,815.09 for F.F. Jedlicki, Inc.

1992 Proposed Budget



Mayor explained the preliminary budget which required approval and submission to Carver County for the Truth in Taxation requirement. Proposed budget capital expense line items were also briefly discussed. Motion was made and carried by roll call vote adopting resolution for Preliminary 1992 Budget.

Administrator proposed that the Public Hearing for the budget be held on December 2nd. Motion was made and carried scheduling the Public Hearing on December second.

Street Closure Notice



Request was presented to the council that no parking will be allowed on Broadway during SteamBoat Days. One vendor objected since this would create problems for people who purchase items. Suggestion was made that parking not be permitted until 5:00 PM. SteamBoat Chairman explained problem of people viewing crafts have little room to see when cars are parked. Motion was made and carried not to allow parking on Broadway from Fourth to Main Streets until 6:00 PM on Saturday and Sunday. Also motion was made and carried to close Third Street from Broadway to Oak for SteamBoat activities.

Carver-On-The-Minnesota reviewed and evaluated their membership drive held in June. The group will be hosting a Humanities Presentation in the near future. The date, time and place of this event to follow in future issue. Their September meeting will be at the home of Randy and Cindy Monroe on the nineteenth of September.

Carver-On-The-Minnesota received a \$ 340 check presented by Mrs Naomie Engler from Aid Association for Lutherans - Carver Branch # 546. This money is being used for window restoration in the Church-By-the-River. Also received was \$ 268.52 donation from the City of Carver Historic Grant Fund. This money will also be used for window restoration. These monies were greatly appreciated.

Carver-On-The-Minnesota will also be hosting an Ice Cream Social on Sunday, September 8th for SteamBoat Days. This Social will be held at the Church-By-the-River site at 1:00 PM till Hosts will be serving Ice Cream Cones and Root Beer Floats. (Yum Yum)

1992 Police Contract

Community Service Program was discussed and the possibility of this program being made available through the Sheriff's Department. This program involves a Community Service Officer who would practice animal control, as well as Ordinance enforcement. Suggestion was made to retain half hour of service, but also contract for Community Services, if it becomes available. This cost would be less than patrol time.

Carver Fire Relief



Carver Fire Relief representative requested retirement benefits increase for Fire Department members from \$ 450 per year of service to \$ 500 per year. Mayor commented that notice had not been received for Fire Relief Meetings. Four year projection on relief benefits were requested. This request will be reviewed next month.

H.R.A. Relocation

HRA (Housing and Redevelopment Authority) requested use of space in the Village Hall temporarily. Administrator recommended approval requesting rent negotiations be handled by the staff. Motion was made and carried allowing staff to rent space to the HRA and negotiate fees.

Heritage Preservation Commission

Administrator explained powers/authority of Heritage Preservation Commission and that regulations of the ordinances have been ignored. This committee makes recommendations to the council.

Citizen expressed concern on August 5th regarding cars traveling at excessive speeds on Third Street especially due to poor visibility. Administrator and Frey were directed to check into issue and request was made to contact the Sheriff's Department for assistance. Motion was made and carried to erect "Stop" signs at Third and Ash Streets, if necessary.

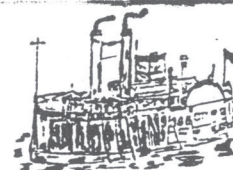
