## In Memory of "Uncle Carl"

### Building Permit



At the October 5th council meeting the council was presented with a building permit request. Owner had checked on cost of building per Heritage Preservation Commission's recommendations and agreed to their recommendations. Motion was made and carried approving the building permit.

### Administrator



Council interviewed four candidates for the position of City Administrator. An offer was made and accepted by one candidate. Motion was made and carried to pay the former Administrator to brief the new Administrator on current projects in the community.

### Excess Liability Insurance



Council reviewed city attorney's recommendations regarding excess liability insurance. Motion was made and carried electing not to purchase insurance.

### Fish and Wildlife Agreement

Councilman reported that citizen complained about structure being constructed by Fish & Wildlife at Riverside Park would cause flooding to private property. It was the mayor's opinion that this issue would have to be resolved by Fish & Wildlife service and property owner.

### 1993 Budget



Fireman was present at meeting to discuss the 1993 budget for Fire Relief. Council was informed that the Fire Relief will probably request an increase in benefits.

Motion was made and carried to put the balance of youth activities line item in a carry over fund at year end and move \$ 1,500 in proposed '93 budget into contingency in parks.

### Municipal Utilities



Municipal utilities operator presented an agreement on the telephone monitoring system for the lift stations. Motion was made and carried with all ayes to sign presented contract.

Operator told the council that an application was being processed for the sludge site with Carver County. The county will hold a Public Hearing in October. There are three proposals sites in San Francisco Township.

Footings have been poured for the water treatment plant building. The Lions have agreed to take on the project. Local contractor has allowed use of his equipment and encourages employees to do labor for an hourly wage.

Citizen inquired about status of water treatment plant. Mayor explained plans and progress. Citizen voiced complaint of bad water and wished to hook back up to his well. He was told that this was illegal. Councilman further explained costs involved in getting treatment plant operational and funds had to come from water funds.

Frey informed the council that the well at Riverside Park is no longer functioning. Conclusion was made that a plastic line could be run from city water system to provide drinkable water. Motion was made and carried tabling issue until cost estimates were obtained.

### Carver-on-the-Minnesota



Members are still busy with plans for the Holiday Craft Sale and House Tours. The tours and sale are scheduled for December 6th, Sunday afternoon from noon until 5:00 PM. Tickets will be available at the Village Hall that day.

On October 18th, Sunday at the Church-by-the-River the BlueGrass Band returned to raise money for Carver-On-The-Minnesota church restoration.

Council reviewed joint assessment with Carver County. Motion was made and carried by roll call vote with all ayes approving joint assessment agreement for 1993 and 1994.

Motion was made and carried by roll call vote with all ayes adopting resolution appointing election judges for November 3rd General Election. Motion was made and carried scheduling special meeting to canvass votes on November 4th.

Progress of the Public Works garage was asked about and nothing is happening yet.

Citizen inquired about status of the community park. Response was that there is progress and the fields should be playable next year.
