# Public Works Report

It was the council's consensus that the staff actively pursue construction of an addition to the Fire Station.

## Property Purchase

Administrator was directed to proceed with negotiations with the HRA for a lease agreement and purchase of the building.

## Miscellancous



Council reviewed 1992's resolution regarding fees. Revisions were made. The updated resolution will be resubmitted for approval at the December meeting.

Changes have been made to the Employment Agreement with the Administrator.

Mayor has forwarded letters to Senators and Representatives for appointment of Chad Peterson to the Naval Academy.

Discussion was also presented that the recodification process should be resumed soon.

Request for proposal have been narrowed down and administrator spoke with th Planning Commission about requests for proposals. General consensus at this point was that the Comprehensive Plan could be done for less than proposals between the Planning Commission, Administrator and Planner since the Administrator has had experience with Comprehensive Plans.




