#### youth Commission

At the March 1st meeting, Chad Peterson presented report to the council regarding history and achievements of the Youth Commission. Also presented was a proclamation from the State of Minnesota for council review and approval.

On April 1st, youth and adult representatives terms expire. Replacements are necessary. New members are being sought. Councilmember requested that flyers be distributed seeking volunteers. Motion was made and carried accepting the proclamation declaring the week of April 18th through the 24th as Volunteer Recognition Week.

# Carver County Environmental Services

Carver County Environmental Services representative informed the council of grant monies available to Carver for community clean-up. Request was submitted for a letter of intent explaining how funds would be utilized. This grant money is set up as a cost share grant. Receipt of this letter would be necessary within two to three weeks. These monies could be used for compost bins, clean-up days, etc.

There was also discussion regarding the burn site which had been required to be closed. Council was advised to inform citizens that brush and the like can be taken to be deposited at the site on County Road # 140.

#### Erosion



Mueller's representative was present to discuss an erosion problem occurring. Land atop the hill on the city's western boundaries is eroding. Mueller's would like to install some retention ponds, in order to slow down the erosion. Carver County Water and Soil Conservation Service and county are to work with Mueller's on the project.



#### Traffic Survey

Carver County Deputy updated the council on the traffic survey conducted on Fourth Street. Some vehicles may be a little over speed limit but not enough to ticket. There are more vehicles not stopping. Four citations were issued. mayor requested further surveillance be continued when possible.

Councilman inquired about traffic on Fourth Street, suggesting a seasonal 'STOP'sign be erected on Fourth and Ash Street. A "Blind Intersection" sign was also suggested. Motion was made and carried to place a seasonal "STOP" sign at Fourth and Ash Streets.



## Liquor Licenses

Mr Hergott and Mr Ries of Izzy's Corporation are in the process of purchasing the Dog House Bar. Request was presented to the council to approve license transfer. Motion was made and carried approving transfer of liquor license from J & J Cement to Izzy's Corporation contingent upon the Carver County Sheriff's Department background check.

## Public Works Report

City Engineer informed the council that a feasibility report had been completed on Sixth Street improvements approximately three years earlier. A portion of the work has been completed and the balance of work would cost about \$ 595,840.00 which includes some drainage work, water and sewer improvements.

After some discussion the council consensus was to work with the county on Town Line Road. If any assessing plans for the project are pursued, the # 429 Law must be followed.

### Municipal Utilities



Municipal Utilities operator discussed issue regarding pumping septic tanks this summer and sludge application sites in San Francisco Township. The township Board requested Letter of Assurance from the city should a problem arise from sludge application and that the city would correct any said problem. Operator would like to forward such letter with assurances. He is also checking cost effectiveness and advantages at alternate of Blue Lake Treatment Site disposal. It was concluded that there was very little chance of anything going wrong if sludge were applied to farm land.

Council discussed the letter which would

accompany the March utility bills. Additions and corrections were made during the meeting.



#### Newsletter Proposal

Villager Tower editor was present at the meeting to discuss assisting the city to coordinate a city quarterly newsletter. Printing costs, format, etc were researched. Agreement was reached that groups, such as the council, the Planning Commission, Fire Department, etc would have articles to the city offices on predetermined date in order to get newsletter out at the month end. Estimated costs for city quarterly newsletter would be approximately \$ 800 for four issues, one year. Motion was made and carried to pay newsletter costs out of the General Reserve Fund.

# Proposed Pro

Apartment owner sent a letter requesting a four month extension for completion of apartment complex. One councilmember was of the opinion that four months was too much of an extension. Another councilmember expressed granting a ninety day extension. Contract is for March 31st completion date. council consensus was to grant a sixty day extension giving the owner until the end of May. Motion was made and carried extending com-

pletion date for apartments to May 31st. Council requested letter be forwarded to owner regarding extension date and include items in the agreement required to be completed.





The Carver Lions will be sponsoring a "Bicycle Safety Day" for Carver and East Union area. This event is Andy Stacy's Eagle Project for Boy Scouts Troop # 174. Further information will be forthcoming. The tentative scheduled date will be for the end of April or the beginning of May. One session will be held in Carver and one in East Union. Flyers will be sent out.

Lions discussed their upcoming "Annual Pancake Breakfast". More information will follow.

#### Miscellancous

Motion was made and carried to adopt engineering agreement as presented for 1993.

Motion was made and carried adopting resolution transferring 1993 budget for elections to a special fund.

Motion was made and carried adopting presented emergency plan.

The Planning Commission, Heritage Preservation Commission and Park & Recreation Board have all been working on the Comprehensive Plan revisions. Engineers will review plan when everyone has finished.

Staff and council reviewed Chapters Three and Four of Ordinance Codes.

Carver's Board of Review meeting is scheduled for May 4th, 1993.

Staff was directed to draft a thank you letter to Chaska's Administrator, Dave Pokorney for holding work session with the council to develop a "Mission Statement".

Mayor extended an invitation to the council for a meeting with the DNR regarding the dike and town inventory.

4-H is planning for *Share-The-Fun* which is an evening of skits, plays, music and fun provided by 4-Her's across the county. Everyone is invited and it is free admission. This evening will be on April 20th starting at 7:00 PM at the Young America High School.
