Spring Creek

At the August 2nd meeting a citizen requested discussion of eroding bank at Spring Creek. Request was made for assistance from the city to put in rip rap along the creek bank to stabilize banks. Two other property owners are also experiencing the same problem. Spring Creek is not regulated by the DNR since there is not a large enough watershed. It was noted that the city would have to help everyone if one request was granted. Request was made to assist with material costs.

The mayor inquired if the Soil Conservation Service had been contacted regarding the situation of erosion along the creek. Council member suggested contacting the Lutheran Brotherhood who had offered matching funds for certain flood related projects. It was also pointed out that all the trees should be removed from the dike. Mayor commented that easements would be necessary if city became involved.

Frey was directed to contact the Soil Conservation Service and to give the property owners copies of the Lutheran Brotherhood's letter. Engineer suggested contacting the Lower Minnesota River WaterShed and Carver Creek Watershed for assistance.

Excess Liability Insurance

Insurance agent was present at the meeting to explain the Excess Liability Coverage more thoroughly as well as answer any questions. After discussion, the council consensus was to not pay for Excess Liability Coverage.

Council briefly discussed medical options. Council consensus was that the premium credit was not worth opting for a deductible amount.

Carver Creek Watershed

Motion was made and carried adopting the Joint Powers Agreement with the Carver Creek WaterShed management organization. Council members Terry volunteered to be a commissioner on the committee and the council accepted his offer.

Public Works Report

Frey reported that residents in the area of the Rail Road trestle which is presently blocked to prevent flooding are upset because rain water can not drain. The mayor stated that the council may be looking into that curb area and alternate ways to drain water.

Frey reported that Sentenced to Serve (STS) crews have been working in the city. All the brush has been removed from the dikes. The crews will return to assist in sandbag removal.

The mayor asked engineer about culvert sizes necessary in the area, if the city decided to dike the area under the Rail Road trestle permanently. Engineer responded that a twenty-four inch culvert would be adequate. Replacement of present culverts under the dike was also discussed. If this was a plan the city would pursue, then firm amounts for upgrade work was necessary.

City Flag

Council considered the city flag design submitted by the Park and Recreation Board. The Heritage Preservation Commission also suggested that the Minnesota River and a steamboat should be represented on the flag. The design was submitted by Veronica Giese. The mayor stated that he would make inquiries about color variations on the proposed flag.

Park and Recreation Board

Administrator told the council that he'd received information from the Park and Recreation Board regarding what was necessary at the city parks for a park grant which he will submit to the DNR.

Council member inquired about a primitive campground at RiverSide Park. Administrator will check into this issue.

Council discussed completion of the community park as a top priority. Council member stated that the fields should be sprayed. Frey told the council that STS crews worked at the park and materials are available to finish fencing at park. The mayor stated that efforts should be made to make the three fields priority for completion to be used next spring.

Steamboat Days

The mayor reported that it appears that RiverSide Park area will not be able to be used as a starting point for the parade. Therefore, the parade route will have to be changed. Council was asked also if they were available to ride in the Fire Engine in the parade.

Housing and Redevelopment Authority

Administrator informed the council that he'd attended a meeting held by the Carver County HRA (Housing and Redevelopment Authority) regarding recent innovative financial packages available to finance various housing needs for communities.

This book inluded hook up fees for water and sewer. fter a lengthy discussion of fees in ther cities and Carver's fees, the counil analyzed costs and decided on a \$ 980 ewer Connection Fee and a \$ 2,125 Water onnection Fee. City Clerk was directed o draft Revised Fees Resolution for ouncil consideration.

Motion was made and carried by roll call rote adopting resolution granting varance request.

otion was made and carried adopting reslution for 1994 Police Contract with arver County.

he city clerk explained the history of mortgage subordination agreement loan hich a resident was requesting to be ubordinated so he could refinance his ouse. The council did not have any prolem with the agreement and authorized he mayor to sign it.

ouncil member reported that he'd checked n a hard drive for the city's computer inding that the older computers hard rives are difficult to locate. Therefore t was approved that the original quote eceived was a good deal. Clerk was dircted to contact Starfire Research and ave the computer upgraded.

he last set of ordinances were reviewed y the council.

ouncil member inquired about the light t the intersection of Highway # 212 and ounty Road # 40. Staff was directed to neck into the issue.

puncil requested that developer be inited to the council meeting to advise 1 the status of his apartment building.


