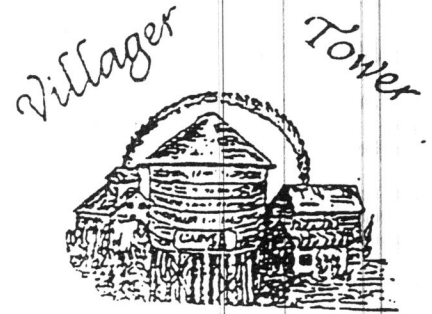

Environmental Grant

Carver County representative spoke with the council on June 6th regarding an environmental grant. The amount available grant funds for the City of Carver is \$2,300. It was his opinion that a clean up day would be an excellent idea for Carver. Suggestion was also made to close the Compost Site. Unattended sites are fast becoming obsolete due to abuse of sites. The county would make up a "CLOSED" sign, as well as organize and advertise a clean up day for the city.

Black Sox Fundraiser

Motion was made and carried with all eyes approving 3.2 license for the Black Sox fundraiser on the condition that they are sponsored by the Lions Club.

Variance

Council reviewed variance request for a unique situation where a house proposed to be constructed would be a substantial distance from Mt Hope Road. Only city water would be available to the site at this time. Motion was made and carried approving the variance request by resolution that disallowed municipal utilities hook up due to hardship.

Sixth Street Improvements

City Engineer told the council that the bids were opened as scheduled, however, the bids were higher than expected. Recommendation was submitted not to award the bid until after the Assessment Public Hearing. Motion was made and carried with all eyes adopting resolution scheduling Public Hearing for June 29th.

Business District

Business owner informed the council of plans to start a Coffee Shop/Deli in the property located on Broadway. Property owner was requesting rehabilitation loan in the amount of 15 - 18 thousand dollars. Council member stated that it was their opinion that this plan should be supported since this is the type of activity being promoted in the downtown area. Motion was made and carried approving the rehabilitation loan for the amount of \$ 15,000.

Eagle Ridge Addition

Developer requested change of routing municipal utilities for Eagle Ridge Addition. This idea would prevent tearing up SkyView Lane. Existing home would not incur assessments at this time. As existing systems failed then hook up could be completed. Sewer lines could be planned for behind homes. Mayor suggested that existing homes be notified of any easements necessary. It was also consensus that elevations of existing homes should be conducted. Further review would be conducted.

Water Tower

City Attorney informed the council that the Rail Road has accepted the city's offer to purchase the water tower and some of the land surrounding the tower. Motion was made and carried approving the purchase of the Rail Road property and authorized city attorney to conduct a forty year title search.

Stray Cats

Council discussed stray cat problem. League of Minnesota Cities will forward a model ordinance on cats for council's review. No one had been located to contract for picking up stray cats.

Municipal Utilities

Council and engineer discussed schedule of expansion of the sewer ponds. There are state requirements to be followed before a feasibility study is conducted. The list of requirements was distributed for review. Estimated cost of the project is \$73,000. Motion was made and carried to start items on requirement list for the ponds.

City attorney reported findings regarding ownership of septic tanks as part of the city's sewer system. Suggestion was made that any new tanks installed should be placed as close to lot lines as practical. Administrator was directed to review original grant, as well as other pertinent documents to determine if new tanks added would be owned by the city. This information is to be brought to the July meeting.

Council member expressed opinion that the Water Filtration Plant should be completed suggesting that sale of bonds should be looked into if necessary.

Information was reviewed regarding septic, plumbing and mechanical permits. Issue was tabled.

Riverside Park

Frey informed the council of vandalism occurring at Riverside Park. Frey suggested re-installation of the gate across the park entrance and the park being closed at 10 PM.

Frey was also asked to post bridge height going to Riverside Park.

City Administrator

Administrator informed the council that he will expand his work schedule. However, he wants to ease into increase of hours. Council advised that he should revise his Employment Agreement and perhaps to go on an hourly wage.

Miscellaneous

Carver County Sheriff's Department informed the council that patrolling of requested areas has been increased.

Council discussed grass trimming along fence lines at parks. Work is being completed as fast as possible.

Council discussed moving of some mailboxes on Mt Hope Road.

Administrator was directed to forward letter to dragline owner regarding the dragline sitting on the dike which is to be removed immediately.

Motion was made and carried appointing Kathy Wellens as Carver's Youth Representative on the Youth Commission.

Council member told the council about Spring Creek at Fifth Street getting bad. Carver County Soil and Water Conservation Service should be advised and asked to check the situation out.

Council was informed of tentative plans to remodel Village Hall basement by the Carver Lions. Discussion was held of necessity of Architect's design.

Brief discussion was held regarding NSP moving power lines at the Community Park.
