Harvey's Bar

Council was informed at the August 1st meeting that Keith Wickenhouser and Mark Anhalt are purchasing Harvey's Bar. Questions were answered. Required forms have been completed and background checks were done. Motion was made and carried by roll call vote adopting resolution granting transfer of liquor license for Harvey's Bar.

1994 Improvements

Council was informed by the citizen's attorney that assessments had been appealed as required by law. Citizen has land in Agriculture Preserve Program and by law this land can not be assessed while in Ag Preserve. Representative from Land Stewardship Organization gave a background of Ag Preserve Law. Mayor stated that it was not the council's intent to violate any law and the matter would be resolved immediately. City Engineer was of the opinion that the assessments could be amended. City Attorney stated they will work with clerk to correct this error. City Attorney stated that the Ag Preserve Property was not intended to be assessed since his notes from the Public Hearing showed that he and the Engineer had agreed that the property would not be assessed. Amended Resolution was passed to adopt the Assessment Roll excluding Ag Preserve Property from the

Motion was made and carried to set the date for the Sale of Bonds regarding the Sixth Street project to take place at the September council meeting.

Cat Ordinance

Administrator will forward packet of Cat Ordinance to Planning Commission to create ordinance for City of Carver.

Dog Catching Contract

Contract had been presented to the council for dog catching. Council was interested. However, contractor was not availle to discuss issue at the meeting.

Fire Relief Association

Council was told that the Fire Relief would like to restore the 1927 GMC Fire Truck. The estimated restoration cost would be \$13 to \$14 thousand. Fire Relief was under the impression that the truck had been donated to Fire Relief, however the title is in the City' name. City was asked what they wanted to do with the truck. The Relief would like to be owners of the truck and pay all restoration costs associated with it. Council consensus was that the truck should belong to the Relief Association.

Council was also told that the Fire Department would like to increase their retirement from \$500 to \$700 per year of service. After review of Relief records, the State has said that they could go to \$900 with funds available without increasing the burden on the city.

Council was also informed that fire fighters will be giving away smoke detectors at SteamBoat Days.

Black Sox

Black Sox requested a special gambling license, a gambling permit that could be used for raffles up to four times a year, or a calendar for drawings that has a winner every day. The State charges a \$25 fee. Council's opinion was requested before the paperwork was all completed. Lions would be contacted.

Public Works

Public Works Director informed the council that work had started on Sixth Street storm sewer project. Work is being partially financed by a grant from Soil and Water Conservation District. Tax Increment Funds will be used to pay city's share of cost.

Spring Creek at 5th Street was checked due to erosion. Available funds are also being researched.

Mt Hope Road erosion was also discussed. Council talked about putting in a swale. However gas lines, cables and the like run in the ditch. In order to make a swale the road would need to be built up first. Director recommended grading and careful maintenance until road gets paved.

Miscellaneous

Carver County Deputy informed the Council that the Department is patrolling County Road # 40 as requested and will continue patrolling the road.

Motion was made and carried to continue volunteer insurance and pay required premium.

Motion was made and carried by roll call vote adopting resolution appointing election judges.

Motion was made and carried tabling discussion of the 1995 budget review.

Engineer informed council of easements needed on Sixth Street as soon as possible. Work cannot be started without these easements.

Council was presented outline of work to be completed on Phase II of Comprehensive Plan.

Carver Bluffs

Carver Bluffs developer submitted letter of request to City to annex property from Dahlgren Township. Township Board Members were present to discuss the issue. Board member had understood that land in Town ship would not be developed until late 1995 or even 1996. Developer explained that some road work and clearing had been started. Board member stated that when the development gets into the area in Dahlgren and the township can not provide services, then the township would agree to annexation.

For financing purposes, having the land annexed would be beneficial. Board member commented that the township wished to see the success of the development before agreeing to annexation. The board expressed concern that annexation would occur and the development could fail.

Developer explained that Phase IV which is in the township may be developed at the same time as one of the other Phases. Board members stated that this was not the policy established at the last meeting. Therefore, members present could not agree to anything until the board met again.

Administrator informed council that the letter of credit is necessary for Carver Bluffs especially since work had begun. The Developers Agreement has not been approved either.

Park Grant

Motion was made and carried by roll call vote adopting Resolution approving the 1994 Park Grant Application. Administrator told council of pledged monies from last year to meet the 50% portion of agreement. Council was asked to pledge similar amount this year. Motion was made and carried to commit funds or in-kind services as city's share of project if grant is awarded.

Municipal Utilities

Council member told council he'd looked at a tank for water treatment plant. Request was made to get numbers for restoration versus a new tank. These costs should be reviewed at the September meeting.

Meeting has been scheduled for reviewing water meter building system.

City Administrator

Administrator told the council that a rough draft letter has been prepared for the Dale Green Company, but was not ready for council review. It was Administrator's opinion that the company is in total violation of original agreement. Mayor requested company's owner be invited to Planning Commission meeting to discuss issue. Letter will be forwarded.

Eagle Ridge Addition

City Engineer has not approved the Developer's Agreement or final plot for Eagle Ridge Addition because of easements, etc. Letter of credit has been received for Eagle Ridge Addition.

Youth Commission

Letter had been drafted thanking Lori Wellens for services performed as City Representative on the Youth Commission. Council consensus was to forward letter.

Carver-on-the-Minnesota

Carver-On-The-Minnesota members will be serving Root Beer Floats and Carmel apples at/around/near/and about town, based at Church-By-River site. Be sure to try one of these delights and tour church will also be open to the public.

Chamber of Commerce

Preliminary information was received regarding organizing a Chamber of Commerce in the city. Heritage Preservation Commission submitted suggestion. Suggestion was submitted that Heritage Preservation Commission conduct meeting with businesses and survey interest of organizing such a venture.

Paul Kerber has been designated to receive the Helen Keller Award by the Carver Lions.
