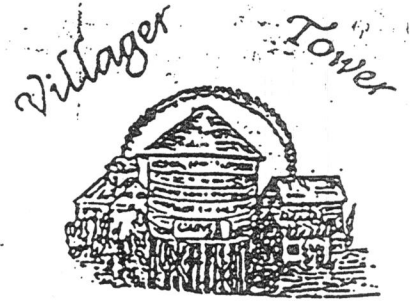

Carver Creek Addition

A Public Hearing was held regarding the temporary easement for storm drainage in Phase I of the Carver Creek Subdivision. This easement is no longer necessary since construction has begun in Phase II. Motion was made vacating this temporary easement.

Municipal Utilities

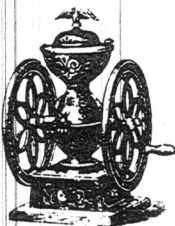
The council discussed water and well construction and where these pipes were put. Question was posed if they were put in the ditches. Response was given that usually construction occurs in the county right-of-way, but occasionally easements were necessary. Water tower types were also discussed.

Miscellaneous

Council was asked if the city had an existing snowmobile ordinance. The council was to be supplied with a copy of this ordinance, as well as map of trails.

The County is reviewing the issue of a four-way stop on Sixth Street and County Road #147.

The Planning Commission has recommended that the council rezone the property around the railroad water tower. Motion was made and carried adopting resolution to rezone area.



Carver Bluffs Carver Creek

The council discussed the curb at Carver Creek Circle. Question was asked why repairs had not been made to this curb. Suggestion to remove island had been submitted with residents to be notified. Letter is to be forwarded to the residents. Council member stated that both entrance islands were hazardous at Carver Creek Circle and Carver Creek Place. Motion was made to poll residents regarding the removal of the islands.

An erosion problem in the Carver Bluffs development was questioned. The situation was explained to the council and it appears that this issue does not involve the city.

The city had received correspondence regarding the concrete islands on two streets in Carver Bluffs. There were more people in favor of keeping the islands than removal. General consensus was that the islands should remain. Traffic signs were discussed. The developer was to be contacted regarding this issue.

Residents also inquired about snow removal in the subdivision.

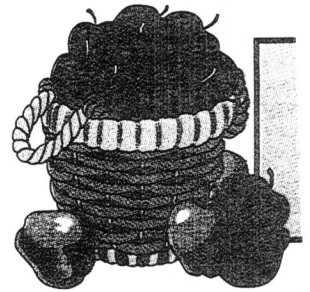
The council was told that the trail in Carver Bluffs Park is ready to be blacktopped. The grant is closing in on its completion date and the work needs to be completed this month.

Concern was voiced regarding the new trail being constructed so close to hunting area. The new Administrator will investigate this issue. The council will discuss options in the future.



Conditional Use Permit

Residents were present at the meeting to discuss the Conditional Use Permit. Concerns were voiced regarding outside storage, hours of business, excessive noise and odors. A Public Hearing was scheduled by motion for the Conditional Use Permit.



Fire Station

Options for a new fire station were reviewed by the council. Recommendation was submitted for a feasibility study. Inquiry was made regarding expanding the present station. The engineer was directed to meet with the Fire Department.

Fire Department

The Carver Fire Department's Comprehensive Plan was distributed to the council. The 1954 Chevy fire truck needs to be replaced.

Disclaimer

Preliminary minutes of City Council meetings were referenced to compose the "Villager Tower".

School District

Two representatives met with the council to discuss the School District's presentation and the referendum. The school district's theme is "Growing to Greatness". The Chaska School District is the third fastest growing school district in the state. A \$42.57 million dollar bond is being proposed to help finance more buildings and operations.

Carver Creek Environmental Corridor Trail

The engineer distributed "quotes" for an Environmental Assessment Statement on the trail. He also submitted a recommendation to hire Environmental Resource Group who was low bidder. Motion was made to hire Environmental Resource Group to complete an Environmental Assessment.

Discussion was held regarding land purchases, easements, land costs and problems involved in these varying areas. Property owner was willing to swap property if this was feasible. Motion was made to obtain necessary survey. Motion was also made to Land swap/purchase for necessary land for the trail. Motion was also made scheduling a Public Hearing to discuss vacating the Carver-Louisville Road.

Mt Hope Cemetery

Council discussed trees located in the Mt Hope Cemetery and possibly moving them to the rail road water tower area. The Lions would donate monies towards removal. The Park and Recreation Board should be included in the planning of this project.



Carver Lions Donations

The Lions have graciously agreed to finance the cost of upgrading the Lions Park parking lot. This would be detained until a decision was reached regarding the site for a new well, tower and filtration plant.

Thirty one trees have been planted at the community Park and Carver Bluffs Park. The Lions have also donated money towards this. The Lions have also discussed donating Christmas decorations for the downtown park area and after Christmas looking into purchasing of new decorations for the downtown streets.

There has also been discussions regarding re-designing the front of the Village Hall. The Heritage Preservation Commission will be contacted concerning this matter.


