

## "JAKE BRAKING" ORDINANCE

Administrator drafted an ordinance prohibiting jake braking. Carver County does not have similar ordinance. This type of use of brakes on trucks is difficult to enforce. A copy of the drafted ordinance should be sent to the Sheriff's office.

Jake braking is an accessory brake system which slows the motor down. Thereby, it slows the truck instead of using the conventional brakes shoes, creating break pressure by dampering the exhaust, forcing back compression. this process creates a low growling vibration sound from the engine.

Motion was made and carried adopting the ordinance "prohibiting Jake Braking" on County Road #40 within the City of Carver.

### TOWN LINE ROAD

Council discussed new fill on the west side of Town Line Road. A berm had been constructed to screen work site and the noise. Concerns were voiced regarding the height and close proximity to the road. Drainage was also discussed Safety concerns regarding kids was also voiced.

### THIRD STREET BRIDGE

The Council discussed the Third Street bridge issue with residents. The current bridge has been in place since 1912. Suggestion was submitted to replace the bridge with a covered walking bridge. If a culvert were constructed, would additional parking be available was also a point for discussion.

Replacement costs were relayed which included state contribution. Question was asked about water flow if changes were made. The issue was discussed. It was the experts' opinion that the bridge could last another ten to fifteen years. Which funds would be used to replace the bridge? Would taxes be increased? It was the city's hope to use tax increment funds. Traffic change was talked about, including the effect if this bridge were closed. This issue will be discussed further in the future.

# Herilage Preservation Commission

Motion was made and carried that the city allocate to the Heritage Preservation Commission (HPC) on a quarterly basis, an amount equal to fifty percent of the funds donated to the HPC by Building Inspections, Inc. The understanding is that any such new allocations would be over and above the amount previously budgeted for the HPC for the calendar year 2000.

### MUNICIPAL UTILITIES

At a meeting, the decision was made that Well #2 should be installed near the existing water tower.

### COMPUTER UPGRADE PROCESS

Administrator reported to the council that there had not been any Y2K problems. IBM computers have been installed. Network server and connecting computers are still required to be done. Developing a web site was discussed. It was the council's consensus to send the administrator to a seminar for web site set up.

### MISCELLANEOUS

A "STOP" sign at Sixth Street West and County Road #147 would not be considered at this time by the county. Traffic volume or accidents occurring at this site do not warrant a sign at this time.

Council "Organization Resolution" was reviewed and appointments made by motion for the year 2000.

The administrator had attended the commissioners' meeting regarding the City of Carver. The county's Comprehensive Plan is complete. Carver was asked to review the plan and return comments to the county commissioners.

Amphitheater issue is still up for discussion. The council would like to speak with the advocates of the venture, but have received no response. Attempts will continue to arrange a meeting.


