Fire Department

Chief Dauwalter reported that the new truck should be utilized as soon as training begins. It was also reported to the council that the DNR has removed the burning ban and that recreational fires are allowed.

Administrator and fire personnel have been meeting regarding the alcohol policy, which needs to be put into place. Inquiries for surrounding areas policy were discussed.

Discussion was held concerning storage needs of the Fire Department and the Public Works Department. Suggestion was submitted to construct a public works building that could also be utilized for fire equipment that eventually could be used as the fire department. Fire Department personnel stated that it was preferred to construct a new building to move into promptly. Administrator commented necessity for the Fire Departments input on their needs and the type of building. A solution needs to be presented, as the city's equipment needs interior storage soon. The Administrator, City Engineer and the Fire Department are to meet to discuss this issue and have concrete plans at the next meeting.

The council reviewed proposed ordinance regarding the Right of Way. The attorney recommended changes; therefore the issue was tabled until further work could be done on the ordinance.

Rewording had been completed on the ordinance regarding Right of Way. Motion was made and carried adopting ordinance.

Carver Bluffs

The council held a Public Hearing regarding the petition for annexation by Hans Hagen Homes. Administrator presented background on proposed annexation. Several residents were present for the Public Hearing. Hans Hagen explained some history on the subdivision as well as why the proposed annexed property had been replatted to comply with their product. The developer has received concept approval. Upon annexation of property, they will need preliminary plat and final plat approval.

The Township Board was not in approval of annexation on part of the property between County Road #40 and the described valley area. Inquiry was made about plans for connecting the two areas by road. The developer explained that there would not be a road, but the valley would be open space and is an integral part of the drainage for the area.

Explanation was given that the township cannot stop annexation of sixty acres of land per year if a property owner requests annexation. Dahlgren Board representative expressed that it was the board's consensus that they had not been told everything that is occurring on said property. The developer stated that they would attend the board meeting to explain the process more clearly.

Motion was made and carried to adopt ordinance to annex certain lands into the corporate city limits.

Public Works Department

The Public Works Superintendent requested the purchase of a trailer to haul equipment. The present trailer is too small and the sale would be used towards the purchase of a larger one. Motion was made and carried to allow the purchase of a larger trailer for the Public Works Department.

Chaska Township

Property owner approached the city with questions regarding property located in the Chaska Township. The area involves approximately 112 acres. Rumor expressed interest in the property by the Cities of Chaska and Carver. It was explained that usual policy is that the property owner approaches governmental units with proposals.

Water Tower

If you are interested in purchasing an authentic piece of the Historic Railroad Water Tower removed from its tank bottom during its restoration in 1997-1998 stop in at the Village Hall. The wood you will purchase is Tidewater Red Cypress aged at approximately 350 years old.

The Minneapolis and St Louis Railroad came to Carver in 1871. This is Carver's second Railroad Water Tower as the first one burned down around 1900. It is believed that Carver's Railroad Water Tower may be the only one left in the United States that is still in its original location.

The restoration project was funded by donations, the City of Carver and the Minnesota State Historical society's Grants-in-Aid Fund. City personnel, volunteers and Tom Diethelm Builders completed the project.

The Carver Water Tower branding iron was designed and donated to this project by Schilz Ornamental Iron.

By purchasing this piece of history, the funds received will help to ensure its continued care and maintenance.

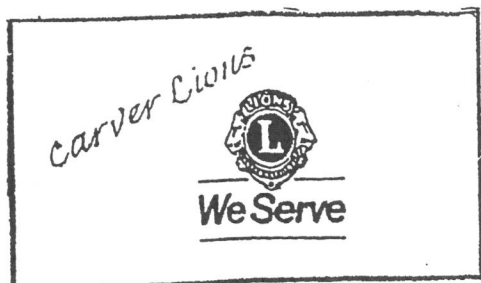
