

On Tuesday, January 3rd the Carver community lost Paul Reimer. His commitment to Baseball and to the Youth of Carver will be greatly missed Paul was very dedicated to the youth of our community and worked hard to ensure that they will have a place to play, for their community and to be proud of Carver. He always had the food stand open for our games. His hamburgers will be greatly missed. They were worth waiting for.

State Senator Ortman

The City of Carver was informed that State Senator Ortman commented that she was proud of what had been accomplished at the last legislative session. There were no specifics, only generalities; she listed several changes in areas made and problems that had been dealt with. An invitation was extended to the council to visit at the capitol or to send a representative. Question was asked regarding education funding. The city was dealing with the Metropolitan Council and directed the administrator to keep the senator informed of issues.

Fire Department

The fire chief requested approval to purchase radios, air packs and hoses to equip newest acquired fire truck. The council was informed that the department has drafted a ten-year Capital Improvement Plan. The equipment has been budgeted for this year and should be ordered prior to price increases. Motion was made and carried approving expenditure for equipment.

The chief spoke with the council regarding the Capital Improvement Plan and the necessity for another tanker truck. Availability of a truck was discussed. Reminder was made that the townships require to kept informed of situations. The department has been attempting to achieve replacement life of trucks for twenty five years.

Did You Know

...that Captain herman Muehlberg (1833-1911) of Carver served in the MN Fifth Infantry during the Civil War and in 1893 was appointed Adjutant General of the State of MN He was the editor of the Carver Free Press newspaper from 1884-1897, which was printed on East Fourth Street in Carver.

Truth In Taxation

Resident inquired about taxes on their home in the older area of the city in comparison to the newer homes in the newer developed areas. Their taxes are the same. The council informed the property owner that the hearing was about taxes not property values. The county assessor could answer questions regarding values on property.

Sanitation Services

The city held a Public Hearing regarding sanitation services within the city to limit these services to only one company within the city limits The city attorney informed that council that a resolution would be required to be passed and then an hundred and eighty day waiting and planning period before the change could be implemented. There were several companies present to discuss the issue with the council. A representative from the National Solid Waste Association informed the council of their opposition to such an idea because more than one company encourages competitive pricing and service. Suggestion was submitted to form a task force to review the issue weighing the pros and cons. There was discussion relating to truck weights and different types of trucks. Wear and tear on streets was asked about. Another company representative pointed out that there were no citizens present at the meeting demonstrating there was no dissatisfaction with services and questioned policy change idea. The council was encouraged to discuss these issues with the services prior to taking any type of action. It was stated that one company was of the impression that steps had been taken to meet council standards and weight citations had not been issued in either 2004 or 2005. Another company expressed the importance of service given to customers and the company's accountability.

The attorney pointed out the importance of timelines, current licenses expirations and possible necessary amendment required to ordinance. A task force should be formed with two members from the council, the staff and consultants in order to make an informed decision. Two council members volunteered to serve on a task force committee and the attorney would draft a resolution for the council's reviewal

....that in September 1882 the Carver merchant firm of Peterson and Holms on Broadway added a twelve foot addition to their store, making it the largest General Store in Carver County.

Spring Creek Drive

MN DOT requested both Carver and Chaska to submit a name for the portion of the existing Highway #212 west of the existing Mt Hope Road and east of the new Spring Creek Drive, which will be constructed with the Spring Creek Plat. Both cities will have to agree on a name. The Planning Commission recommendation was Spring Creek Drive. There had been initial discussions with the staff in Chaska and it appeared to not be a problem. The council made the motion, which carried with all ayes supporting naming the stretch of highway Spring Creek Drive.

Athletic Director

The city administrator informed the council of allocated monies for 2006 for the purposes of a part-time, athletic director. The Park and Recreation Board would be required to advertise for this position in order to begin setting up scheduling requirements for the parks as soon as possible. Motion was made and carried to advertise for a part-time athletic director per administrator's recommendation. The administrator questioned whether or not the position should be handled as a consultant rather than a city employee as well as the title to read coordinator versus director. The attorney stated that the individual would be an employee because of the necessity for liability insurance.

Vacancy

Council member submitted a resignation letter to the council. Resignation was accepted by motion. The council reviewed the fact that there were still four applications remaining from previous council member appointment. It was the council's consensus that these applicants should be contacted to inquire interest concerning newest vacancy.

The council interviewed candidates for the council vacancy. Motion was made and carried to appoint Mary Williamson to the council for the 2006 year.

Did You Know

....that in June 1882 Carver Builder Olaf Hanson purchased a lot in Carver and began constructing a family residence for himself on Main Street . Olaf Hanson had a hand in building many of Carver's residences and even constructed such well known Carver buildings as the Church-By-The-River, Trinity Lutheran Church, and the Neunsinger Hotel, which once sat on the site of present-day City Hall.

South West Metro Expo

On January 28th at the Chaska High School located on Pioneer Drive will be a SouthWest Metro Expo. Appears that the main theme will involve Bridal, Home, Garden and More. Also appears some businesses expected to be seen involve Oak Ridge, Quality Heating and Air Services, and GlenRosé Floral and you can bet more local businesses will be expected to attend. You know how the fire departments and the cities ask you to keep the snow cleared at the fire hydrants located throughout the city? Well, you know what the US Postal Service has that same request too. So please be kind and shovel in front of the mailbox for the mail carrier to deliver your mail.

Main Street Lift Station

The city engineer and the city council reviewed the bids received and discussed the issue of the Main Street Lift Station and Utility Improvements. Bids received were high. The staff discussed removal of the building and replacing the building with a trailer mounted generator. The council was given the option of accepting the bid and eliminating the building by change order or rejecting the bids to rebid without the building. The attorney stated that without a building the noise level would exceed the noise standards established. Council member inquired about changing the location of the lift station. The issue would be researched further.

The council further reviewed the topic of the bid results and awarding the project or not. The council discussed bidding for separate bids for the generator and removal of the building. Since the cost of the construction of a building was so high it was the council consensus that approving construction was not a good idea. Motion was made and carried rejecting all bids and to rebid the project. The mayor reminded the council that the citizens were told a building would be constructed and it would be a mistake not to do said action. Because of the cost the council was not in agreement. The engineer suggested bidding with the building as an alternate portion of the bid. The council agreed to bid the generators and the building as alter-

Spring Creek Lift Station

The engineer reported that the lift station had been planned for with the capital improvement plan for the areas in the northwest corner of the city limits. This station would accommodate the proposed developments of Spring Creek and the Spring Creek Grove plats. The estimated costs were discussed. The engineer proposed bidding the project this winter and having the system operational by the fall of 2006. Motion was made and carried with all ayes authorizing the engineer to draft plans and specifications for the Spring Creek area lift station.

Sky View Lane Improvements

The council reviewed the SkyView Lane Street and Utility Improvements assessment roll. There was an issue with one property requiring resolution. Motion was made and carried amending the assessment roll to illustrate a credit issued. Motion was made and carried adopting the resolution accepting the assessments for SkyView Lane Improvements.

The council discussed the topic of Special Assessment Deferral Resolution. The city attorney drafted a resolution involving the allowance of residents who met the statutory criteria for the Mt Hope and SkyView Lane Improvement projects to defer assessments. Motion was made and carried adopting the resolution accepting deferred assessment policy for the projects.

Hans Hagen Homes Hans Hagen Homes representative discussed

with the council the escrow funds for park dedications for Carver Bluffs West. The Developer's Agreements were reviewed. Request was submitted to release the escrow for Park Dedication to Hans Hagen Homes. The attorney pointed out the discrepancy referring to the resolution stating that Carver Bluffs Central park dedications were paid, but Carver Bluffs West were not part of the Carver Bluffs Central Agreements. The attorney pointed out that the dedication of Outlot "A" had never been made to the city and recently had been sold to the Fish and Wildlife Service. The mayor requested and suggested that Hans Hagen Homes review these issues and schedule resolution with the city attorney.

Municipal Utilities

The administrator reviewed with the council's letters that had been forwarded to property owners regarding municipal utilities connection as required by the ordinance. One owner had not connected but has paid all of the charges. The attorney was concerned about the cost and it was his opinion that it may be more cost effective to pursue the issue later. Motion was made and carried to take action presently to enforce the ordinance pursuing connection to the municipal utilities.

Did You Know

....that in late 1867 hotel proprietor Charles A Blomquist installed a billiard hall in the basement of his recently purchased Carver House Hotel, which once sat on the present-day site of Carver's Gazebo Park.

Metropolitan Council

The council reviewed letters received from the Metropolitan Council. The council also reviewed a drafted letter to the Metropolitan Council regarding issued directed to the city. The city attorney discussed comments pertaining to the interceptor for the city from the Metropolitan Council with questions concerning who would build it, who would fund it and the like. The explanation concerning the hearing request for Dahlgren Township Systems Statement was briefed. The attorney commented on the encounter regarding population numbers in disagreement with the Metropolitan Council's. Motion was made and carried authorizing the attorney to commence litigation against the Metropolitan Council to compel System Statement review hearing unless an acceptable compromise on Carver and Dahlgren Township System Statements can be reached.

Park and Recreation Board

The Park and Recreation Board are seeking volunteers to serve on the board for the park and recreation issues for the City of Carver. There are a lot of things happening throughout the area requiring special attention. Your input is needed. The newest item to be checked out is the trail systems throughout the city and the parks for the new developments. The challenges are well under way. Responsibility assumed as a board member are advisory in nature, advising the city council of issues involving development, management, operation and maintenance of existing and proposed future park areas within the city. If you are interested in being part of this passage of history within your community, please contact Dianne at the Village Hall. She will set you up with an application and give you the times and dates of the Park and Recreation Board meetings. The board meets the second Monday of each month. The board is also seeking to hire a skating rink attendant on a part-time basis. Contact city hall for more information.

Comprehensive Plan Work Group

The Tollefson Developers presented a neighborhood Master Plan to the Comprehensive Plan Work Group and audience. There was discussion of proposal involving approximately 1654 acres with a total of proposed housing units of three thousand plus varying types of housing. The proposal lists ten miles of trails and sidewalks and open space of three hundred thirty four acres. The developer referred to the proposal as a 'Traditional Neighborhood Development'. They are proposing a community center, senior center, major park area, school, athletic complex and retail. The developer reminded that these are conceptual plans. The anticipated timeline is 2008 to begin and approximately ten years to develop. A number of properties have been included in the Alternate Urban Area Review proposal.

....that on MN Statehood Day, May 11, 1858 the Townships of Benton, Carver, Chanhassen, Chaska, Farmington, Laketown, SanFrancisco and Waconia were organized.


