

### "Open Book"

The City Council held the Board of Appeal and Equalization Meeting at the Village Hall. County representatives explained to the council consideration a meeting called an "Open Book". This involved the cities agreeing to being bypassed in property valuation issues and the county being directly contacted. The city would have until the end of the year to make a decision and would be required to pass a resolution. The county would be given at least two years with this system, if at that time the city would like to participate again in the Appeal and Equalization process it would be turned back to the city.

Spring Creek

The engineer informed the council that as a result of discussions with Xcel Energy and other consultants, it was determined that the costs of burying power lines along the old Highway and the new county road increased significantly. Recommendation was submitted to modify the Letter of Credit reductions and retain money to cover the additional expense involved. Motions were made and carried with all ayes and approving amended Letters of Credits for Glen at Spring Creek development and Spring Creek.

### Certified Local Government

The city planner informed the council that the city had been approved to receive an additional Certified Local Government funding to complete the survey project. The council needed to accept the additional funding, formally approve the additional match amount, authorize the execution of necessary contracts and award the project to the 106 Group, Inc. Motion was made and carried with all ayes approving the additional funding, authorizing the mayor to execute documents and amend and approve the grant agreement and award the project to the 106 Group, Inc. The council approved the contract with the 106 Group authorizing the execution of the contract for an architectural history survey.

Metropolitan Council Environmental Fire Department

#### Gervices

The council participated in a walking tour of the proposed construction area of the Metropolitan Council Environmental Services line and review probable improvements with the project. The electric company would be contacted for information relating to burying wires. Questions were asked concerning overlay of right-of-way, driving areas, and boulevards. There was discussions that there should be conversations with the county regarding mainten ance on sections of County Road #40, especially within the city and east of Broadway.

#### Public Works

The public works director informed the council that the c ity has received some pumps from the Department of Defense. The City of East Grand Forks had been contacted because they have the same pumps. A Public Works Department employee had brought down a set of hoses and fittings for the City of Carver to test the used equipment before spending money on parts. Suggestion was made to thank the department for this gesture of courtesy for quite a valuable offering for testing purposes. Councilmember recommended forwarding a letter of gratitude to the City of East Grand Forks.

#### Well Number # Four

The city engineer reviewed information on the search for a water tower site. A slide presentation on the proposed location and benefits of the site were given to the council. Location, costs, and construction were all reviewed. The discussions would continue on the site for well number four.
