

Board of Appeal and Equalization

The council discussed the adoption of a resolution that would give the county the authorization to conduct the Board of Appeal and Equalization process. Motion was made and carried with all ayes adopting the resolution authorizing Carver County to be the Board of Appeal And Equalization for the City of Carver.

Liquor License Fees

The city administrator informed the council of the necessity to schedule a Public Hearing to increase the Liquor License Fees per previous discussions in budget meetings. Motion was made and carried with all ayes adopting the resolution notifying owners of the hearing to increase liquor license fees.

City Hall

The city administrator addressed questions regarding the City Hall relocation. It was the administrator's opinion that a new city hall would no longer be necessary until possibly 2010 with the decrease in growth. This would also mean that additional staff would not be required either. Two additional staff requirements prior to that date would not require a new location. Ehlers and Associates had prepared financial options for a new proposed City Hall facility.

Parking requirements were discussed. Comment was made that variances could be granted for parking requirements. Question was asked of the church parking lot being utilized. An agreement could be drafted to use that parking lot. Statement was made that the ordinance parking requirements call for one hundred fifteen parking spots, but there are only fifty one available spaces. The city planner expressed her understanding for the council's frustrations with the ordinances. The city attorney pointed out that the ordinance could be changed but some traffic studies would be required. Question was asked whether or not a Conditional Use Permit could be issued? It was one council member's opinion that the ordinance should be reviewed and updated. An informal vote was requested favoring the school location for a city hall. The council wanted more answers. Motion was made and carried with three ayes and one nay directing the engineer to draft proposal for square footage plans updating the city hall to an up to date functioning city hall. One council member expressed question of why a building could not be constructed on property already owned by the city. Remin-der was given of the necessity for construction of a bridge to access property. The Task Force recommended the school therefore the council was obligated to review their recommendation. Since this was a serious investment, it made more sense to consider an existing structure.

Fire Department

The Fire Department 's Open House was again a huge success the firemen reported. They thank all of the folks who came out and helped make the event possible.

The Department is still recruiting new members. Anyone interest-ed in serving their community and giving a little back can pick up an application at the city hall or calling the fire department at 952) 448-2290.

Heritage Preservation Commission

The Heritage Preservation Commission expressed interest in applying for the Certified Local Government grant to update the design guidelines and requested the council's input. Motion was made and carried with three ayes and one nay to allow the Heritage Preservation Commission to apply for the Certified Local Government grant. These guidelines require updating to allow the commission to review building changes and work requested. The city planner informed the council that it was her hope to have revisions for the Historic District Ordinance to the council very soon.

Town Hall

The Dahlgren Township Board met to discuss three proposed locations for the construction of a new town hall. One lot measured three fourths of an acre and the other two parcels were two acre sites. Fill would be required on the two acre sites and removal of an existing structure would be necessary on the other site. The informal consensus of the individuals in attendance agreed on the two acre parcel on at the Maplewood Road site. Bids for costs would be necessary along with a civil engineer and architectural costs. The two, two acre sites would be reviewed further and another meeting scheduled. Costs, blue prints, design and water management issues would all be researched.

Comprehensive Plan

The Carver County representative from the County Planning and Water Management office was at the Dahlgren Township Board meeting to review the 2030 Comprehensive Plan and Dahlgren Township Policy Chapter. They discussed the township land use policy options, transitions areas, orderly annexation, economic development, rail corridor, national resources, golf courses, feed lots, historic preservation and transportation issues.

# Sally Foster Fundraiser

Do you know what the Sally Foster Fundraiser event is? Many of you probably do and there are some who have not a clue what this is about. First of all, it involves the students at the East Union Elementary School. Sally Foster is an organization that donates revenue portions to the school for the students who have made efforts to sell items to the parents, grandparents, friends, strangers, etc in the school district. The students will go door to door (relative to relative) soliciting to present the packet of goodies for us to buy. In this instance, the East Union students are selling gift wrap, assorted items, candies, nuts and the like. Guess what they are learning? Public Relations, salesmanship, communications, and oh so much more. The fundraiser deliveries will be coming November 9th. So all those goodies you ordered to help out the school will be arriving shortly. Good job kids.

#### Harmony Development

The Park and Recreation Board were presented with a plan from Tollefson regarding a Harmony development. The developers would like to construct a community center in the development. The developers were seeking input from the city on ownership of this proposal. Question was asked about a school in the area. The school district expressed interest constructing a school, but locations have not been confirmed. The developers were looking at approximately 2012 for the completion of a center and the use of the center as a marketing tool for selling property. Statement was made that if the developer built the center and the HomeOwners Association maintained the facility then the city would not have any control over the issue. Question was asked if the city agreed to ownership at a much later date what would the effect be? If the center were to be used as a marketing tool then acceptance of ownership too far out date wise would not be wise.

Concerns of a Homeowners Association owning a center involved it being controlled by the group, then there was the possibility of competition were the city to decide to construct a center at a later date and the competition of programming, not having access for the Park and Recreation Board. Plus the fact of an association ownership does not create the ambience of community for residents. Another option could be private entities partnering in ownership. The YMCA might be interested in a proposal with the city. Lifetime Fitness probably would not be interested due to the demographics of the area but was not improbable.

The city planner pointed out that one thousand eight hundred homes were proposed for this development. The idea of exploring private partnership was suggested. A Joint Powers Agreement was another option.

#### SkateBoard Park

The Park and Recreation Board members discussed the new skate park. Suggestion was made that possibly some pieces may be required to be moved for improvement of the flow and age groups. Age equipment requirements were questioned, as well as whether or not adult supervising was or was not necessary.

Legacy
The Legacy donation program was introduced to the Park and Recombers. This program is for city's parks systems. Donations can be accepted for items listed on the application brochure. A specific park can be named by the donator or the city can decide. Uniformity in the park system was attempted to be consistent. Disposal cans were not added since it was considered inappropriate if memorial plaques were going to be utilized.


#### MN Department of Natural Resources Grant

The requested for the proposal would be presented to the council.


