

Elected Officers

The Mayor at the first official meeting of the 2009 year swore in council members Webb and Newhouse as council members. Congratulations extended to the newest members.

Heritage Preservation Commission 2008 Award

Statement was made that the Heritage Preservation Commission Award has been given three times to date. The award for 2008 is the second presentation for Gregg and Meg Witt for building restorations. The mayor extended thanks on behalf of the City of Carver for their continued interest and investment in the city. The city sees improvement each year thanks to their efforts. Comment was also extended that the downtown restoration looks wonderful.

Lyle Wood Glen

A representative from the Committee for the LyleWood Glen development was present at the council meeting to give an update on their progress. Homeowners Association has made great strides in resolving debt issues. The water bill was discussed. The Homeowners Association requested that water service be reinstated to the common area and the association would be responsible from this day forward. The common area needs irrigation and seeding in springtime.

The association was of the opinion that the city held a Certificate of Occupancy for a home due to an unpaid water bill. The attorney explained that the city does not have that authority. Dues have been paid and the water bill will have to be assessed against homes in the subdivision because the issue in dispute involves usage in the common area. It was the attorney's opinion that an agreement could be reached with the lenders regarding this issue. The staff was directed to research the issue and comprise a solution.

The attorney also discussed resuming discussions concerning securing structures in the development. Some of the structures have been secured. Statement was also made that at this time there is no recourse for attempting to resolve the unpaid water bill by the developer or the management company.

Highway #41

The council inquired about the overall response to MNDot's choice as the preferred alternative for crossing the river, which will be recommended for the Final Environmental Impact Statement for the Highway #41 project. The city planner stated that many were relieved that there were still ways to interject modifications the route.

Council member inquired about the River Bluffs Estates development in relation to the present determination of the route to cross the river. At the time of still determining a route, an extension had been granted relating to issues. The administrator was now directed to research the item.

Main Street Bridge

Council member inquired about the engineer's notation concerning the Main Street Bridge replacement. The engineer explained that the design work on the plans will be submitted in January to MNDot for their review. Once they approve, the project would then be put on a waiting list for funding. Bridge bond funding is not available until 2010. He also explained that most of the cost would be a county expense. The council was not surprised to hear that the completion of this project would not coincide with the other project. The balance of the project and the bridge completion can all be scheduled for a later date.

Miscellaneous

The engineer was asked about the work being done on evaluations of the flood plain elevations. This work was scheduled to be completed last year, but nothing has been submitted regarding reevaluations. Some information has been gathered and would be forwarded to one of the council members.

Question was asked about the date of usage for the new water tower. The answer was not readily available at the time of the question. Completion date on the agreement would have to be referred to. That answer would also be forwarded to the council member.

Metropolitan Council Environmental Services

The city attorney discussed the amendment to the Carver/Metropolitan Council Environmental Services Agreement. The Metropolitan Council requests delay to the easterly interceptor construction, in order to explore possibilities of construction in the Union Pacific right of way. The attorney reviewed the proposed Amendment #1 involving the Construction Cooperation Agreement relating to the construction of the new interceptor and the lift station. The Metropolitan Council is experiencing difficulties obtaining the required easements in a cost effective way in the area on both sides of the Chaska/Carver border. Therefore, Metropolitan Council Environmental Services wants to split the project into two phases. The proposed amendment involves some technical issues regarding easements, bidding procedures and pre-qualifications of bidders.

The Metropolitan Council will not agree to a deadline by which it must make a determination as to the location of the easterly portion of the interceptor and the lack of a deadline for a decision is a significant concern to the city. The attorney commented that it was to the best interest of the city to get the project moving forward and this amendment would allow the construction of the lift station and the portion of the interceptor funning from the existing wastewater treatment plant to the new lift station. Motion was made and carried with all ayes approving Amendment Number #1 to the Construction Cooperation Agreement, Chaska West Interceptor Phase 2, Carver Interceptor.

Annexation

The council discussed approval of the proposed orderly annexation agreement with Dahlgren Township. The city attorney answered questions from the council. There was discussion of whether or not a property was included in this annexation. The property in question was not the entire property. Another discussion involved property that was not covered in the Comprehensive Plan. The city planner stated that the Comprehensive Plan would be required to be updated in the future to include this area. Motion was made and carried with all ayes adopting the joint resolution for orderly annexation between the township of Dahlgren and the City of Carver.

Dahlgren Township received the final copy of the agreement for their approval. After the township votes, the City of Carver will schedule a Public Hearing to discuss the agreement. On motion, opposed by one township supervisor that the agreement be accepted except for any land west of Country Road #43.

The city administrator updated the council on the orderly annexation process. Motion was made and carried scheduling a special joint meeting with Dahlgren Township on February 11th at the Church-By-The-River.

Union Pacific Railroad

The city attorney told the council that it appeared that the Union Pacific right of way property was originally conveyed to the Minneapolis and St. Louis Railway Company on May 1, 1875 by two private individuals with the last name Griffin. The tract index at the Carver County Recorder's Office showed no encumbrances or easements of record as burdening the Union Pacific right of way property from 1875 forward to 2008. There is no easement of record against the Union Pacific right of way property in favor of the City for the Levee.

The City lots where the Levee is currently located were platted in 1857. The Plat shows not only the lots and blocks in the Plat, but also the streets and other areas dedicated to the public. Specifically, the Plat contains an area marked "Levee" just south and east of the southeastern most lots and blocks in the Plat in the area adjacent to Mile Post: 36:17, which Levee description follows along the entire embankment of the Minnesota River. The grantors of the Plat specifically state on the face of the Plat that they "donate all the land designated on said Plat as streets, alleys, avenues, Public Square, Courthouse Square and Levee to the use and benefit of the public." Unfortunately, it appears that since 1857 the River has migrated from its original position such that the River itself now encroaches across the area originally platted as the Levee and onto the lots in the Plat in the area of Mile Post: 36:17. As a result, there remains no dry land once designated as "Levee", benefiting the public in the area of Mile Post: 36:17.

Because there is no easement in favor of the City for the Levee, the City has no property interest of record in the Union Pacific right of way property. The City does have permission from the Union Pacific to maintain, improve and use the Levee on the Union Pacific right of way property indefinitely; however that permission is revocable at any time. Mr. Harris gave some arguments the City can make in an attempt to gain a specific property right in the Union Pacific right of way property, or to defend its Levee if the Union Pacific or subsequent property owner demands ejection or otherwise attempts to cut off the City's use. The update given to the council was for informational purposes only and no action from the council was required.

Liaison Appointments

The council discussed liaison positions for 2009. Motion was made and carried adopting resolution amended with liaison position for 2009. The Heritage Preservation Commission liaison reported that they met with a consultant who will be drafting the updated design guidelines for the historic district.

Fire Department

The Fire Chief gave the council an update of projects. This included the finalizing departmental inspection sheets that will be forwarded to business owners, daycares and multi-unit housing structures. The Fire Department will be conducting on site visits in 2009 with each to complete their fire safety plans and reviews. The chief also talked of the new emergency management plan, which is proposed for late March, and public education classes being finalized for 2009. Question was asked how the site inspections would affect historic structures. The procedures were explained.

The new Emergency Management Plan is scheduled for late March and Public Education Classes are being finalized for 2009. Council member requested a comprehensive list of mandated and nonmandated issues handled by the Fire Department. The fire chief stated that he would compile the requested list.

City of Carver -Residents and businesses are reminded to clear the snow away from fire hydrants near their property. During the winter months, hydrants can become buried under snow and ice making them very difficult to find.

Precious time is lost when our crews respond to a fire but have to first locate the hydrant, and then dig away the snow while the fire continues burn. to

It takes only five to seven minutes for a house to become completely engulfed in flames, so when we are responding to an emergency, every minute counts. It really can mean a matter of life or death.

Taking a few moments to remove the snow after every snowfall will ensure hydrants are visible and accessible to firefighters; the time saved in not having to search for and dig out hydrants could mean the difference between life and death in a fire emergency.
