Dahlgren Township Board

The Land Use Plan from the 2010 Carver County Comprehensive Plan will be discussed further at a later meeting.

Water Rates

The council discussed the water rates issue at the work session held. Financial consultants representative presented the Utility Rate Studies and the council discussed the contents. Options that could be incorporated in the various tier systems were explored by the council. Installation of a separate meter for irrigation systems were reviewed. Comment was made that the council might need to step back and reassess exactly what goals were being attempted to be accomplished. The process was becoming too complicated.

Sammy's Hide Out Patio

The council discussed the complaints received regarding issues relating to the downtown business. One item reviewed was the agreement reached concerning the patio area relating to noise. Complaints have been received. Owner relayed attempts to contain and restrict the noise. It was established that when the doors are open there are people outside and it is loud. Security has been retained to ensure the doors are closed at 10 PM. The bands are told to turn the volume down.

Statement was made regarding the significant changes observed with new ownership.

Question was asked if there was amplification used on the patio. The owner relayed that only voice amplified. The council reiterated that there was no amplification permitted on the patio. Request was made that the doors be closed prior to 10 PM if a band is entertaining. Restrictions were placed on the establishment involving doors are to be closed when there is music, no amplification allowed on the patio and patrons who go outside to smoke are prohibited from having beverages outside.

Carver Liquor Store

The council reviewed complaints received regarding the patio area adjacent to the business. Complaints have been received regarding noise and people gathering on the patio. The Sheriff's Department was apprised that the State had also been involved and investigated the situation. It was established that the business is closed at 10 PM. Question was asked about selling and drinking alcohol on the patio. Response was given that this is not occurring. People gathering on the patio are friends and neighbors. This was not an issue unless a law was being broken. The mayor pointed out the perception is 'something is wrong' even if there is nothing wrong. Complaints received are intoxicated individuals.

Establishment closes at 10 PM. The city attorney pointed out that the city ordinance states that "no person can consume liquor in any such place of business." There is not a residential component associated with the business on the property. The entire property is the licensed property.

2008 Audit

The council reviewed with the representative from Abdo, Eick & Meyers that the audit report for the city for 2008 was good and internal controls are improving. Reserve for the General Fund has increased. The firm is also handling the Fire Relief Audit. Motion was made and carried with all ayes accepting the 2008 city audit.

Minnesota Valley Electric Cooperative

A representative from MN Valley Electric Cooperative spoke with the council regarding future electric rates and future changes expected. Capacity, affordability, technology and jobs were all talked about. Individuals were encouraged to contact legislators about being conscientious involving energy decisions.

League of MN Cities Insurance Trust

The city was briefed on the renewal for city insurance. There was a possibility of an increase in premium. Motion was made and carried with all ayes to waive the monetary limits on the Municipal Tort Liability.

The council was also updated on a new service offered by the League of MN Cities Insurance Trust. Money can be borrowed from the Trust if a city member experiences an unforeseen hardship or catastrophe. Money would be required to be paid back, but the service is available at no additional premium to the city.

Fire Department

The Fire Department would like to begin the process for hiring additional fire fighters. Thirty two fire fighters are permitted. The Department presently has twenty three active fire fighters. The department will begin efforts to recruit fire fighters.


Harvest Festival Location Map




