At the Dahlgren Township meeting the board was presented with the final version of the township's 2030 Comprehensive Plan. A Public meeting had been held approving the plan.

The board discussed a new town hall proposal. One of the board members has offered to sketch plans and if the plans are approved an engineer will be completing blue prints. The board reviewed the availability of a pre-existing build-ing potential. Further research would be done.

Request was presented to the council to erect a street sign on what is now classified as a partial private street. Presently, it is difficult to locate the residence without identification in place. The city attorney stated that the Carver County Emergency Management office needs to be contacted for solution and input. The sheriff's office should be involved as well in communications. Council is to be updated on resolutions.

The gravel pit was created by Outwash from a retreating glacier, one of many that covered Minnesota during the last Ice Age some 10,000 years ago. ...that the land for Mt Hope Cemetery in Carver was pur-chased a round 1855 from Frederick Greiner, who from 1854-56 was h omesteading a farm site between Carver and Chaska. Frederick Greiner in November 1855 was elected Carver County Sheriff, replacing Carver's Levi Griffin.

Fire Department

The Fire Department has an opportunity to acquire a boat from the DNR requiring some repairs but the value of the boat outweighs repair costs. The council consensus was to accept this boat from the DNR and accepted costs for repairs.

The department has also requested to go out for bids for a replacement fire truck. This issue was discussed at the Fire Equipment Committee meeting informing the council that the city is not required to accept any bids received. The city attorney was asked to review bid specifications. Motion was made and carried with all ayes to go out for bids for a replacement fire truck.

Public Works Department

The public works director requested purchasing flood pump hose couplings for the water pumps received in the past. These pumps came without discharge or intake hoses. The capital equipment fund has enough funds to equip both pumps. The director recommended outfitting them with reports of high flooding potential. These pumps are backup to the electric flood pumps in place. If there were a power outage these pumps can be put into service. Motion was made and carried with all ayes to outfit both

Park and Recreation Department

The Park and Recreation Department supervisor requested to explore the purchase of two privately owned parcels in the area of RiverSide Park. Request was also posed to ap-prove contacting two property owners. Two parcels are sur-rounded by park land and bordered by the Minnesota River The purchase of these parcels would make RiverSide Park one contiguous piece of park property. Prior to purchase council approval would be sought. Motion was made and carried with all ayes approving staff to research acquisition of private property in RiverSide Park.

Senator Appropriation Request

The League of MN Cities contacted the staff of the city regarding a request from Senator Franken's office. The con-tent involved the senator's plans to request federal funding for local projects for the 2011 fiscal year appropriations process. This request for funds must channel through the Senator's website by the beginning of March this year. Motion was made and carried with all ayes approving submittal of an appropriations application to the senator's office.

# Walkable Communities Work Shop

The council reviewed a presentation concerning Walkable Communities Workshop' with Carver County Public Health representative and the Parks and Recreation Department supervisor. After the presentation, council member inquired about the identified issues with some of the paths and walkways and the expectations of the council. The supervisor commented that is this a guide so that funds can be put aside to upgrade the trail systems. Discussion was held that commissions be utilized more to investigate and formulate solutions. The core city has more issues and is older. The Park board would prioritize and seek solutions Connections lacked in the trail system from the downtown area to the subdivisions.

The county's representative stated that if the city prioritized there may be better funding opportunities for the city. Comment was submitted that the Planning Commission and the Park Board work together and formulate recommendation to submit to the council. The city attorney advised caution to the council prioritizing unless as funds become available the repairs and/or construction occurs in the order of the prioritization.

## Municipal Utilities

The Public Utilities supervisor requested authorization to purchase inspection camera for service sewer lines. This camera has a locator so that lines can be followed, located, recorded and downloaded for permanent record. A warranty is valid for three years. Motion was made and carried with all ayes approving purchase of the Pro Cam. Request was also made to the council a uthorizing beginning the hiring process for a utility service worker. The mayor commented that it was his goal if this process could wait until an administrator was hired. The supervisor agreed but would want an individual in place as early as May. Motion was made and carried with all ayes allowing the public utilities superintendent to post for hiring a public utilities employee.

The council continued discussing costs, review plan authorization and repainting of the water tower. Additional information had been requested regarding repainting the water towers. One council member was of the impression that the decision had been made to wait a year. It was the superintendent's opinion that the bidding climate was good presently. Liability was reviewed. Financing and painting were discussed. It was the council's consensus to wait a nother year to paint the internal and exterior of the water tower.

# Change Order Procedures

The council reviewed the process of reviewing change orders. The city engineer submitted several options for revising the procedures utilized in this process. One thought was to conduct special work sessions prior to meetings to review change orders. The attorney stated that there already was a change orders dispute. The attorney recommended assigning a liaison of two council members. Question was asked if these two members could call for a special meeting. Motion was made and carried with all ayes to appoint two members to be a part of a change order task force for the utilities project to meet at regularly scheduled meeting time coordinating schedules. Motion was made and carried with all ayes appointing two council members to the change order review committee. Motion was made and carried with all ayes approving change order and pay request to S.M. Hentges for the Carver Interceptor – Segment A project.

#### Bloodmobile

The Bloodmobile is scheduled to be in Carver on Tuesday, April 20th. They will offering their services from noon until 6 PM. The Bloodmobile is open to anyone sixteen (16) years or older. However, parental consent is necessary for young adult age sixteen years old. Sixteen and seventeen year olds are also required to meet height and weight guidelines.

Union Pacific

The council was asked to approve or deny the recommendations submitted by the Heritage Preservation Commission regarding the Union Pacific Abandonment issue. The Union Pacific abandonment is currently in the Section 106 review process. The Heritage Preservation Commission reviewed the issue and submitted their recommendations and comments. The Surface Transportation Board (STB) contacted the City of Carver asking for the city's response to the committee's recommendations. The council was told that the STB will be determining if there is an adverse impact with the abandonment issue in within the Carver Historic District, as well as attempting to negotiate mitigation to be included in the programmatic agreement between the STB and the Minnesota State Historic Preservation Office.

The council was informed that if they were in agreement to the Heritage Preservation Commission's recommendation that the council should not only stipulate their agreement but that conditions recommended are incorporated into the programmatic agreement without exclusions. And that the entire bridge over the MN River be removed so that there are no obstructions. Furthermore allowing the city additional time to conduct further evaluation regarding the remainder of the tracks in place next to Depot Park. Further discussion occurred regarding the bridge being built into the levee and demolition of the bridge resulting in any damage to the levee. Ms Nash stated that that issue would be negotiated so that the removal did not cause any damage to the levee. Motion was made and carried with all ayes approving the Heritage Preservation Commission's recommendation relating to the Union Pacific Abandonment Section 106 Review.

# Carver Park and Ride Project

The council was informed that the City of Carver has been awarded the Carver Park and Ride Project CMAQ funding. The funding that the city will receive was the full maximum amount requested as a part of this project (80 % of costs). A 20% match is required. This funding match costs anticipated are programmed in the city's financial management Plan. However, the staff is investigating other sources of funding that can be utilized. Staff and consultants will proceed onto the next steps of this project. Request has been implemented to establish a two person committee. Ms Nash informed the council of the need to initiate Comprehensive Plan Amendment to recognize the Orderly Annexation Agreement, Request developing community status and related items. "At the time the Comprehensive Plan was reviewed by the Metropolitan Council in late 2008, the city had not yet entered into an Orderly Annexation Agreement with Dahlgren Township. As a result, the Met Council agreed to review our Comprehensive Plan, but would not authorize the City to place the plan into effect for the affected portion of Dahlgren Township, as we did not have the annexation agreement in place."

As a result of this issue, status of the city was affected. The city was recognized as a Rural Growth Center rather than a Developing Community. The city's status has an impact on SAC fees are calculated upon connection to the Met Council waste water system. A Comprehensive Plan Amendment is required to be initiated so that the Metropolitan Council makes the appropriate changed to their conditions of the city's Comprehensive Plan approval addressing issues. The requests should not result in any changes to the Comprehensive Plan document, however, this is not for certain until there are further discussions with the Met Council. Ms Nash requested permission to commence this process anticipating that a hearing would be scheduled tentatively for the Planning Commission meeting. Motion was made and carried with all ayes authorizing initiation of the Comprehensive Plan amendment to recognize orderly annexation agreement, request developing community status and other related items.

2010 Primary Election Date Change

On March 3<sup>rd</sup> Governor Pawlenty signed a bill into law (Chapter 184) that moves the state primary to the second Tuesday in August. This is a month earlier then State Primary Elections have been held in the past.

Although the General Election will still be held on November 2<sup>nd</sup> (the first Tuesday after the first Monday of the month), an earlier Primary will change County and City schedules for recruiting and training Election Judges.

Future newsletters will have articles asking residents to sign up to **be** an Election Judge in August and November. Please watch for **th**em. Thank you.

City Hall

The city attorney reviewed former work conducted on the proposed city hall project and what was necessary to move forward with the Community Development Authority proposal. The options were reviewed, the attorney stressed the amount of legal fees involved due to agreements required to be worked out concerning shared areas & lease agreement. Two representatives from the Community Development Authority were present at the meeting to give the presentation involving the proposed building consisting of senior housing, the Community Development Authority headquarters and a new city hall for the city. Questions were asked pertaining to the site and the project. Council member commented on the time frame being so short and feeling pressured. Explanation was given that the opportunity had presented itself with a property becoming available and working with the city seemed like a good fit. The Community Development Authority has been waiting to build a new head-quarters as they have outgrown their current office space. Costs were an aspect to be reviewed. Motion was made and carried to schedule a work session to discuss options and locations with the Community Development Authority. Motion was made and carried appointing two council members to a sub-committee on the city hall proposal.

Continued discussions were held with the Community Development Authority. The council was told that that the Community Development Authority wished to work with the city's schedule and offered to slow their proposed schedule to work with city consideration also given to waiting until spring of 2011.

The council continued lengthy discussions regarding the proposed city hall. Council member was asked to relay opinion for the old school house option. Another suggestion was the River Bluff Estates prospective site. The bluffs site would require rezoning, costs have yet to be determined or even if there is an interest in selling property. The former Kling Garage site was reviewed. However the drawback for this site were its size, was not in the historic district or flood plain and space was limited. The bluffs site allowed the city the ability to design and build with enough space. The school house location would keep city hall in the down-town area which one member considered an important factor and the bluffs site offered a funnel to the downtown area, but again, costs were unknown. The mayor agreed with the distance of the bluffs site versus the downtown area. It was his opinion that the bluff site could be more expensive than the Community Development Authority site. The council discussed the possibility of a grant being avail-able as well for building. Future cost concerns were also weighed with possible necessity to expand. The consensus was that the council had reviewed every possibility. At the present time, even though the desire to maintain the hall in the downtown area, fiscally it was more cost effective to coordinate efforts with Community Development Authority The mayor pointed out that the expansion is necessary presently, describing the conditions in the current city hall. It was also his opinion that it was not fair to the Community Development Authority to not approve, reject or move onto other sites.

Rough drawings of the school house site and the waste-water treatment site had been reviewed. The mayor stated that he would like to see a decision made concerning the Community Development Authority project. There had not been any negative feedback regarding the site and it was wasteful to continue looking at alternate sites. Comment was made regarding having to share chambers and legal fees. It was also the opinion that ownership of the land would be better for the city. Another council member's opinion was that the city could not afford a new city hall at this time and that possibly in approximately five years would be a wiser decision to consider when building permit revenues were rising.


The Lions are busy planning for the upcoming events. Want to be a part of this planning, excitement, self gratification of successful, then be sure to joi



Carver Fire Department

As a reminder, make sure to check the batteries in your fire alarms and CO alarms. Also, make sure that you have a CO alarm within ten feet of every bedroom. One easy thing to remind you is that when you change your clocks you should change your batteries.

I would like to thank the Carver County Emergency Risk Management, Carver County Sheriffs Posy with helping with flood watch and many other volunteers along with city and lot of time from the Carver Firefighters that have all spent a lot of time down at the river patrolling the dikes making sure pumps were all working. The River is going down at this time but if we have any large amount of rain the river could crest again. We would ask that people stay away from the river and make sure that you talk to your kids and tell them it is very dangerous to play by the river or creeks and flooded areas.

The Carver Fire Department is opening up bids on March 30 at 5pm for a replacement Rescue Engine.

Spring burning restrictions to begin March 29

Due to rapid snowmelt across much of the state, the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (DNR) announced that open burning

restrictions will start in 25 counties at 8 a.m. on March 29.

The counties include: Aitkin, Anoka, Benton, Cass, Crow Wing, Chisago, Carver, Dakota, Hennepin, Hubbard, Isanti, Itasca, Kanabec, Mille Lacs, Morrison, Pine, Ramsey, Scott, Sherburne, Stearns, Todd, Wadena, Washington, Wright, and the south half of Beltrami. Dry conditions have increased the risk of wildfires, particularly in grassy areas which can ignite easily and spread quickly. "The lack of snow on the ground allows the vegetation to dry out much faster, which increases the likelihood for a fire to start," said Larry Himanga, DNR fire prevention specialist. "The rapid snow melt has drastically increased the risk for wildfires."

Additional counties will be added shortly, as the snow cover recedes further north. For those who plan to burn in counties that still have open burning, the window of opportunity will be brief. Soon most of Minnesota will be under restrictions.

Once restrictions are in place, special permits will only be written for extenuating circumstances. This may include time sensitive construction projects and prescribed burning conducted by professional firefighters. The DNR encourages the use of composting,

recycling, and chipping as alternatives to burning.

While debris burning will be curtailed, the use of campfires, if smaller than 3 feet in diameter and 3 feet in height, will continue to be allowed. Permits are not required for this type of fire if it meets the above conditions and is monitored until the coals are dead out.






