

## Preliminary Budget 2012

A proposed budget power point presentation was presented to the city council on the 2012 Preliminary Budget. Several items were discussed involving upgrading tennis/basketball court at the Lion's Park, adding planters by the downtown area benches, Market Value Homestead Credit changes and fiscal disparities. The council consensus was to review the Financial Management Plan prior to continuing with discussions on the budget.

The administrator briefly reviewed the procedures taken to determine the 2012 Preliminary Budget/levy amounts. Motion was made and carried with all ayes adopting the resolution certifying the 2012 Preliminary levy. Thanks were extended to the personnel who did all the work done on the budget.

## Financial Management Plan

A financial consultant representative reviewed the updated Financial Plan with the council. Discussions were held regarding future city projects, as well as equipment needs. Statement was made that the city should have an assessment policy so that future assessments can be equitable to property owners.

## Steam Boat Days Princesses

Fourteen girls participated in the competition for Steam Boat Days Princesses. Baylee Cummins, Chanhassen High School Junior was crowned 'Miss Carver'. Leah Shanahan was crowned 'Jr Miss Carver' and attends Chaska Middle School West. "Little Miss Carver" attends Guardian Angels and is Cela Watkins. Congratulations to the winners and all of the participants. The winners all reside in Carver. The girls rode in the parade on the float. They will be conducting fundraising and community services throughout the year.

## Technology Referendum

The Eastern Carver County School District School Board approved an allotted amount of money for capital projects levy to fund technology for the schools in the district. Voting will be held on November 8<sup>th</sup>. If successful, the levy authorization will continue for ten years. 

## Carver Interceptor Project

The council was updated by the city engineer on the Carver Interceptor Project. Segment A included the signing on the street, striping work, shoulder work, and restoration. The council discussed the west portion of County Road #40. Starting the work on the Segment B was talked about briefly.

## Carver Fire Relief

The proposed pension increase was discussed. The administrator reviewed with the council that the Carver Fire Relief manages the pension provided to members of the The City's Fire Department. The association is not an organization of the City of Carver, rather it is a separate organization comprised of members of the Fire Department and run by a Board of Trustees elected by the membership. The mayor, the city administrator and the fire chief are all members of this board. Motion was made and carried with all ayes increasing the annual pension benefit for the Carver Fire Relief Association per year of service by stated amount.

## Did You Know ....

....that in July 1998 the Carver Fire Department executed a controlled burn of the old Carver Creamery building, once located on Broadway at the north end of the present day Robb Electric complex.

....that in 1855 there were 119 steamboat arrivals at St. Paul from the towns along the Minnesota River, including Carver.

## Volleyball Court

In the Park Dedication Study, two volleyball courts have been designated at the Community Park as a planned improvement. The Park and Recreation Board Supervisor pointed out to the council that there are not any volleyball courts in the city. The Park and Recreation Board would be able to accomplish this project with in-house cost savings to the city. This project could also be completed by the fall of this year. There would not be any lights at the courts. Seating was questioned. Picnic tables and/or benches were talked about. Possibly a shelter were all in the plans

Question was asked if there were requests to use the indoor gym/ courts. The supervisor stated that an indoor league to be started was on the wish list. Suggestion was made to install lights on the outdoor courts to form leagues. Motion was made and carried with

all eyes to approve construction of the community park volleyball courts.

## Building Official Appointment

The Building Official position has been vacant since April of 2011. An employee has been serving as the 'Interim Building Official' since that point in time. The Personnel Committee reviewed the employee's qualifications and interviewed regarding the open position. Plans were that the appointment for the Building Official for a full-time building inspector position would remain vacant indefinitely while the 2012 budget provides funding for a part-time position. The city has operated with the position description of 'Building Inspector' but not a specific position for 'Building Official'. The administrator created a proposed position description accurately defining the duties and responsibilities of the building official. Motion was made and carried with all ayes approving the position description for the building official. Motion was made and carried with all ayes to appoint Mark Pistulka to the position of Building Official with a performance appraisal to be conducted by the Personnel Committee and the Administrator at the completion of nine months.

## Carver Fire Department

The Fire Chief told the council that the Fire Department had applied and has been awarded a grant from the MN Department of Natural Resources "Fire Assistance" program. The grant funds would be used to assist paying for a 'skid unit'. A skid unit has the capability of carrying emergency equipment, supplies, a fifty gallon water tank and pump and a patient transport system. The costs and the dividing of payments by matching funds were reviewed. If the cost is less than anticipated, any funds not used could be used for purchasing other fire equipment. Motion was made and carried with all ayes authorizing the purchase of a skid unit and related equipment.

## Utility Cart

The council discussed the utility cart with the Public Works Director. The present cart has been in service for five years used for the downtown watering, field dragging, park inspections, pesticide spraying, garbage pickup in the parks and other miscellaneous projects. A Kubota has been offered to the city for approximately half the cost of the new utility cart. The existing cart is utilized non-stop through the spring, summer and fall work as much as eight hours per day. An additional cart would provide the Public Works Department with the equipment necessary to efficiently perform other maintenance projects. The 2012 Budget project asked to add two seasonal staff positions. An additional cart would provide the added labor with the necessary equipment and resources to achieve the work. Purchasing the equipment outright is more efficient than renting. Motion was made and carried with all ayes authorizing the purchase of a utility cart.

## Did You Know.....

....that in 1880 J. M. Nye & Company was making buff-colored Carver brick near the intersection of Broadway and Fifth Street in Carver. In that year Nye advertised, "We make the finest brick in the market, come and see them". In 1880 the Nye Company was producing 300,000-500,000 bricks annually.

....that in Jan. 1868 firewood was coming into Carver by sleigh in large quantities, selling for \$2.50 to \$3.50 per cord.

## Fourth and Sixth Street Bridges

The city engineer reviewed the previous authorized prepared feasibility study relating to the reconstruction of the Fourth Street bridge. Other areas identified also requiring improvement as a part of the Financial Management Plan and Capital Improvement Plan included the Sixth Street bridge. Planning costs for the Sixth Street improvement had been identified but a feasibility study had not been conducted. The engineer reviewed the history of the Fourth Street bridge and some of the measures taken. There has been extensive discussions held with the State Historic Preservation Office and the Corps of Engineers regarding the options and the bridge.

Comment was made regarding Sixth Street discussions not being remembered occurring. The Public Works Director stated that the Sixth Street bridge is in very poor condition and requires a lot of work every spring due to underground springs. Discussion was held repeating the process for the 4<sup>th</sup> Street Bridge as done for the Main Street Bridge. The city is in a tight situation concerning the Fourth Street reconstruction and when that work can be done dependent upon the work of the Main Street Bridge approval.

Question was asked about the width of the bridge. It was thought that the bridge could not be made any wider nor would parking be allowed. The engineer stated that the original bridge was only twenty feet wide. The city had added panels to widen the bridge is part of the present wing wall problem. The city requires time to collect means for payment options for such an improvement.

The purpose of the discussion was to inform the council of the situation. Repair of the bridge was estimated to take approximately three months. Question was asked about the two projects being staggered so that one or the other areas would be open while work was being done on the other area. Comment was made to conduct a public forum for residents to give their opinions on the proposed projects.

## Bullying Play - "Lockdown"

A powerful learning opportunity is being offered by Climb Theater ([www.climb.org](http://www.climb.org)) This event is being sponsored by the Chaska Police Department, the Carver County Library and the Chaska Human Rights Commission. It is also FREE! That's right, NO CHARGE! FREE! The play is an hour long. It's benefits priceless.

Climb Theater will be performing a powerful play called "Lockdown" which deals with bullying incidents and shows how these incidents affect the bully, the target, and the bystanders. The desired audience for this presentation will be middle school ages students. This play is not recommended for children under Sixth Grade or above Ninth Grade. Parents are welcome to attend. We hope that after viewing this performance kids will challenge themselves in the way that they view "bullying" and what they can do to stop it from happening to other kids!!!



You can come and see this play, November 3<sup>rd</sup>. The Play begins at 3 Pm and ends at 4 PM. Bus transportation will be provided to children who live in the cities of Chaska, Chanhassen, Carver and Victoria. ## 2011 Carver Heritage Preservation Award

The City of Carver and the Carver Heritage Preservation Commission are pleased to accept 2011 nominations for the annual Carver Heritage Preservation Award, to go to the year's most outstanding historic preservation effort in the Carver Historic District. Previous awards went to the Kelzer family for their restoration work on the circa 1870 Andrew G. Anderson House at 208 Main Street West, and to Gregg and Meg Witt for restorations of the 1925 gas station at 200 Broadway, the circa 1895 Swanson-Johnson Grocery Store building at 204 Broadway, and the circa 1865 Denny-Hammerlund Hardware Store building at 208 Broadway.

The award will go to the owner(s) of properties who make the year's best effort at preserving or restoring the exterior of any store, house, barn, or structure located in the Carver Historic District. The award may also be given for historically sensitive enhancements to the Historic District, including additions, porches, outbuildings, or the infill of empty lots.

After nominations have been received, the Carver Heritage Preservation Commission will view nominated properties and decide the annual award winner by a majority commission vote at the November HPC meeting. While the award is intended to be an annual one, there may be some years when no significant preservation effort took place, or when no property has been nominated. The award, a plaque, will be presented by the Mayor of Carver in December at a Carver Holiday Party, or the first practical Carver City Council meeting thereafter. A temporary sign may also be placed outside the annual award-winning property, but only if so desired by the owner.
