Community Service Hwards

The administrative intern provided information regarding the Carver Community Service Awards. This is meant to recognize time,

support, serve and dedication given to the City of Carver for individuals and organizations. It is important to acknowledge the hard work that make a difference in the community. Three awards are presented annually which include a youth (18 and under), an individual and/or a business/organization. The criteria includes volunteering time, effort, expertise or other resources. All citizens, organizations and businesses within Carver are eligible. Nomination forms will be available at city hall or on the city's website. Nominations will be accepted until November 1st of each year and will be reviewed by the mayor and city staff. Award winners will receive a plaque and be recognized in city publications for achievements. Motion was made and carried with all ayes authorizing the creations of the Carver Community Service Awards with three awards to be presented annually to the designated three groups. Further discussion was held on the topic. Question was asked when the process would begin. Response was 2016. Question was also asked why the entire council was not included in the decision. Clarification was given that intentions were internal review process since the council had moved away

from committees and the changes of the review processes could be

done. Suggestion was submitted to include council member in the

reviewal. How that choice would be made was discussed further.

Motion was made and carried with all ayes amending the original motion to include additional council member in review process.

There was also discussion to revisit the selection personnel annually.

Building Inspector

The building inspector updated the council on events occurring in the building industry throughout the City of Carver. The Carver Crossing has been issued temporary Certificate of Occupancy. The Centra Homes is ready to have its last 3-unit townhouse permit issuance. The update for Mattamy Homes is that all the lots in Phase 1 are sold, sales have begun for Phase 2 and twenty plus homes are under construction in Phase 1. Christy's Bluff news is that three houses are near completion, one home in early stages of construction and one to begin construction soon. Carver Ridge 2nd has one home under construction. Lastly, Riverview Estates where construction on two homes has begun. Inspector is working with "Do-It-Yourself" homeowners on their projects. Nuisance items are being worked on and development of a permit system for project not covered under the building code.

City Engineer Report

The city engineer updated the council on work continued on the 2015 Street and Utility Improvements. Updates were given regarding the Pedestrian Underpass constructed on Jonathan Carver Parkway. The elementary school grading and utility work has begun, met with city and school officials and construction observations are being done. The Letter of Credit spreadsheet for the dental office has been prepared. Preliminary field survey has been completed for the 2017 Street and Utility Improvements and work has begun on the feasibility study. Utility construction has begun at Copper Hills 2nd construction observation and erosion control inspections are being conducted. The design survey has been completed for the Broadway Storm Sewer Flood Lift Station. The Water System Improvement updates were also presented to the council.

2017 General Fund Budget

The city administrator gave an overview to the council of the drafted 2017 General Fund Budget.

Water Management

The coordinator with the Carver County Water Management Department met with the council extending an invitation to members to the "The Dirt on Sediment Pollution" which is a workshop for local leaders on the Minnesota River. This is an opportunity to learn the impact by erosion and sediment pollution in local streams and lakes, the connection to the MN River and how to make a difference. An information sheet was also provided.

Temporary Family Health Care Dwellings

The city planner discussed background information regarding the bill relating to the creation of a new process for landowners to place mobile residential dwellings on property to serve as a temporary family health care dwelling. A fact sheet prepared by the League of MN Cities about the law was presented. Unless the city chooses to adopt an ordinance "opting out" in place, qualifying applications under the new law would be required to be approved. Meaning that the city needs to be prepared with a permit process in place and existing regulations to accessory uses under the zoning ordinance and recreational vehicles do not apply to these applications.

The city's options are to do nothing which would mean allowing temporary healthcare dwellings or to adopt an ordinance opting out. This would mean that there is no effect on the city's current regulations and these types of uses would not be permitted and there would be a gap in time if the ordinance were not in effect by the said date. Opting out at this time does not mean that the council cannot choose at a later time to adopt its own regulations regarding the topic. The council also has the option to adopt an ordinance opting out, but then request staff and the Planning Commission study the issue further. This option would be more suitable if there was interest in considering allowing temporary dwellings and also setting the terms and conditions permitted. A Public Hearing has been held by the Planning Commission who recommended approval of the ordinance but part of the motion to research the issue and move forward was not part of their motion. The council consensus was to study the issue further and move forward. Motion was made and carried with all ayes adopting the ordinance opting out of the temporary dwellings. This issue will need to be revisited in the future if further discussions are necessary.

Edith Anne Property Excellence Award

The administrator informed the council that 201 Third Street West property, Bridgette Kelly had been selected as the 2016 Edith Anne Property Excellence Award at the Planning Commission meeting. Ms Kelly will be presented with the award. The city council also visited the site.

Fire Department

The Fire Chief updated the council on fire department information. Applications for firefighters are being taken presently. Current new hires are in training and doing will the chief relayed. The department has a public relations group who will be working with the city staff to update the department's information on their website and media accounts. Upcoming events were discussed, including the Open House scheduled for October 4th. (see insert)

City Planner Report

The city planner told the council that the school architecture had been approved. Plat and associated legal documents are recorded and construction is underway. The staff is in coordination with district personnel for final site plan details. The dentist site applicant is in coordination with the city staff preparing and reviewing conditions of approval and record of the plat. The Developers Agreement is being prepared. The Copper Hills 2nd Addition's plat and associated documents have been recorded and construction underway. The Comprehensive Plan scoping is underway, Grant application submitted and reporting and monitoring are being completed. The 6th Street redevelopment updates are that the limited site investigation has been completed, and the application is being prepared for reimbursement from the MN Pollution Control Agency. The Request for Proposal has been sent to prospective developers and placed on the League of MN Cities website. The city was awarded the grant relating to redevelopment planning. The preliminary review of the 2017 Fee Ordinance fee structures has begun for ordinance update. The draft study is being prepared for the Park Dedication Study. A grant was received from the State Historic Preservation Office to defray costs for attendance to the annual preservation conference.

Sanitation License

The council reviewed the renewal process for sanitation licenses for Elite Waste Disposal, Suburban Waste Services and Waste Management. All three companies submitted applications along with required documentation for renewal for 2016-2017. Approval was recommended.

Carver Elementary School

The city engineer reviewed with the council the wetland permit application for the Carver Elementary School. Approval was necessary for the permit application for Eastern Carver County Schools for the school. The city is the local governmental unit administering the Wetland Conservation Act. The act requires wetland protection and replacement of wetlands that cannot be avoided in a proposed project. A wet land permit application had been submitted for wetland impacts as part of the development of the school. The school district serves the cities of Carver, Chaska, Chanhassen and Victoria. Due to the population growth demand a new elementary school was required. This project involves the construction of the school itself, as well as athletic fields. The athletic fields will meet a multi-use field space need in the city that currently is unavailable. It will meet the demand of the growing school district, local youth athletic associations and community education programs. The proposed project impact stated square feet of wetland which will be replaced at the required two point on ratio for the total replacement of said square feet. The replacement is from a wetland restoration that was done as part of Wetland Bank #1175 located outside of the City of Caver but within the same major watershed and bank service area as the proposed wetland impact. The Wetland Conservation Act requirements were all completed. Recommendation was submitted to approve the Wetland Permit Application from Eastern Carver County School for the elementary school in Carver.

Urban Land Institute

The city council and the planning commission board attended a joint workshop meeting for the purpose of participating in "Navigating Your Competitive Future" program.

Task Forces I and II.

The council and Task Forces I and II will be attending a Joint Task Force Meeting on October 6th at Church-By-The-River to review and discuss community spaces in the community.

Special Meeting

Monday, November 14th at 5:30 PM will be a special meeting to canvass the votes from the General Election which is on November 8th.

Lylewood Glen

The city planner discussed with the council the landscape escrow release of Lylewood Glen property to release the remaining escrow. The city had been holding the funds in escrow for the completion of the landscaping improvements within Lylewood Glen. This included the installation of trees in the neighborhood. Trees were planted in the summer of 2015. The remaining funds were held to ensure the trees survived for a year. These obligations have been met. The staff recommended release of the balance of the funds.

Commissioner Terms

The council reviewed an ordinance relating to changing the terms for the Heritage Preservation Commission, Parks Commission and Planning Commission members. The council interviewed candidates for service on all of these boards. Currently the terms for these boards end in staggered years. The proposed ordinance would change the term end dates for commissioners from December 31st to March 1st of each year, allowing the interviewing process to be spaced more conveniently and a better paced process over the first few months of the year versus all at once.

Preliminary Levy

The administrator discussed the 2017 preliminary levy with the council. The council reviewed the motion to adopt the resolution certifying the levy. This process is required to be done by the end of the month of September with the county. In preparation for the levy the council conducted a series of budget meetings to discuss various expenditure options necessary to guide the amount of levy necessary to fund operations. Once it is certified, the levy cannot be increased. A scheduled truth-in taxation hearing on the preliminary levy will be held December 5th. Comments heard will then help to determine the final levy and budget. Staff will continue to review, revise and present additional estimates to the council.


