

# Emergency Repairs

The city manager informed the council of the situation of an emergency repair made to the well identified as Well # 1. The well had stopped pumping. Response for internal assessment was done resulting in a service call. Service to the well had originally been planned as part of the 2018 budget; however, additional work was necessary at the present time. A maintenance program had been initiated in 2017. The 2018-budgeted appropriated amount exceeded the authorized service required. Repairs were necessary immediately. The purchasing authority granted this to be completed. The follow up was to inform the city council.

# Trident Development

The city manager discussed adoption of the resolution to schedule a Public Hearing relating to the establishment of a tax increment financing district and adoption of a tax increment financing plan. The purpose is consideration of a tax increment district. The Planning Commission and the city council will conduct a land use and zoning review of the project in the near future. The land use and zoning review includes resident and adjacent property owner's engagement opportunities. A preliminary plan for sixty-unit senior housing development project, assisted living and memory care facility has been received from Trident Development. The project site is located on Sixth Street currently owned by the city. Previously, a Request for Proposal had been issued and selection of proposal from Shingobee for the senior housing development. Shingobee transferred interest in the site to Trident Development. In the interim, the city has spent time working on environmental remediation issues. Currently, a purchase agreement is being worked on between the city and Trident. This will require review and approval from the city council.

The council discussed the Tax Increment Financing with the Financial Advisor and the option to be utilized for upcoming developments within the city. Trident Development is seeking support via the tax increment financing. The city Trident are also currently working through a purchase agreement with the developer. A Public Hearing was necessary to be scheduled for the Tax Increment Finance District. Motion was made and carried with all ayes adopting the resolution to schedule a Public Hearing on October 1st relating to establishment of a Tax Increment Financing District and adoption of Tax Increment Financing Plan.

#### Parks Commission

The Parks Commission reviewed the request forwarded to them from the Carver Community Youth Baseball and Softball Association. The group has requested multiple improvements and revisions of a current ball field within Carver to the baseball field to accommodate their guidelines. Carver is a growing community. Over the past few years, the association has experienced a steady increase in the number of registrants to play baseball in Carver with the CCYBSA. Currently, there is not a field with proper requirements for the growing number of baseball players. The association presently makes do with the currently softball field. Details were included to the commission explaining their requirements. If the commission accepted recommended suggestions submission, it could be plausible to open the field up to surrounding communities to reserve, as well.

#### Qakeview Industries

The Planning Commission members discussed the Concept Plan proposal for Lakeview Industries north of the Fleet Farm property. The firm manufactures and fabricates flexible components and is classified as light industrial use. The possible job openings would be part of the initial move in and continued job growth. The entire operation would be relocated in the Carver facility. Their employment range included manufacturing, customer service and engineering, along with office space. Process types, machines and shifts were asked about. The response was that there was a wide variety of equipment and currently operates two shifts. Inquiry was made regarding chemicals and waste materials. Production is operated appropriately by law. The firm utilizes processes to recycle and reuse water. Recent designing allows them to recycle water use with a recapture system in their machines. In the City of Carver, there is the potential and ability to grow and expand in the future. The structure would be one story and designed to be a manufacturing, warehouse building. The buffer in Phase II by the wetland area was questioned. The Carver County Water Management Organization would be reviewing the project and ensure requirements are met. Additional storm water collection areas were questioned if necessary. Presently the current site would accommodate. Upgrading of the road to the water tower in the plans. The needs of the city and the developer were being discussed in the designing phase. Comment of approval was made that the front of the building would face the residential area. Number and size of larger vehicles was questioned. The city planner stated that the capacity in the infrastructure was present to accommodate this factor. Area is industrial not residential eliminating certain restrictions adhering to the Comprehensive Plan. The Chaska site is leased, the proposed site within the city allows them to consolidate and grow. Also discussed was the potential for solar energy in the future.

The city planner presented information to the council on Lakeview Industries and the Concept Review. The company is a manufacturer of flexible components. They have operated in Chaska for over thirty years and are looking to expand the business and operations identifying property in Carver as their new headquarters. The city planner listed markets and customers for the council. The proposed project would be phased with initial construction with the potential for development and construction of additional space. The project is anticipated to create approximately eighty-five job to the City of Carver and will increase significant daytime population to the city. As defined in the City Code the work and services provide the classified light industrial use. Their current facility had been toured by staff and it was anticipated that there would not be an adverse noise or odor related to the development. As the project progresses, anticipation of building specifics would be subject to changes. The staff and the development team are exploring the best traffic options for access. The Planning Commission reviewed the concept plan without any formal action, however, supportive of the project. The council is expected to give feedback. The next steps in the planning process include rezoning of the property a review of the preliminary and final plat.

The city planner provided an overview to the council regarding Lakeview Industries. The city's feedback was requested from the developer. Council member inquired about the two entrances off Levi Griffin. The development team is discussing this. The mayor encouraged that the city be developer friendly and available for questions. Future expansion was questioned and plans for that are in the plans.

# 2040 Comprehensive Plan

At a joint meeting, the city council and the planning commission members discussed the 2040 Comprehensive Plan. The city planner provided an overview of the proposed changes to the future land use map draft. A steering committee worked on land use classifications for specific growth areas. Each growth area had multiple land use options and the committee determined appropriate uses for each property identified. Survey results were reviewed and there was a brief discussion on the drafted housing section in the Comprehensive Plan.

#### Oak Tree

The city planner discussed the Oak Tree Phase II Final Plat seeking approval by adoption of a resolution. As part of the preliminary plat, the project would be completed in a four-phase approach. Phase I included villa lots and single-family homes spanning a north/south area along Jonathan Carver Parkway. Oak Tree is slated to have three different lot sizes and home options within the development. The three housing types include two styles of single-family homes and villa lots. Phase I included two of the three lot sizes with the third included in Phase II. Phase II includes eighteen single-family homes on lots located west of Phase I and will be addressed off Maple Drive. Lennar is interested in having the three different housing types available to buyers and Phase II includes the single-family lot not included in Phase I.

Recently the property was rezoned with a planned residential development overly allowing for a mix of housing types and lot sizes within this development. Phase II lots conform to the rezon-ing and are consistent with the Preliminary Plat. Phase II lot sizes are slightly larger than those approved in the northeast corner creating a more of an executive lot size. Phase II access will be forming the east west road extension of White Pine Way. Lots will be addressed off Maple Lane to be constructed in conjunction with single-family homes. Sidewalk on one side of the street along Maple Lane and part of the larger system of pedestrian access throughout the site. The utilities will be extended from White Pine Way into Maple Lane.

Park dedication based on the number of lots within the development as typical practice. Oak Tree will include a trail through the outlots on the property that includes areas of bluff and mature trees which will be maintained on site through the construction.

The Planning Commission reviewed Phase II recommending approval of the Oak Tree Phase II project.

The city planner discussed Oak Tree Phase II discussions. The city attorney presented revisions to the proposed resolution. The developer was aware of the changes. Motion was made and carried with all ayes approving adoption of the resolution approving Oak Tree Phase II final plats as presented.

# Ironwood Park Pedestrian Bridges

The city engineer discussed with the council approval for a quote from SM Hentges for site improvement work for the Ironwood pedestrian bridges. Quotes had been solicited. The engineer discussed the work required to be done. Bridge structures were approved and ordered and should be delivered by the end of October or early November. Expected completion for the improvement work is around the 21<sup>st</sup> of November. Continued coordination with the school district will be continued involving construction activities associated with the project. To avoid school disruptions construction access will come from the north side of Ironwood Park. The project will be funded through the Park Dedication Fund.

The city engineer presented information to the council regarding the pedestrian bridges. The mayor requested clarification for the date of the placement of the bridges. November 21<sup>st</sup> was the goal for completion and completion of any additional finishing site work required. Motion was made and carried with all ayes approving the quote for site improvement work regarding the Ironwood Park Pedestrian Bridges.

# Design Carver

The city planner informed the Parks Commission members of the Metropolitan Council's jurisdiction requirement of communities to review and revise their Comprehensive Plan's every ten years. The Comprehensive plan update identified as Design Carver is planning for what Carver will look like from 2019 -2040. The Parks Commission reviewed the Design Carver overview, draft maps to be included and survey results related to park development. They will be reviewing the overview of the plan status, and how it related to work of the Parks Commission. As part of the update, the Parks Commission will be revising of the Parks Mater Plan which is a standalone document but heavily referenced in in the parks section of the Comprehensive Plan. The staff is reviewing the existing Parks Master Plan expecting input for the types of project the commission would like to see in the future.

#### Edith Anne Award

The city planner provided information relating to the Edith Anne Award for 2018 awards. "The Edith-Anne Award has been celebrated by since 2015 in honor of Edith Herman and Anne Neils who were both instrumental in the creation of the Carver-on-the Minnesota's vision of to "stop the wasteful deterioration of a typical 19th Century River town". Edith and Anne were both instrumental in restoring and preserving many historic buildings in Carver that lead to placement on the National Register of Historic Places in 1980. Previous award winners include homes at 714 Debbie Lane and 201 3rd Street West."

The city planner further stated that four homes have been nominated for the award. The Planning Commission will review the profiles of candidates. The Planning Commission has been assigned with the final decision and choice. The city council will present the award to the winner in September.

The city planner presented homes for consideration of the Edith-Anne award at the Planning Commission meeting. The general consensus of the Planning Commission members regarding recommendations for Edith Anne Award Nominees in the future was to have a voting and review process formalized allowing for consist-ent and fair process procedures. In the future it was also discussed to have before and after photos.

Statement was made that all of the properties nominated for the award were winners. The work of the residents of these homes was appreciated. Another member appreciated the description of 'plant junkyard' and pursuing a gardening approach to revitalizing the property. Two submissions were each pollinator friendly. Motion was made and carried recommending the Edith Anne Aware be awarded to the Property at Debbie Court.

#### Flood Plain Ordinance

The city planner explained that the City of Carver participated in the National Flood Insurance Program through the Federal Emergency Management Association. The purpose of this program is to reduce the impact of flooding, both privately and publicly. This is achieved by providing affordable insurance by encouragement to adopt and enforce floodplain management regulations. This helps to mitigate the effects of flooding. The Planning Commission is reviewing the drafted ordinance by the DNR ( Department of Natural Resources ) as a model for communities to participate in and must be adopted by year-end to continue in the program. The Planning Commission will be reviewing and discussing this model.

The Planning Commission reviewed information presented by the City planner regarding the updated flood plain ordinance provided by the DNR. The technical drafted ordinance was for discussion and necessary for continuance to participate in the National Flood Insurance Program. The ordinance is applicable to the city and the staff is comfortable moving forward supporting the proposed draft. Questions were asked. The timeline was asked about and the expected adoption. Approval would be in the future.

#### Homelessness

City council member attended the Carver County Leaders meeting. There was a presentation given by Richard Scott regarding homelessness and poverty in Carver County. Comment was conveyed that there is more than anyone realizes. Suggestion was submitted to invite this speaker to a future council meeting to present the statistics and information to the incoming 2019 council.

League of MN Cities

Council member had also attended the League of MN Cities Coffee Hour meeting. Relayed that it was interesting to hear what the league is working on and the services they provide. The mayor stated that the league is open to how to making their organization better. Most cities in Minnesota are members. The city manager is also on the Board of Directors.

# Lower MN River Watershed District

The city engineer discussed with the council the updates regarding the Lower Minnesota River Watershed District.

The Lower MN River Watershed District has worked closely with local government units, the DNR, its Technical Advisory Committee and neighboring watershed management organizations to better understand water resources within its jurisdiction. Professional monitoring services had been obtained from the Carver County Water Management Organization and Dakota and Scott Soil and Water Conservation Districts to collect and assess water samples from fens, lakes and streams. The district's growing understanding resulted in recognizing gaps in management and protection of high value resources. The district began amendment processes in 2016 to align its plan with local water plan timelines and adjacent watershed management organizations and focused on modifying standards. The Plan amendment was released for comment, a Public Hearing held and continued. The Plan amendment was approved and submission authorized to the Board of Water and Soil Resources. Expectations are that the amendment would be adopted in September or October of this year. Then following from October through April of 2019 it is anticipated that the city adopt the LMRWD code amendments following the districts approval.

Major rule changes summary include a creation of two overlay districts of Steep Slope District and High Value Resources Area District. The high value resources area is not currently within the city limits or the 2040 planning area so there is not any impact for the city. The regulated activities were reviewed.

# 2018 Storm Sewer Improvements The city engineer discussed the 2018 storm sewer improvements

The city engineer discussed the 2018 storm sewer improvements with the council. The council reviewed the plans and specifications, discussed authorizing bid advertisement and scheduling bid date. The project consists of installation of storm sewer from the fire/city hall along the west side of Jonathan Carver Parkway to the north just past the cemetery. The storm pipe will be utilized to move water flows from Copper Hills and Oak Tree developments down to Carver Creek.

The 2018 Storm Sewer Improvements will also be a part of the rebidding of the Main Street Storm Water lift station project. In an effort to reduce original costs for the Main Street Storm Water Lift Station, a new package had been drafted. Upon approval of plans and authorization, the bid opening would be scheduled, also. Then this project could be ready for completion before year-end if weather and material lead times permit. However, it is not anticipated that any section would be substantially complete until the summer of 2019.







# Gold Star Mother's Day

Do you know what Gold Star Mother's Day is? It is the day for people to recognize and honor those

who have lost a son or daughter while serving the United State Armed Forces. It is the last Sunday of September each year.

Americans are called on to display the nation's flag and hold meetings to publicly express their love, sorrow and reverence towards Gold Star Mothers and their families. Government buildings are required to display the flag. It is not a designated as a public holiday.

"The name of Gold Star Mothers was derived from the custom of military families who put a service flag near their front window. The flag featured a star for each family member serving in their country – living members were denoted in blue but gold stars honored family members who were killed while in duty. In 1918 President Woodrow Wilson approved the wearing of black arm-bands bearing a gold star by those who had a family member who died in the military service to the United States. This distinguished them from the blue stars, representing a family member presently serving in the armed forces.

"American Gold Star Mothers, Inc. was incorporated in 1929, obtaining a federal charter from the

US Congress. It began with 25 mothers living in the Washington DC area and soon expanded to include affiliated groups throughout the nation. On June 23, 1936, a joint congressional resolution designated the last Sunday in September as Gold Star Mother's Day, a holiday that has been observed each year by a presidential proclamation."




