# Lift Station Rehabilitation Project

The Assistant City Engineer discussed with the council the direction of the scope of the project for the preparation of the plans and specifications for the Lift Station Rehabilitation Project. Authorization was given by the council to prepare the plans and specifications for the project. As part of the detailed design, determination was made regarding the elevations for the Carver Bluffs list station which effectively elimination this lift station. Original construction the lift station was necessary as part of the development because gravity sewer was not available at that time. Details were reviewed of past connections for the development. Then the assistant engineer discussed project constraints involving the gravity sewer connection were identified. Determination was made that the soil cover was not adequate and was discussed. An inverted siphon design utilization would be necessary which are commonly used. With normal annual maintenance measure these systems operate reliably. There was also the issue of the available Right of Way. Permanent and temporary construction easements would be necessary. Possible difficult easement acquisition options were also reviewed. The proposed alignment in the preliminary plan is located primarily within the Carver Bluffs Plat Outlot B that is owned by the Kensington Knolls Homeowners, the Carver Bluffs Homeowners Association. The initial consultation with the city attorney sated that a minimum of seventy-five percent of the homeowners would be required to approve easement grant per the governing documents of the Homeowners Association. The required necessary consent would be a difficult task. Installation on the west side of Carver Bluffs Parkway would be one alternative. The east side is owned by MN Valley Lands Inc which is a subdivision of the US Fish and Wildlife and acquisition would be extremely difficult. If unsuccessful to obtain easements from the Homeowners Association then the city would need to contemplate the utilization of condemnation. Initial conversations with the attorney determined that this process would not allow for a 2021 resolution resulting in minimal interim improvements to be completed for the station for system reliability. The project was anticipated to be financed with the sale of bonds that would be issued for the Jonathan Carver Parkway Improvement Project and would be funded by the municipal sewer enterprise fund. Initial rehabilitation of the existing lift station would be less expensive than the construction of a new gravity sewer, lift stations require considerably more ongoing maintenance versus a gravity sewer over a life cycle comparison interval including annual operating costs.

A summarization of a 50-year comparison interval in present dollars for each alternative were discussed. The comparison doesn't take into consideration annual operating costs. The first Option would be rehabilitation of the lift stations involving operation and maintenance. The second option involved the Gravity Sewer Construction with lines that required very little rehabilitations over the time interval.

the construction of a sustainable long term gravity sewer connection versus continuing rehabilitating the existing Carver Bluffs lift station in the future. Determination was made that it was unfeasible to acquire additional easement rights to construct a connection at this rehabilitation interval and that the rehabilitation of the existing lift station should be completed as originally programmed. Conversion should be considered going forward. The staff was directed to prepare the plans and specifications for rehabilitation of the current lift station. Recommendation was to delay the installation of the gravity sewer connection to a time in the future when the lift station is due for its next upgrade.

# Smart Water Program

The City Manager discussed the County's Water Management organization where the program features a collaboration between the county and a company identified as Rachio where discounted irrigation controllers are being offered to residents. The Carver County Water Management Organization is starting a new program encouraging residents to utilize smart controllers on their irrigation systems. These controller link to local weather conditions and provide exact water needs for lawns and gardens. The purpose of the program is to conserve groundwater resources and prevent additional runoff by increasing the efficient of the irrigation systems. This type of water conservations will save both residents and municipalities financial resources and protect the groundwater supplies. The council discussed the issue. The question presented to the city council is whether or not to participate in the program or to allocate funds providing additional incentive for the program participants. Staff was requested to move forward offering a discount for up to fifty units for a total cost to provide an additional discount/incentive for program participants.

#### Downtown Improvement Project

The City Manager discussed the downtown improvement project with the council. Plans and specifications overview was done. Question was posed about if the city did not pursue the change to the designated intersection of Main and Broadway, if it was still possible to add temporary signage for a four-way stop during the Jonathan Carver Parkway detour. The county was not interested in temporary signage for this type of situation. Sidewalks, infill, bump outs and additional parking in front of the Public Services Buildings were all reviewed. The opinion of addressing traffic issues should be discussed immediately was voiced. It was clear that some concerns were short term due to construction however concern was long term was a priority. It was considered that the council should wait and see how things developed. There was concern expressed regarding the ever-changing plans in the area and it was not considered wise to be re-doing items. It was the county's opinion that the intersection was safe and no issues were involved. The plan presented was not ideal however moving forward with sidewalk repairs was seen as viable since this was already an item for the project. Motion was made and failed direct the city engineer to prepare plans and specifications for the downtown improvement project. The City Manager indicated that the final plan will be brought back to a future meeting for approval. Motion was made and carried with all ayes to prepare a Hybrid Improvement Plan for the downtown area that works on all of the sidewalk upgrades from previous project versions.

# City Equipment Purchase

The Public Services Director discussed request for the purchase of a dump truck with snow plow equipment. The plans and specifications had been approved by the council. Quotes were received. The purchase has been budgeted for. The council considered the motion for approval of the purchase.

#### Meridian Fields

The Community Development Director discussed the fund transfer for Meridian Fields. As part of the construction of utilities in the Meridian Fields development, the developer was asked to install a larger municipal line in order to serve the development moving west. The city was then responsible for the cost difference. The Developer's Agreement prescribed the oversizing credit be awarded by removal of the sewer connection fee and reduced water connect fee at the time of permit. Credits issued during the designated years did not appropriately coincide resulting in credit reconciliation based on the provisions within the agreement. The total oversizing credit has not been reached thereby the city currently does not owe the developer over what is required in the agreements. The considered resolution authorizes transfer from the Sanitary Sewer Fund to the Water fund based on credit stipulation in the agreement. In the future these oversizing costs will be paid up front opposed to using the credit system on permits.

#### Hammers Concept Plan

The Community Development Director discussed with the council the Hammers Concept Plan. The Hammers property located west of Meridian Fields submitted a concept plan application for development. The plan indicates sixty-eight single family homes with street connections of Fields Drive in Meridian Fields and as an extension of Monroe Drive. Currently the property is located in Dahlgren Township within the city's orderly annexation agreement. Additional applications submitted annexation would be required. Due to the proximity of the highway, a noise study will be required prior to the Preliminary Plat approval. The property developing is considered low density residential and meet the guidelines of the City's Comprehensive Plan. The site is unique however, due to a large, existing wetland in the center of the property which would be largely preserved. The Planning Commission reviewed the proposal.

The Community Development Director informed the city that they do not have land use right over the property. If the owner sells and develops in the future, it could be done by any developer. Designation was pointed out that the larger outlot to the west is currently owned by the family and presently are not interested in selling or developing at this time. Question was asked about some configuration of some lots. Changes were a possibility in the preliminary plat.

Question was posed regarding a potential trail. There would be an exploration of a connection however there could be constraints. Consistently with trail connectivity and utilizing natural trails with current conditions was important. Home prices were inquired about. There would also be significant buffering.

# Jonathan Carver Parkway Improvement Project

Representatives from Bolton and Menk were present at the council meeting to communicate plans for the Jonathan Carver Parkway Improvement Project. They reviewed the stages of construction, detours and local access during the project as well as other key points. You can also go to the city's website and link that way, as well. The project was scheduled to begin March  $22^{nd}$  and last through November of 2021. The project overview is that from march to November, the JCP will be under construction from Fourth Street to Highway 61. Work will also be occurring on some of the local side streets near intersections. Construction will occur in three main stages. Traffic will be detoured via County Roads #50, # 43 and Highway # 212. You can also sign up for weekly email updates if you are interested.

Trail Map

The Parks Commission held a discussion with the Community Development Director regarding the drafted trail map. The map would be posted on the city's social media and available at city hall for those interested in new trail, and the loops that exist in the community. There had also been discussion of naming the trail loop as well as signage once completed. The commission expressed interest in naming the loops after historical figures from the community.

# Chaska Recreation Igreement

The Parks Commission discussed ideas to be submitted pertaining to the Chaska Recreation Agreement with the Community Center. Several ideas brainstormed include scavenger hunt, story walks, photo competition, community BINGO, challenges for kids and virtual group fitness classes. The ideas would be submitted to the Chaska staff for programming ideas.






