Mayor Courtney's August Update

I hope this update finds you well and enjoying summer! In no particular order, here are my updates for August:

The Preserve – Last month Council approved the Final Plat for The Preserve. This new residential development will bring 66 new single-family homes to Carver. The Preserve is located west of Meridian Fields and north of Timber Creek off Monroe Drive.

Farmers' Market – Last month the Carver Farmers' Market, which takes place on Tuesdays from 3 – 6 p.m. at Carver Station (1607 Hartwell Drive) returned for the 2022 season. The Farmers' Market, which has a great variety of vendors and food trucks, will run through the end of September.

Metronet – Metronet recently sent out preconstruction letters for the next phase of their fiber installations. These letters come in a fairly plain white envelope, which could easily be mistaken for junk mail. Make sure you don't throw it away, because it contains important information about Metronet's construction project. For additional

New Accounting Software – Next year the city will modernize our accounting software. The new software from BS&A will serve to have all the City's building inspections, community development, general ledger, accounts payable, utility billing, payroll, accounts receivable and cash receipts functions on the same integrated system. This upgrade has been planned for as part of our Capital Improvement Program since 2018.

Food Distributions – As the result of a partnership between Carver County Public Health, A Better Society and Eastern Carver County Schools, free food distributions have been taking place on Thursday afternoons from 3 – 5 p.m. at the Public Utilities Building (the PUB – 117 Broadway in downtown Carver) this summer. The mobile pantry will continue through Sept. 1.

Strategic Action Plan Update

Strategic Action Plan updates were talked about by the council. The New Resident Welcome Guide has been completed along with the training of key personnel. Updating documents and policies is ongoing, as well as strategy and cost analysis. Coordinating welcome events promoting the community is also being worked on and studying booth at the Farmer's Market. Drafts are in development to prepare annual guide to educate and share information concerning the city's water service. Work session draft to discuss the possibility of large event permitting and regulations. More information on this topic can be found by going to the city's website, in the search box, type in Strategic Action Plan. It can also be found in the July 18th council minutes.

Software Upgrade

The city discussed the need for finance and utility billing software. Some of those reasonings involve the fact that as the city grows, the technology to serve the residents also needs to grow. The data holds customer information that without it the city couldn't operate. Finally, the software creates efficiencies that paper and pen do not. The city has been utilizing Banyon Data Systems for ten plus years to date with three separate modules. Due to limitations, plans for new software were discussed in their Long-Term Financial Planning back in 2018 with initial implementation planned for the year 2021. The Building Inspection Department implemented BS&A software in 2020. The system could easily and seamlessly integrated, exclusively designed for the public sector, expansive reporting capability and more positive reasons for incorporating this system. The pros and cons, and costs were all reviewed. The legal team is to review and future consideration given.

South West Prime Service

The Finance Directors from the city and the transit firm provided an overview of the Prime Services provided. Updates were also given regarding the prime services, including Express and Prime MD. A detailed report of ridership as requested will be provided to the council.

Preservation Ordinance

A brief overview was presented to the council. The next step will be a Public Hearing held by the Planning Commission. The drafted ordinance will then be submitted to the council for review and adoption.

Municipal Water System

The city engineer provided an update on the water system and pressure issues. A problem has arisen with two water towers not functioning properly compounded with high water demand and dry weather conditions. A mechanical failure it was found to be the culprit and the council was informed that the system is now stable. Continued tests will be performed. Documentation of the entire system will also be conducted along with monitoring existing exposed weaknesses. The entire plant has not been completely integrated into the water system yet. In some neighborhoods pressure issues were still occurring. The staff continued to troubleshoot and address those issues.

Speeding

Several residents attended the council meeting to discuss traffic issues such as speeding. One resident requested speed reduction in residential areas. The reasoning for the request involved the concentration of children, families, animals, parked cars and street layout. Spring Creek area were of the opinion that 30 mph was not a comfortable speed. Bringing that speed down has been proven to be effective and dramatically decreases the average speed. It was noted at that at one point the speed at the Spring Creek areas was once 55 mph. It was the opinion that some are used to that speed without realizing it had been decreased. The blind intersection at Mt Hope Road in the Spring Creek area was brought up. Another resident requested the city research the impact of lowering the speed on residential streets from 30 to 20 miles per hour and then implement. Question was asked how police patrol staff was determined.

Timber Creek

The council reviewed a resolution pertaining to land survey and minor subdivision. Motion was made and carried with all ayes approving the minor subdivision via registered land survey to facilitate next phase of the Timber Creek development. The city manager explained change in the resolution pertaining to Tract B in order that the registered land survey property could be continued to be utilized for agricultural purposes. Basically, the clarification allows the underlying property owner continued use of farming using only said access. Question was asked if the piece being discussed hadn't been platted. It was not. Motion was made and carried with all ayes adopting the resolution approving a minor subdivision via registered land survey numbered to facilitate the next phase of the Timber Creek Development with amended text presented.

Carver Bluffs Parkway

The city manager and engineer discussed the Carver Bluffs Parkway Reclamation project. Ramsey Avenue was inquired about, as well. Street conditions, rating street conditions and the Pavement Management plans were all discussed. Street conditions with a rating of one or two should really be replaced the council was told. The engineer stated that a street reaching reclaimed territory a lot of money is required to repair. There was discussion of adding section as a reclamation project to the 2022 Pavement Management Plan after discussing 6th Street deterioration.

Patching area discussed was not felt to be a waste of money. Adding the area discussed would avoid interim maintenance costs, and the section of road was deemed in bad condition and a main complaint of Carver Bluff residents. A similar scenario occurred in the past project at Carver Bluffs Parkways. It was presumed that the 2023 budgeting process would revisit the 2025 Pavement Management Plan to eliminate this section and possibly consider adding Bluff Road. Motion was made and carried with all ayes approving change order for the Carver Bluffs Parkway Reclamation project.

Fire Relief Pension

The city manager discussed the Fire Relief Pension contribution. The city council needed to approve an increase for the Carver Fire Relief Association pension contributions. The Fire Relief Association is a non-profit corporation, separate from the city, authorized to provide pension, disability, and death benefits to its members through special funds. A benefits projections analysis had been conducted as part of the proposed increase to pension contribution. The proposed increases costs were discussed. The Fire Relief Association pension is funded through annual City and State contributions. The funds are subsequently managed by a private investment firm hired by the Fire Relief Association. These financials are audited annually. The 2022 Budget has allocated the necessary funds for the increase.

Community Event

The Deputy Clerk presented information concerning coordination of a Community/Welcome Event identified as a strategic initiation in the Strategic Plan. A discussion had occurred expressing interest in hosting an information table at the Carver's Market held weekly. The staff would research the matter further with other cities for additional input and ideas.

Pavement Management Plan Update

The city council adopted its first Pavement Management Plan. Three projects pertaining to this plan have been completed. Currently the council is in the process of reviewing a five-year plan incorporating proposed updates. The primary goal involves the extension of pavement life to ultimately reduce city costs, clear expectations of budget costs and minimize resident impact. The reclamation plus and minus costs of mill and overlay to complete as many Maintenance and Operations possible. The five-year Capital Improvement Plan and Maintenance and Operation reclaim summary involves extending pavement life to minimize reconstruction along with grouping neighborhoods when possible. The program specifics would focus on the maintenance and operation, reserve monies annually in the budget and utilize state aids. Projected areas were reviewed. Sealcoating and crack seal program goals and specifics were also discussed. Recommendations and next steps were discussed. These involved confirming the plan and continue with project planning efforts in the Capital Improvement Plan and Long-Term Predictor, annually verify upcoming projects and I the future refresh the Pavement Management Plan.

Facility Rental

The council discussed the Facility Rental Policy. The policy is acts as a contract. Rental space is offered in the City Hall. This space offers an ideal location for community events, business meetings, parties, weddings and the like. Included in the Village Hall is a community space with an outdoor patio area and the commercial kitchen, as well as a small conference room. There is also the historic church. Some changes have been recommended presently. These include updating the policy as a legal agreement, clarify responsibilities with or without damage deposits, identify payment and refund methods, as well as incorporating word clarifications. Also, to address fees. Recommendations were submitted for discussion.

Jonathan Carver Parkway

The city manager gave updates pertaining to the Highway # 212 and Jonathan Carver Parkway bridge railing application which was scheduled to be submitted by the city engineer. The design was shown to the council. If awarded, the Carver name and logo will be visible on the eastbound side of the highway.

Water Treatment Facility Improvements

The council reviewed the change order request for the water treatment facility improvements project. The project includes new construction on the existing treatment facility site. The newly constructed infrastructure, substantial upgrade and reconfigurations on the existing facility, along with site infrastructure to complement the overall facility expansion. One improvement includes the replacement of the existing on-site generator.

Abandoned Hazardous Structure

The City Attorney addressed the council regarding the abandoned hazardous structure on Carver Creek Place. The council reviewed a resolution ordering abatement of said property. The property contains an abandoned and unfinished home. A building permit had been issued back in 2002. The structure partially constructed and the building permit was deemed invalid by the city due to abandonment in 2007. The building inspector inspected the structure recently. Observations made included unfinished floors and ceilings, unsafe staircases, and improperly installed roof trusses. Additionally, there were concerns regarding the home's foundation walls; along with the storage of automotive fluids, automotive parts, machinery, appliances, household items, construction debris, and other refuse. The building official deems the home hazardous and unsafe. The recommended action deems the structure to be hazardous and unsafe, authorizing serving an order requiring to abate the hazardous conditions within sixty days. Failure to comply initiates the proceedings in district court to request a court order authorizing the city to abate the hazardous conditions.

The Carver Preserve

The assistant city engineer discussed the Carver Preserve final plat with the council. The council reviewed the resolution approving the final plat and adopt the ordinance rezoning the property, as well as approve and authorize the execution of the Development Agreement. In the past the preliminary plat had been reviewed. The development involves sixty-six single family lots and two exception pieces of property. The exceptions involve existing residents who will remain in Dahlgren Township until petition for annexation is presented. The primary access to the Preserve will be provided by the extension of Monroe Drive inclusive of Phase One of the Timber Creek development. The secondary access will be provided from existing facilities in the meridian Fields neighborhood. The final plat and proposed plan adhere to the city standards. The Planning Commission recommended approval.

The Assistant City Engineer presented the council with information relating to the final plat for the Preserve. Some additional information discussed included the proposed closure at Highway # 212 which were reviewed by the Assistant City Engineer. There is an access point at the highway for the five properties adjacent to the proposed development and are also identified within the previously discussed exception properties. MnDOT's desire is to limit the number of accesses onto Highway # 212. Prior to the proposed development, it was not possible to remove this access, however due to the development, closure of that point is now feasible. A new street could be constructed providing connectivity to the new development for the five properties. It was stated that the developer would provide this new connection outside city's platted limits and the city would reimburse the developer for the costs associated with the improvement. Said changes would be reflected in the resolution and clarified in the Developer's Agreement.

Question was asked why the city would be paying for a new access when the properties are technically located in Dahlgren Township. Response given was that the city cannot make the developer pay for access that is outside the city limits and not a benefit to them. The original plan was barricades denying access in either direction. Development residents only access through the city streets. Five properties only access to the highway. The state approached the city regarding the closure, requesting for the city to bridge the gap with the development. The city manager also added that there was indication of supporting the Highway #22 bridge railing. Further bridge railing information would be addressed in the city manager's updates. Road surface ideas were discussed. Discussion was held regarding the driveway to the well which was noted that the driveway was necessary. The house directly north of Meridian Curve was discussed. They would be required access through Monroe Drive. An opinion was given regarding the states surplus funds, it didn't seem right to have MN DOT propose a trade. The city manager pointed out that the county and the state have been talking about the closure for several years, this is simply an opportunity. The city can choose to pave to the well house only, leaving the remainder gravel. However, extending the pavement the entire length simply makes for easier city maintenance. Long range it benefits the city. Question was asked about present maintenance of the road. Plowing has been east/west road. The state does not have the mechanism to pay for any closure expenses. They are merely requesting consideration by the city in the overall picture of the development. Were specific permissions required for closure? Responsibility lies with the agency closing the road; therefore, it would be the MnDOT Department. They would have to proceed with all the notifications and associated task with closure of that road. If the city were to fund, the funds would come from the special capital fund. Question was asked if paving anything east or west or only parallel to the highway, length of the additional paving and cur and gutter be installed. There would be no paving east to west, the distance was less than a hundred yards and there would not be any curb and gutter. Notation was made that on the west side of the Preserve property, there are two outlots. Question was then asked about the property having access. There may be a private driveway but the city could not make plans for that drive. The property owner would have to take the initiative for the connection and the city would be required to permit it. The costs were discussed.

The builder was present and discussed the home styles and costs. They anticipate construction of a model home for the Spring Parade of Homes. Question was asked about street name change possibilities. The City Attorney stated that the city has the authority to change the names. Question was asked regarding the two outlots on the west of the property by Old Oak Road regarding whether they would be maintained by home owners or the homeowner's association. Proposal was that the homeowner's association would be maintaining. Would they remain as outlots or could they be developed as property to the west is developed was asked? The City Attorney responded that they could developed in the future if they were sold by the association. Currently, they are not buildable. Motion was made and carried with all ayes adopting the resolution approving the Final Plat for development identified as the Preserve. Motion was made and carried with all ayes adopting ordinance rezoning the Carver Preserve Property to Residential. Motion was made and carried with all ayes approving and authorizing the execution of the Development Agreement for the Carver Preserve, subject to changes deemed necessary by the city attorney.

City of Carver New Parking Rules

So that you are aware of changes to the city codes regarding parking in the City of Carver which was included in the city's newsletter. Still another reminder for you and a "FYI" just in case you missed the announcement.

Trailers and campers may not be parked on city street for more than forty-eight consecutive hours.

Downtown Broadway: No overnight parking (2 AM to 6 AM) allowed on Broadway from Fourth Street West to Main Street West.

Winter Parking Rules: No parking is allowed on any street when the city has determined there has been at least a two-inch snowfall. Parking on the street will be allowed after plowed curb to curb.

Winter Parking Enforcement: Any vehicles parking on a city street during a snow event will be subject to a \$ 50 parking fine. If off-street parking is not available to you, areas allowed to park will be Third Street West parking lot or the parking area south of Main Street West on Broadway, west side of the tug boat.

[Previous winter parking exceptions for Third Street have been eliminate. No parking may occur on either side of the Third Street West, upon a two-inch snowfall, until the street is plowed curb to curb.

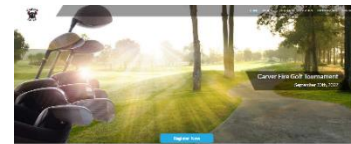

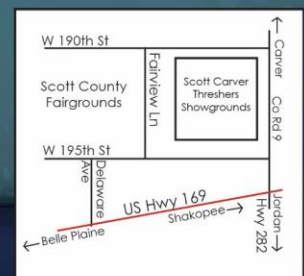
