Courtney's Message

Greetings!

May always seems to be a very busy month, and that's certainly the case again this year in Carver! With that, here are my updates for May:

Road Construction – During the third year of our Pavement Management Plan, which has a goal of extending the life of the pavement on the streets in Carver for as long as possible, the following street improvements will take place in the coming months:

Full-depth reclamation - 4th Street West between Jonathan Carver Parkway and Elm Drive.

Mill and overlay - Sibley Court, Sibley Street, Groff Street, Gilfillan Avenue and Elm Drive West.

Mosquitoes – With warmer temperatures and April showers, the return of Minnesota's unofficial state bird can't be too far away. In Carver, we're part of the Metropolitan Mosquito Control District (MMCD), which has been protecting the public from mosquitoes, black flies and ticks since 1958. For more information about the MMCD, including details on when/where they're treating for mosquitoes, check out MMCD.org.

Official Newspaper – With the Chaska Herald shutting down last month, the City of Carver has now designated the Waconia Patriot as the City's new official newspaper. This means we will now use the Patriot to fulfill our legal obligations for publication of meeting notices, ordinance publication, bid announcements and more. Starting June 1, the Patriot will be available at the Carver Casey's and Kwik Trip. Lions Park Improvements – The removal of the tennis and basketball courts at Lions Park (700 Mount Hope Road) will happen later this month and construction of the new courts, which will include two pickleball courts, will take place in June. This project, where the bids came in 18% lower than the engineer's estimate (yay!), is being paid for out of the City's 2024 budget.

Now Hiring "Seasonals" – Every summer we hire temporary employees to help with gardening and outdoor maintenance throughout the City and we're still looking for a few more folks to join our team. For more information about these seasonal roles and to apply, go to CityOfCarver.com/jobs.

Capital Building Maintenance Project

At a work session the Wold Architects and Engineers reviewed the conceptual renovation plans for the Fire Station project. Plans and specifications prepared were to be considered for authorization at a regular meeting.

The City Manager at a council meeting reviewed the Capital Building and Maintenance project details. A proposal with Wold Architects and Engineers was accepted by the city for the joint project for the Fire Station and the Public Services facility. Those proposed projects were reviewed at the meeting once again. The initial scope of the project had been modified. Presently the process is reviewing sites for a long-term solution for a new public services facility along with a land review planned for later. The Fire Station project was adjusted to an existing space renovation project converting existing apparatus bay area to a turnout gear storage. Upon tentative planning proposing a new Public Services facility the fire department would assume the remaining building space. The amended scope of the project involves the Fire Station renovation, new roof with a solar exploration, and new heating and air conditioning unit. Preliminary concepts were reviewed in March. Costs for this amendment were reviewed by the council with the financial entity representing the city.

The council continued their discussions regarding the Capital Building and Maintenance Project. Motion was made and carried with all ayes accepting the proposal from Wold Architects and Engineers to perform architectural services for the 2024 Capital Improvement and Maintenance Project.

Sign Ordinance

The Community Development Director held a discussion at a works session pertaining to review of the Sign Ordinance. The current ordinance, overview and the feedback from local businesses was shared at the work session. A discussion was also held with the city council regarding enforcement. Further discussion was to be carried over to the regular meeting. Discussion was continued at the regular meeting regarding the review of the Sign Ordinance. Additional research it was determined to be required and then continue further discussions in the future.

The council continued discussions at a work session regarding the Sign Ordinance. The city council reviewed state statutes related to signage. Feedback was shared with business owners, and community groups. Discussions were also held primarily pertaining to temporary signs while requesting information on the topic from surrounding cities on their ordinances and approaches to temporary signs. There was not any consensus on temporary signs especially in regards to community groups.

Lions Park

The Community Development Director discussed with the council the details for the construction of the Lions Park court project and reviewed the plans including reconfiguration of the basketball court and reconstruction of the tennis courts, as well as the addition of two pickleball courts. Motion was made and carried with all ayes approving plans and ordered advertisement of bids for the reconstruction project.



Miscellaneous

The city Manager discussed the retirement announcement of Cathy Elke tentatively July 24th, 2024. He also shared updates about the League of MN Cities Annual Conference scheduled for June, the monthly water report along with the council's input, the Highway # 212 bridge railing, seasonal employees for public services, Parking review safety and the acting city manager.

At the council meeting a guest shared concerns regarding election integrity matters in the State of Minnesota with the city council at a regular meeting.

The council discussed approval of a notice of public hearing on the intent to issue General Obligation Improvement Plan Bonds and the proposal to adopt a Capital improvement Plan. The City Manager provided additional information regarding the proposed amount for the bond issuance.

The Capital Equipment purchase information was presented by the City Manager. Motions were made and carried with all ayes authorizing the purchase of the equipment listed as necessary.

The mayor met with representative from the Hometown Bank. There are plans to have a Grand Opening event which may include a fun run. The bank associated individuals are also discussing the incorporation of historic photos of Carver in their design elements for the new building.

The council was told that Ryan Finke, the former principal of Carver Elementary has accepted a new position in the Dominican Republic and will be departing the school staff at the conclusion of this school year. Mr Finke compliments of the internet Co-Pilot stated that he has fifteen years of experience in education and previously held the position of Assistant Principal at the Richfield Middle School along with roles as dean, instructional coach, targeted services and summer school coordinator, along with English and Language Arts teacher in the middle level. He will be succeeded by Sam Blank who will be the new Carver Elementary School scheduled to resume that role as of July 1st, 2024. Congratulations to both gentlemen and lots of luck.

The Parks Advisory group participated in a Pickleball class.

The council reviewed a resolution supporting the retention of city zoning authority. The resolution concerns decisions regarding local zoning and land use that best fits community needs.

The Planning Commission board discussed with the Community Development Director the topic of an upcoming transportation facility project for Eastern Carver County Schools.

At the Planning Commission meeting, announcement was made that Zoom meetings will no longer be available.

Carver Place

The Planning Commission reviewed and discussed the Final Plat for Carver Place. Motion was made and carried with all ayes recommending approval of the Final Plat for Carver Place.

An Easement Vacation Public Hearing was held at the city meeting. The Community Development Director presented information relating to the drainage and utility easements, along with the trail easement for the Carver Place project. There were not any public comments presented. Motion was made and carried with all ayes adopting the resolution vacating drainage and utility easements, as well as trail easements. The Community Development Director provided the details of the Final Plat for Carver Place and the Development Agreement. The Community Development Agency representative and Ivy Properties representative were at the meeting to discuss details of the project. Motion was made and carried with all aye adopting the resolution approving the Final Plat for Carver Place. Motion was then made and carried with all ayes authorizing the execution of the Developers Agreement for Carver Place subject to necessary changes required by the attorney.

The Planning Commission was told that the Community Development Agency had been awarded funding for Carver Oaks which is a proposed forty-three senior unit adjacent to Caver Place with work tentatively scheduled for the summer of 2025.

Third Street Bridge Project

The city's assistant engineer and engineer were both at the council meeting to provide information for the reconstruction of the Third Street bridge between Broadway and Jorgenson Streets. Motion was made and carried with all ayes approving the plans and specifications, and order advertisement for bids for the project.

At a work session meeting a motion was made and carried with all ayes to have closed session to discuss the Third Street Bridge Easements. Proposals were discussed and reviewed about purchase of permanent and temporary easements for the said project.

Discussions were continued at the council meeting regarding easements on the Third Street Bridge project. The Memorandum of Understanding was the highlighted topic of discussion at the meeting. The bridge spans over the Spring Creek between Broadway and Jorgenson streets. It was constructed in 1912 and it's service life has spanned over a century. The structure has deteriorated and has been classified as structurally deficient. An application for bridge bond funding was submitted and awarded. Plans and specifications were drafted, approved and authorizations for bidding were all completed. Permanent and temporary easements are necessary to construct the improvement and maintain the replacement. Permanent and temporary definitions were all reviewed by the council. A Memorandum of Understanding had been created with property owner.

2024 Street Improvement Projects The Assistant City Engineer reviewed the status of the street

The Assistant City Engineer reviewed the status of the street improvement projects within the city. Per the adopted Pavement Management Plan this year marks the third program year of this plan. The 2024 plan identifier reviewed the streets involved as part of this phase of the plan. Due to the feasibility constraints, trail fog seal adjacent to Spring Creek Drive was removed from the Trails Map plan. The schedule was reviewed, contracts and construction were discussed. Final plans and specifications for the 2024 Street Improvement Project were prepare. Bids were opened in March with bids received and tabulated. The costs, bids, etc were all discussed and reviewed by the council. The projects would be funded using a combination of city street maintenance funds, state aid funds and city water enterprise funds. Motions were made and carried awarding the contract to Valley Paving for the 2024 Street Improvement Project along with acceptance of the quote from Gopher State Seal Coat for the trail fog seal project with all ayes.

Utility Bond

At a work session, the Finance Director gave an overview and summarization of the Water Treatment Plant project and the Utility Bond spending. The project was awarded in November of 2020. There has been six change orders over the course of this project. The finances were reviewed by the council. Savings allowed the ability of other projects being funded. An unexpected repair will use the remaining balance of the bond funds. A Public Hearing will be held on Capital Improvement Plan Bonds.

Parks Funding

A parks funding review was conducted with the Community Development Director, and the City Attorney. An overview of park funding and a discussion regarding park dedication prioritization were all looked at. The City Councill provided feedback related to the park dedication fees, which should be included in the 2025 Fee Schedule was also discussed.

2024 Utility Improvement Project

The council reviewed extensively the discussions involving the Utility Improvements Project. The council would be required to approve the Plans and Specifications and authorize bidding for the 2024 Utility Improvements Project and for the Water Tower Reconditioning Project. Items have been identified by the council for improvements within its long term financial plan. The 2024 year determines several improvements to the water system and the scope of those improvements were reviewed by the council. The construction schedule was also reviewed and discussed along with the financial review.

Official Newspaper

Council discussed the designation of new official newspaper for the city. The city adopts an organizational resolution at the beginning of each new year satisfying the requirements annually designating an official newspaper for posting public notices. The beginning of 2024 designated that official newspaper to be the Chaska Herald. In April of 204 the Chaska Herald along with all of the Southwest News Media newspapers announced their intent to cease operations at the end of April. Thereupon, the city finds it necessary to designate a new official newspaper. The Waconia Patriot and the Minneapolis Star Tribune were contacted for pricing information for public notices. The Waconia Patriot covers local news and events for Carver County. The Star Tribune covers the entire Minneapolis-St Paul metropolitan area. The Star Tribune is available for purchase at Casey's and Kwik Trip. Purchase of the Waconia Patriot will be available for purchase at the same locations beginning June 1st of 2024. Publication costs were compared. The Waconia Patriot was recommended to be chosen. A resolution has been drawn up stating the designation of the Waconia Paper as the city's official newspaper.

Commercial / Industrial District Review

The Community Development Direction and the Planning Commission members have analyzed the first draft of the residential sections of the city code and ready to move forward to other land uses. The current version of the city's code had several commercial district which could be combined and better defined for future conditions. The current districts are identified as the central business district, freeway and general commercial districts. The city has adopted a Comprehensive Plan with a district as part of future land use map but does not have a drafted district in the City Code. At the time of drafting the Comprehensive Plan the commercial/industrial use areas were viewed as job centers, office spaces and light manufacturing. The Planning Commission members will be reviewing a first draft of this district identified as commercial and industrial. The proposed language for said district blends with the existing Freeway Commercial and Industrial district. Guiding information for the proposed district was compiled of surrounding communities. Existing commercial spaces and how they are zoned will be discussed along with proposed additional commercial districts to be worked through.

Carver Fire Department

Facebook posting showed a video of the Life Link helicopter landing. While the Carver firefighters were training they had an unexpected, unique visitor the posting said. The Life Link helicopter made a hovering descent where the firefighters



learned about what to do for creating a safe landing zone and saw firsthand just how much equipment actually fits into the confined space of the chopper. How cool!

Did you know that the proposed trail will be a redevelopment of once was the railroad corridor?

Use your imagination here and think about what it was like to be some of the only people back then to drink in and absorb the beauty of untouched nature and land and now people will be able to walk that same path? Neat huh? Well at least for some. Noah said bikes will be allowed too. Well, not in those exact words, but you get the general idea here, right? Will be ADA compliant too. Not many of those around I hear. The proposed project began to be discussed as far back at 2008 (16 years ago. Progress moves slow sometimes. (?) According to Noah's article; quote: "Local cross-country and cycling teams are also excited about the project, according to Freese. A cycling team coach even joined Scott County representatives in a legislative session to advocate for funding for the project.

Furthermore, the project will have an educational component, Freese said. The project is partnering with the Shakopee Mdewakanton Sioux Community to present information on how Dakota people have used the river valley.

"The plan is to have interpretive information about the use of the river valley by the Dakota," Freese said. "This has been a real partnership in that way."

Once the construction process begins, which Freese said will likely be in September after the project finds a contractor, there will be some interruptions to current trail use. However, construction access to the trails will be routed away from downtown Carver to minimize disruptions, according to Scott County Transportation Planning Manager Craig Jenson.

The regional trail master plan will continue to develop after the completion of this project, according to Freeman. In 2028, construction will continue along Marschall Road to complete a 20-mile trail loop.

Next up in Carver County is the Circle the Brick project, which will connect to the Southwest Regional Trail at both ends, according to Walsh."

Prom Origins

Proms are thought of as an iconic rite of passage. The history of proms date back to the late 19th century. The concept of proms relates to a celebratory event for young adolescents traces back to ancient Greece. Elite men held formal banquets to honor their transition into adult society consisting of lavish dinner parties, music, speeches and revelry, and excessive wine intake. Romans also celebrated a similar



banquet. Then in the 18th and 19th centuries in Europe, women participated in aristocratic formal dances and balls. Its popularity grew. Debutante Balls were considered coming-out ceremonies for the elite. The first American proms originally referred to as 'promenade" consisted of leisurely walk, evolving to college festivities danced in formal attire. First proms hold a mystique about them as historical records mention "Junior Prom." Then the popularity spread to high school which became democratized version of the debutante ball. Eventually proms became inclusive events, allowing young adolescent to wear fancy attire, adorn corsages and waltz the night away. The tradition continued to evolve encompassing limousines, flowers, photography and extravagant invitations. Proms have ultimately grown from their aristocratic origins transforming into cherished traditions celebrating youths.

Additionally a tradition came about for a "Prom King and Prom Queen." Both honorary titles awarded by election in school-wide voting. Selection method is similar to homecoming queen and king traditions.
